Third Sunday of Ordinary Time (C) January 23rd, 2022 Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 / Ps 19:8-10, 15 / 1 Cor 12:12-30 / Lk 1:1-4; 4:14-21

The central theme of today's liturgy is God's word. The people were saddened by God's word in today's first reading. Perhaps they recognized how they had been failing to live up to it. But God's word should bring us joy, Ezra and Nehemiah told the people, for even if they had not been living according to it, once they heard it, they could learn from it and start living as God instructed them. So many people in our society today keep civil laws because they know that if they get caught they will get in trouble with the civil authority. God doesn't send the police around when we break his laws, but when we ignore his word, it's going to catch up with us in the long run. So many people say God's a good guy. He won't punish me for this or that. But they forget, God gave us His law to direct us to happiness and eternal life. He doesn't punish us. We do it to ourselves when we choose a way other that the way he has shown us.

One of my favorite psalm verses is: "Your word is a lamp for my steps and a light for my path>" (Ps 119:105) If you have to go somewhere dark, it's nice to have a flashlight to help you see where you're going. You can turn off the flashlight if you wish, but you might run into things, you could trip or fall. When we try to make it through life without God's word, we are walking in the dark. We can't say God is punishing us if we run into something or fall. We did it to ourselves.

Nehemiah knew the people needed God's light if they were going to succeed in getting back their feet. Jesus knows we need God's light. In today's Gospel, Jesus is beginning his public ministry and he uses the Scriptures to describe the work he will do. People were impressed at first, but unfortunately for their sakes, as we will hear next week, they rejected him and his interpretation of God's word.

Jesus said "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." "Today" is the important word here. It tells us God is speaking to us each time we hear the Scriptures. Those who heard Ezra read the word of God and interpret it were hearing about Abraham, Moses, and the Exodus, things that happened almost a thousand years before, but they saw its relevance for them that day. Jesus took the book of Isaiah, written centuries before he was born, but he told his audience it had great meaning for them that day. God's word always speaks to us because God is a living God and his Spirit continues to communicate to us through that word.

In our second reading today, Paul reminds us of the importance of community. We can't say I don't need a church, I don't need to come to Mass, I don't need to pray with all those other people. We do need to because we are a family, we are part of the body of Christ and when we separate ourselves from one another, we are denying the spiritual gifts God has given us to help them. We need each other. To sum everything up, we need God's word and we need each other to make it through this life to the joys of eternal life. PN:

In his *motu propio* on 30 September 2019, *Aperuit illis*, Pope Francis had declared that "the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God. *This Sunday of the Word of God* will thus be a fitting part of that time of year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity... [V]arious communities will find their own ways to mark this *Sunday* with a certain solemnity (3)... A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers" (8).

Saint of the Week

Saint Angela Merici's Story

Angela Merici has the double distinction of founding the first of what are now called "secular institutes" and the first teaching order of women in the Church.

Born in Desenzano, Italy, she was orphaned in her teens. As a young woman, with her heart centered on Christ, Angela joined the Third Order of St. Francis and embraced austerity. In a visionary experience, she felt called to found a "company" of women.

Angela was invited to become a live-in companion for a widow in the nearby town of Brescia. There she became the spiritual advisor of a group of men and women with ideals of spiritual renewal and service to those in need. While on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 1524, Angela was struck with blindness. She proceeded to visit the sacred shrines, seeing them with her spirit. On the way back while praying before a crucifix, Angela's sight was restored.

At age 60, Angela and 12 other women began the Company of St. Ursula, named for a patroness of medieval universities and venerated as a leader of women. This constituted a new way of life: single women consecrated to Christ and living in the world rather than in a monastery. With Angela as their "mother and mistress," Company members did not live in community, wore no special clothing, and made no formal vows.

Angela Merici died in Brescia, Italy, in 1540. Clothed in the habit of a Franciscan tertiary, her body was interred in Brescia's Church of Saint' Afra. Four years later the Company's *Rule* that Angela had composed, prescribing the practices of chastity, poverty and obedience, was approved by the pope.

In the early 1600s, Companies that had expanded into France were re-organized into the

religious Order of St. Ursula, to teach girls. Angela's words continue to inspire the Ursuline nuns' mission of education, a mission that spread worldwide. The Company of St. Ursula also continued to exist and is federated worldwide today with members in 30 countries.

Reflection

As with so many saints, history is mostly concerned with their activities. But deep Christian faith and love sustain one whose courage lasts a lifetime, and who can take bold new steps when human need demands.
