### Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time (C) February 6th, 2022 Is 6: 1-2a, 3-8 / Ps 138: 1-5, 7-8 / 1 Cor 15: 1-11 / Lk 5: 1-11

"Holy, Holy, is the Lord of hosts, his glory fills the whole earth." These are the exultations of the angels in our first reading. God, our creator, is holy. The Spirit of God is holy. Christ, our Master, is holy. When we are enthralled by such holiness, we can only be seized with fear and shame.

This is the experience of Isaiah and as he said: "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips." The same story can be told of Peter. He was overwhelmed by Christ's Power when they caught a great number of fish in their nets that had remained empty through a night's fishing. He said, "Leave me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Even Paul can only react with unworthiness as he declared: "I am the least of the apostles; in fact, because I persecuted the Church of God, I do not even deserve the name."

The holiness of God, however, is never meant to drive away people, but to drive away our sinfulness. It is not for our condemnation, but for our salvation. It is not meant to discourage us, but to invite us to follow God. St. Peter would later write: "Be holy in all that you do, since it is the Holy One who has called you, and scripture says: Be holy, for I am holy" (1 Peter 1: 15-16).

It is not uncommon for us to think that the people God has chosen are those without defects and faults. He called them not because they were sinless, with the exception of the Immaculate Mother, but because he loves them and he can use them. He empowers them with his grace so that they can do their tasks of service.

Over 300 times in the Bible, we hear God saying: "Fear not! For I am with you. Gabriel said to Mary, "Fear not, Mary." The angel said to Joseph, "Do not be afraid..." The angels told the shepherds, "Do not be afraid." On resurrection day, Jesus told his apostles and friends as he appeared to them, "It is I. Don't be afraid."

Isaiah was purified by God who said to him: "Your wickedness is removed, your sin is purged." St. Peter was assured by Christ, "Do not be afraid. From now on, you will be catching men." St. Paul declared: "By God's favor, I am what I am."

Salvation is a free gift given to us by God. It is freely given, it should also be freely received. A gift ceases to be a gift if it is forced by the giver upon the recipient. The Scriptures and the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, are ways in which we could receive the gift of God. All of us are called upon to accept this gift.

Once we can do that, we are able to share it freely with others. Christ said to his disciples: "Go and proclaim the message... heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, and drive out the demons. You receive this as a gift, so give it as a gift" (Mt. 10: 7:8).

Isaiah, Peter and Paul are sterling examples of persons who were called by God. They were gripped by feelings of unworthiness, but God reassured them with his grace. Do not forget that he calls us too, not only the priests and the religious, but all of us. Christ, our Lord, is asking each one of us: "Whom shall I send? Who will go with us?" May we respond willingly by saying, "Here I am, Lord. Send me.

He was the first in the U.S. to perform Endovascular Robotic Surgery, the first in Florida to perform the TCAR (transcarotid artery revascularization) procedure and has performed over 200 procedures since, making Delray Medical Center a national TCAR Center of Excellence. He was also the first in Southeast U.S. to perform VenasealTM procedure for treatment of venous insufficiency In addition, he pioneered renowned limb-preservation and pulmonary embolism treatment programs in Palm Beach County and founded the Florida Atlantic University (FAU) Vascular Surgery Fellowship and is a professor of surgery at FAU School of Medicine where he is training future vascular surgeons. Dr. Ricotta has also authored more than 200 publications and delivered more than 350 lectures.



### Saint of the Week

### Saint Josephine Bakhita's Story

For many years, Josephine Bakhita was a slave but her spirit was always free and eventually that spirit prevailed.

Born in Olgossa in the Darfur region of southern Sudan, Josephine was kidnapped at the age of 7, sold into slavery and given the name Bakhita, which means *fortunate*. She was resold several times, finally in 1883 to Callisto Legnani, Italian consul in Khartoum, Sudan.

Two years later, he took Josephine to Italy and gave her to his friend Augusto Michieli. Bakhita became babysitter to Mimmina Michieli, whom she accompanied to Venice's Institute of the Catechumens, run by the Canossian Sisters. While Mimmina was being instructed, Josephine felt drawn to the Catholic Church. She was baptized and confirmed in 1890, taking the name Josephine.

When the Michielis returned from Africa and wanted to take Mimmina and Josephine back with them, the future saint refused to go. During the ensuing court case, the Canossian Sisters and the patriarch of Venice intervened on Josephine's behalf. The judge concluded that since slavery was illegal in Italy, she had actually been free since 1885.

Josephine entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later. In 1902, she was transferred to the city of Schio (northeast of Verona), where she assisted her religious community through cooking, sewing, embroidery, and welcoming visitors at the door. She soon became well loved by the children attending the sisters' school and the local citizens. She once said, "Be good, love the Lord, pray for those who do not know Him. What a great grace it is to know God!"

The first steps toward her beatification began in 1959. She was beatified in 1992 and canonized eight years later.

### Reflection

Josephine's body was mutilated by those who enslaved her, but they could not touch her spirit. Her Baptism set her on an eventual path toward asserting her civic freedom and then service to God's people as a Canossian Sister.

She who worked under many "masters" was finally happy to address God as "master" and carry out everything that she believed to be God's will for her.
