

First Sunday of Lent (C)
March 6th, 2022
Dt 26: 4-10 / Ps 91: 1-2, 10-15 / Rom 10: 8-13 / Lk 4:1-13

Temptations may lead us to sin. Spiritual writers tell us not to seek them for no one can be certain that they can overcome. But they all agree that God does not tempt man, for God who is all good cannot lead man into evil. The devil can blind a man to accept an evil as a desirable good. We know that God allowed Satan to test Job to prove his virtue, but it was not God who tempted him. It was Satan. Albeit God does not will evil, but he allowed it by not preventing it. We can conclude that temptations may play a positive role in our life.

A product must pass the test of quality before it goes out of the factory. A student has to pass a test, to hurdle a board examination before he is given a diploma. An applicant to a job has to pass a provisional stage before he is fully accepted as a regular employee. Temptations, likewise, act as a test of perfection in our Christian life. A temptation might be an indifferent act, a state of hesitation, which may result in sin when one yields to it. It fosters virtue when one can effectively conquer it. St. Peter cautions us: "Your faith will be tested like gold in a furnace" (1 Pet. 1:7).

The temptation of Jesus in the desert tells us that temptations induce us to sin. Sin is to say no to God and his ways. The adversary had cunningly suggested to Jesus that he provide himself with more effective methods in carrying out his mission. The devil was trying to undermine his trust and obedience to his Father by proposing means that were easy. These were designed that Christ may avoid the cross and his death.

The first temptation was to turn stones into bread. This was the temptation of God's people in the desert. They wanted God to provide them bread that they may believe. For Satan, the people could be manipulated to follow if they were well-fed and wealthy.


But Jesus, as the Messiah, wants us to go beyond the temporal a physical levels of life. The way to obliterate hunger is to remove its causes and not only its symptoms. The root causes of hunger are found in the souls of men- when men refuse to share, promote injustice and fail to love. Thus, Jesus says, "Man does not live on bread alone." God is the only one that can satisfy your deepest hunger.

The second temptation had the devil telling Jesus to worship him, and all the kingdoms of the world will be given to him. This is a temptation to use power for one's glory. Mighty nations have great armies and multinational corporations have vast resources. But they have not brought so far any lasting peace and justice in the world.

Jesus rebuked the devil by saying: "You must worship the Lord your God and serve him alone." God's power, not man's power, is needed to change the world. For Christ, the real glory is to serve God and to take the way of the cross. This will not be by compromising with Satan and with the standards for the world, but by being a faithful servant of God.

The third temptation was for Jesus to perform a spectacular act. Do miracles, and people will follow you. Indeed, they will. But this is not the way of salvation, nor the path of real faith. It is still the way of the cross. The test of faith does not lie on sensations but to continue trusting God even amidst trials. Faith is not enduring in a 'show-me-and-I'll-believe' proposition. Jesus thus said: "You must not put the Lord your God to the test."

Lent is an invitation for us to look deeper into ourselves and examine the things that prevent us from being free to completely serve God and our fellowmen. We oftentimes claim that we don't deny God, but at the same time we are also attached to the values of the world. But the way of a Christian is to fully embrace the cross in service and love. May we be truly free as Christ was totally free in his unfailing commitment to love and service to God.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Next weekend, March 12-13, is the annual Diocese of Palm Beach collection for the education of seminarians and the formation of priests. The priestly discernment and seminary formation process is important, and these seminarians need our spiritual and financial support. The funds raised in this collection are used to support the cost of tuition, housing, education, and pastoral training of our seminarians. For example, the cost of tuition for one seminarian per year is \$22,000, and the room and board for one seminarian is \$12,100 per year.

Currently, there are eight seminarians from our Diocese who are dedicating themselves to this important process of understanding their vocation. With God's grace, we will have three ordinations this year: two priestly ordinations (Rev. Mr. Daniel Donohue and Rev. Mr. Armando Leon) and one diaconate ordination (Mr. Marc Gustinelli).

By your generosity, our seminarians can devote themselves fully to the task of priestly formation, without having to worry about the financial burden of seminary. With them, you walk the journey of faith and ensure that the sacraments will continue to nourish the faithful for generations to come.

St. Paul says in the Scriptures, "This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God" (2 Cor 9:12). I thank you for your prayers for an increase in vocations and for these men and assure you those prayers are working.

Saint of the Week

Saints Perpetua and Felicity's Story

"When my father in his affection for me was trying to turn me from my purpose by arguments and thus weaken my faith, I said to him, 'Do you see this vessel—water pot or whatever it may be? Can it be called by any other name than what it is?' 'No,' he replied. 'So also I cannot call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian.'"

So writes Perpetua: young, beautiful, well-educated, a noblewoman of Carthage in North Africa, mother of an infant son and chronicler of the persecution of the Christians by Emperor Septimius Severus.

Perpetua's mother was a Christian and her father a pagan. He continually pleaded with her to deny her faith. She refused and was imprisoned at 22.

In her diary, Perpetua describes her period of captivity: "What a day of horror! Terrible heat, owing to the crowds! Rough treatment by the soldiers! To crown all, I was tormented with anxiety for my baby.... Such anxieties I suffered for many days, but I obtained leave for my baby to remain in the prison with me, and being relieved of my trouble and anxiety for him, I at once recovered my health, and my prison became a palace to me and I would rather have been there than anywhere else."


Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua, Felicity—a slavewoman and expectant mother—and three companions, Revocatus, Secundulus and Saturninus, refused to renounce their Christian faith. For their unwillingness, all were sent to the public games in the amphitheater. There Perpetua and Felicity were beheaded, and the others killed by beasts.

Felicity gave birth to a daughter a few days before the games commenced.


Perpetua's record of her trial and imprisonment ends the day before the games. "Of what was done in the games themselves, let him write who will." The diary was finished by an eyewitness.

Reflection

Persecution for religious beliefs is not confined to Christians in ancient times. Consider Anne Frank, the Jewish girl who with her family, was forced into hiding and later died in Bergen-Belsen, one of Hitler's death camps during World War II. Anne, like Perpetua and Felicity, endured hardship and suffering and finally death because she committed herself to God. In her diary, Anne writes, "It's twice as hard for us young ones to hold our ground, and maintain our opinions, in a time when all ideals are being shattered and destroyed, when people are showing their worst side, and do not know whether to believe in truth and right and God."
