Second Sunday of Lent (C) March 13, 2022 Gn 15:5-12, 17-18 / Ps 27:1, 7-9, 13-14 / Phil 3:17 - 4:1 [3:20 - 4:1] / Lk 9:28b-36

A mother was diagnosed to have cancer. In order to save her life, she must subject herself to chemotherapy or surgical operation to prevent the disease from spreading to the other parts of the body. The problem was that she is six months pregnant. To save her life means she had to abort her child. Since abortion is legal in her country, many people pressured her to kill the baby in her womb so that she may live.

And yet, following the example of Christ, she made a choice of life. She kept the baby. She made a choice of death, her own death. It is better for her, she thought, to die than to kill the child in her womb. It is better for her to die in order to save her son.

On January 25, 1993, she fell into coma and the baby was born by caesarian operation. She died eight hours later. On February 4, the baby died.

This created a great uproar in the community. The headline of the leading newspaper said, "To die for a son is useless." But the Catholic Daily demurred: "Don't say it was useless."

Was it useless? Maybe we may be tempted to say it was a useless death of a mother, a useless sacrifice because her baby died just the same. She could have saved her life and let the child die. But what would you think if you were that child?

Using the story as a point of reference to the true story of Christ, let us try to reflect very well on the same disturbing question: Was it useless? Christ chose death, an ignominious death of crucifixion, in order to save us. It was better for him to be like a wheat that falls and dies that it may bear much fruit. Our Lord made a choice of life by making a choice of his own death that we have life.

We know that Christ died on the cross because true love knows no bounds. True love is unconditional. He knew that in his death, there would be others follow his example, be willing to die like him may live. It is in entering into the suffering cross of Christ that we can share his glory and declare, "We are children of God."

This is the reason why Christ brought Peter, James and John to the mountain and transfigured before their eyes- his face became as dazzling as the sun, his clothes as radiant as light. Moses, the great law-giver and Elijah, the great prophet, were there to recognize Jesus as the one of whom they dreamed and foretold.

This foretaste of Christ's glory gave hope to the disciples when their Teacher and Master died on the cross. It was this transfiguration which brought strength to them when it was their time to suffer and die. It is with that same hope that we should carry our own struggles and our crosses. Under the guidance of Christ's Spirit, we will not only overcome, but we will one day shine in glory as he did.

Let us pray that we can help in sharing that hope, the light on Mount Tabor, in this world of tears and pain. Let it shine among us and in the people around us.

By the lives we live, let us proclaim that Christ's death was not useless.





We spend Lent trying to become a better version of ourselves as Christians to recommit ourselves as followers of Christ on Easter morning. The Stations of the Cross helps them understand Jesus' sacrifice and love for us.





Why Pray the Stations of the Cross? 8 Reasons from Pope Francis

Like many of our Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep, and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives.

1. THEY ALLOW US TO PLACE OUR TRUST IN HIM

"The Cross of Christ contains all the love of God; there we find his immeasurable mercy. This is a love in which we can place all our trust, in which we can believe.... let us entrust ourselves to Jesus, let us give ourselves over to him, because he never disappoints anyone! Only in Christ crucified and risen can we find salvation and redemption." –Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

2. THEY PUT US INTO THE STORY "And you, who do you want to be? Like Pilate? Like Simon? Like Mary? Jesus is looking at you now and is asking you: do you want to help me carry the Cross? Brothers and sisters, with all the strength of your youth, how will you respond to him?" —Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

3. THEY REMIND US THAT JESUS SUFFERS WITH US

"The Cross of Christ bears the suffering and the sin of mankind, including our own. Jesus accepts all this with open arms, bearing on his shoulders our crosses and saying to us: 'Have courage! You do not carry your cross alone! I carry it with you. I have overcome death and I have come to give you hope, to give you life' (cf. Jn 3:16)." —Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

4. THEY COMPEL US TO ACTION

"But the Cross of Christ invites us also to allow ourselves to be smitten by his love, **teaching us always to look upon others** with mercy and tenderness, especially those who suffer, who are in need of help, who need a word or a concrete action."

—Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

5. THEY HELPS US MAKE A DECISION FOR OR AGAINST CHRIST

"[The Cross] reveals a judgment, namely that God, in judging us, loves us. Let us remember this: God judges us by loving us. If I embrace his love then I am saved, if I refuse it, then I am condemned, not by him, but my own self, because God never condemns, he only loves and saves."—Address, Good Friday, March 29, 2013

6. THEY REVEAL GOD'S RESPONSE TO EVIL IN THE WORLD

"The Cross is the word through which God has responded to evil in the world. Sometimes it may seem as though God does not react to evil, as if he is silent. And yet, God has spoken, he has replied, and his answer is the Cross of Christ: a word which is love, mercy, forgiveness." – Address, Good Friday, March 29, 2013

7. THEY GIVE US THE CERTAINTY OF GOD'S LOVE FOR US

"What has the Cross given to those who have gazed upon it and to those who have touched it? What has the Cross left in each one of us? You see, it gives us a treasure that no one else can give: the certainty of the faithful love which God has for us." - Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

8. THEY GUIDE US FROM THE CROSS TO THE RESURRECTION

"O, Our Jesus, guide us from the Cross to the resurrection and teach us that evil shall not have the last word, but love, mercy and forgiveness. O Christ, help us to exclaim again: 'Yesterday I was crucified with Christ; today I am glorified with Him. Yesterday I died with Him, today I live with Him. Yesterday I was buried with Him, today I am raised with Him'"." - Address, Good Friday, April 18, 2014

Saint of the Week

Saint Louise de Marillac's Story

Born near Meux, France, Louise lost her mother when she was still a child, her beloved father when she was but 15. Her desire to become a nun was discouraged by her confessor, and a marriage was arranged. One son was born of this union. But Louise soon found herself nursing her beloved husband through a long illness that finally led to his death.

Louise was fortunate to have a wise and sympathetic counselor, Francis de Sales, and then his friend, the bishop of Belley, France. Both of these men were available to her only periodically. But from an interior illumination she understood that she was to undertake a great work under the guidance of another person she had not yet met. This was the holy priest Monsieur Vincent, later to be known as Saint Vincent de Paul.

At first, he was reluctant to be her confessor, busy as he was with his "Confraternities of Charity." Members were aristocratic ladies of charity who were helping him nurse the poor and look after neglected children, a real need of the day. But the ladies were busy with many of their own concerns and duties. His work needed many more helpers, especially ones who were peasants themselves and therefore, close to the poor and able to win their hearts. He also needed someone who could teach them and organize them.

Only over a long period of time, as Vincent de Paul became more acquainted with Louise, did he come to realize that she was the answer to his prayers. She was intelligent, self-effacing, and had physical strength and endurance that belied her continuing feeble health. The missions he sent her on eventually led to four simple young women joining her. Her rented home in Paris became the training center for those accepted for the service of the sick and poor. Growth was rapid and soon there was the need for a so-called "rule of life," which Louise herself, under the guidance of Vincent, drew up for the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul.

Monsieur Vincent had always been slow and prudent in his dealings with Louise and the new group. He said that he had never had any idea of starting a new community, that it was God who did everything. "Your convent," he said, "will be the house of the sick; your cell, a hired room; your chapel, the parish church; your cloister, the streets of the city or the wards of the hospital." Their dress was to be that of the peasant women. It was not until years later that Vincent de Paul would finally permit four of the women to take annual vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. It was still more years before the company would be formally approved by Rome and placed under the direction of Vincent's own congregation of priests.

Many of the young women were illiterate. Still it was with reluctance that the new community undertook the care of neglected children. Louise was busy helping wherever needed despite her poor health. She traveled throughout France, establishing her community members in hospitals, orphanages and other institutions. At her death on March 15, 1660, the congregation had more than 40 houses in France. Six months later Vincent de Paul followed her in death.

Louise de Marillac was canonized in 1934 and declared patroness of social workers in 1960.

Reflection

In Louise's day, serving the needs of the poor was usually a luxury only fine ladies could afford. Her mentor, Saint Vincent de Paul, wisely realized that women of peasant stock could reach poor people more effectively, and the Daughters of Chari-

ty were born under her leadership. Today, that order—along with the Sisters of Charity—continues to nurse the sick and aging and provide refuge for orphans. Many of its members are social workers toiling under Louise's patronage. The rest of us must share her concern for the disadvantaged.






