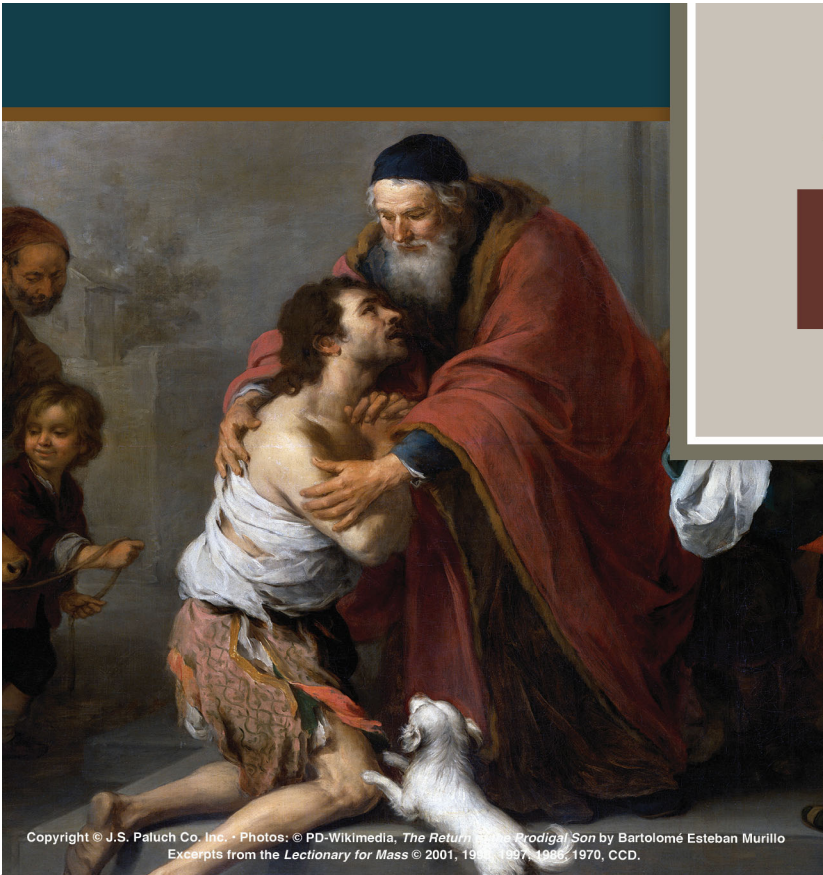

Fourth Sunday of Lent (C)

March 27, 2022

Jos 5: 9a, 10-12 / Ps 34:2-7 / 2 Cor 5: 17-21 / Lk 15: 1-3, 11-32

We accept people as long as they conform to our ways and would never let us down. We love people if they meet the yardstick of our social standard and the anticipated advantage of getting something in return. This kind of love is a selfish and a calibrated one.

This limited understanding on the real measure of love leads us to feelings of insecurity and insincerity. We fear the unrosy plight of rejection. We are hurt by the condemning attitude of people. Sometimes, we pretend to be someone else just to capture a better impression from people. But no matter how we try, we cannot please everybody always, even our loved ones. At times, we still have to wrestle with failures and frustrations.

How we wish we could be loved for what we are! How we dream we can be accepted in spite of our weakness and inadequacies! There is a human thirst, there is a hunger deep inside us for that kind of love that can truly satisfy us.

Jesus is telling us in our Gospel reading today that there is one who could truly provide us with an unconditional love. It is God, the loving Father, And Christ narrates the story of the prodigal son whose compassionate father accepted him back without conditions.

The son in the parable got his inheritance and left. He squandered his money and lived a dissolute life. After he spent everything, he ended up feeding swine in order to survive. This symbolically describes the son's state of reaching the lowest level of his dignity. It was forbidden for a Jew to feed pigs because the law said, "cursed is he who feeds swine."

But the son remembered the home he left behind. Filled with remorse, he decided to go home not as a son, but as a hired servant. But his father never gave him a chance to be a servant. When he was still a long way off, the father ran out to meet him, embraced and kissed him. He was forgiven without recriminations. His dignity as a son was restored immediately.

That is not the end of the story. The elderly brother was sorry that his brother returned home. He stands for the self-righteous people who would rather be happy to see a sinner destroyed than saved. But the loving father said to him, "We have to celebrate and rejoice! This brother of yours was dead and has come to life. He as lost and is found" (LK 15:32).

We often wonder, and ask: Do people really love me? If they do, why? Is it because of my looks, my intelligence, my position, my affiliation or attitude, or my usefulness? If that would be the case, what will happen if I am not anymore what I used to be? Would I still be loved and accepted?

Well, this is not the time to make guesses. This is the time to be anchored on a certainty. God loves me, God loves us. Nothing can make God stop loving us, not even sin.

As Fr. John Powell, S.J. puts it, God is telling us: "I want to love you. That is all... if you choose to leave me, I will not stop you. There may be a time in your life when you will separate yourself from my love, but never believe that you have lost my love. You can only refuse, but you can never lose my love."

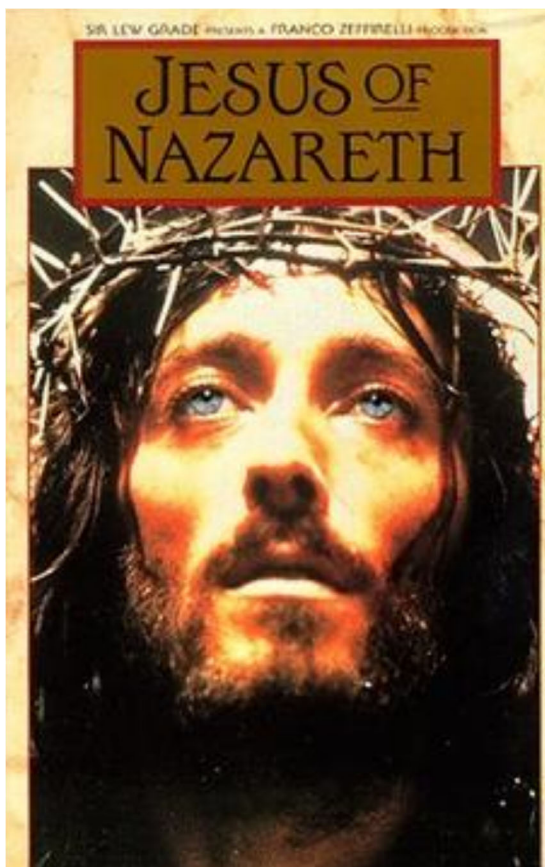

The Symbols of Lent and their Meaning

Violet/Purple color: This is a somber color for the Lenten season which signifies humility, willingness to repent, mourning for the sins and suffering with Jesus.

Stones: They remind us of Jesus' experience in the desert for forty days and being tempted by the devil. Jesus was tempted by the devil to change stones into bread but he did not heed to the devil. He remained steadfast and overcame the temptations. The stones symbolize austerity and rigor, desolation, misery and sadness.

Sackcloth: Sackcloth is a coarse, cloth in which the Jewish people made from goat's hair. Today it can be made from flax or hemp or other natural fibers to create a rough, woven fabric. The Hebrews wore sackcloth, together with wood ashes, as a sign of mourning or repentance or when praying for certain serious needs. Sackcloth can be worn under one's clothes as a scapular or vest and can be inexpensively but from burlap or rough cloth. Sackcloth traditionally figures in Lent as a symbol of repentance from sin. LORD, let me cloth myself in the sackcloth of repentance. My sins irritate my conscience as sackcloth irritates a body.

Wheat: At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Eucharist. The bread that became his Body was made from wheat. Jesus used wheat in a parable when He said, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies it bears much fruit." Jesus used wheat in a parable to refer to himself and the death that he was about to undergo. The parable also can refer to us in that we have to die to ourselves so that we can be resurrected to new life in Jesus. Just as all the grains of wheat are crushed to make flour for one loaf, so all of us who follow Christ will, through our sufferings, be united in His Body the Church.

Thorns: It reminds us of physical suffering, loneliness and injustices in the world.

Cross: It symbolizes victory over death and salvation from sin.

Saint Ludovico of Casoria's Story

Born in Casoria, near Naples, Arcangelo Palmentieri was a cabinet-maker before entering the Friars Minor in 1832, taking the name Ludovico. After his ordination five years later, he taught chemistry, physics, and mathematics to younger members of his province for several years.

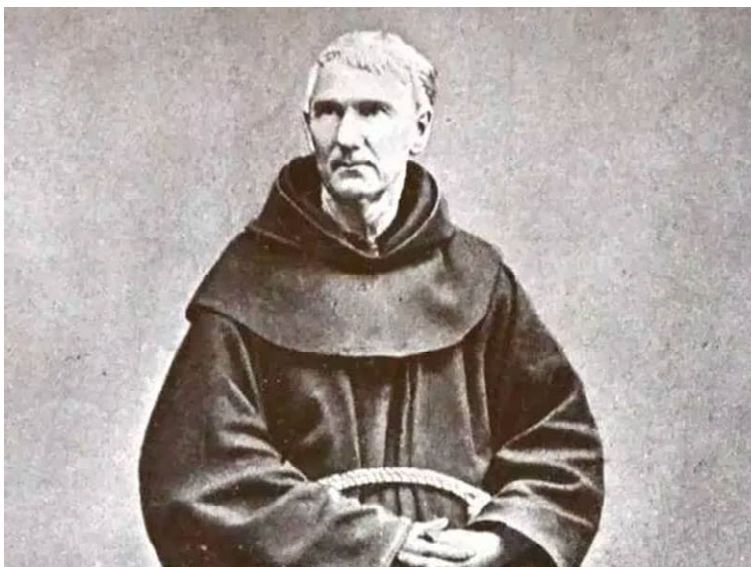
In 1847, he had a mystical experience which he later described as a cleansing. After that, he dedicated his life to the poor and the infirm, establishing a dispensary for the poor, two schools for African children, an institute for the children of nobility, as well as an institution for orphans, the deaf, and the speechless, and other institutes for the blind, elderly, and for travelers. In addition to an infirmary for friars of his province, he began charitable institutes in Naples, Florence, and Assisi. He once said, "Christ's love has wounded my heart." This love prompted him to great acts of charity.

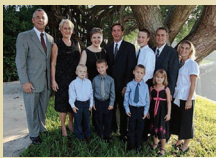
To help continue these works of mercy, in 1859 he established the Gray Brothers, a religious community composed of men who formerly belonged to the Secular Franciscan Order. Three years later, he founded the Gray Sisters of St. Elizabeth for the same purpose.

Toward the beginning of his final, nine-year illness, Ludovico wrote a spiritual testament which described faith as "light in the darkness, help in sickness, blessing in tribulations, paradise in the crucifixion, and life amid death." The local work for his beatification began within five months of Ludovico's death. He was beatified in 1993 and canonized in 2014.

Reflection

Saintly people are not protected from suffering, but with God's help they learn how to develop compassion from it. In the face of great suffering, we move either toward compassion or indifference. Saintly men and women show us the path toward compassion.





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
