Fifth Sunday of Lent (C)
April 3rd, 2022
Is 43: 16-21 / Ps 126: 1-6 / Phil 3:8-14 / Jn 8: 1-11

In our Gospel today, a woman was caught in adultery. She might have been discovered by her husband. The neighbors may have heard the squabble and immediately news got around the neighborhood. People like scandals. They do not like to be the last one to know. So, they all came. They were there to enjoy the gossip and to join in the condemnation. They thought, they were all righteous.

Treated like a thing without feelings, the woman was dragged to Jesus' presence. They did that not because they didn't know what to do. They knew the Law of Moses should be applied to her: "if a man is discovered having relations with a woman who is married to another, both the man and the woman whom he has had relations shall die" (Deut. 22:22).

But they wanted to hit two birds with one stone, so to speak. If Jesus would say that the woman should be pardoned, it would mean he was breaking the Law of Moses and he was even encouraging people to commit sin. If he said that she should be stoned to death, he would lose his reputation of being a friend of sinners; he would even possibly come into collision with the Romans who forbade any Jew to carry out the death sentence on anyone.

Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. Some scriptural commentaries suggest that he was writing in the dust the sins of the very men who were accusing the woman. Others suggest that his very heart was filled with agony seeing the lust of the Pharisees and the scribes, the cruelty of the people, and the shame of the woman.

Whatever be the reason, the teachers of the law and the pharisees continued to demand an answer from him. Jesus must have looked at them one by one with eyes that penetrated the very depths of their hearts and souls. Breaking the eerie suspense, Christ said: "Let the man among you who is without sin be the first to cast a stone at her."

The people might have stared at each other. They might have gazed on themselves and the stones they clutched in their hands. One by one, as the Gospel relates, the crowd left, beginning with the eldest down to the youngest. They realized that they too had also sinned and deserved to be on the spot where the woman was to be stoned.

Only Christ and the woman remained. As St. Augustine puts it: "Relicti sunt duo: Misera et misericorsia" (Left are two: the misery and the mercy). "Has no one condemned you?," asked Jesus. "No one, sir," she answered. Jesus said, "Nor do I condemn you. You may go. But from now on, avoid this sin." Christ was saying in effect, "I know you have messed your life. You have been given another chance. Prove that you can do better next time."

In the first reading, Yahweh said through the prophet Isaiah: "No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See I am doing a new deed..." (Is. 43: 18-19). In the second reading St. Paul said: "I forget the past and strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upward to receive in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:13-14)

Life, as they say, is a race. But it is not a 100-meter dash. Some run fast while others may run slowly. Some may get lost in the racetrack and some may even fall along the way. Whatever it may be, Christ wants us to keep running, finish the race and conscious of his mercy whether first or last, claim the crown of victory which is ours through the forgiveness and salvation of Christ, our Lord.

The Symbols of Lent and their Meaning

Violet/Purple color: This is a somber color for the Lenten season which signifies humility, willingness to repent, mourning for the sins and suffering with Jesus.

Stones: They remind us of Jesus' experience in the desert for forty days and being tempted by the devil. Jesus was tempted by the devil to change stones into bread but he did not heed to the devil. He remained steadfast and overcame the temptations. The stones symbolize austerity and rigor, desolation, misery and sadness.

Sackcloth: Sackcloth is a coarse, cloth in which the Jewish people made from goat's hair. Today it can be made from flax or hemp or other natural fibers to create a rough, woven fabric. The Hebrews wore sackcloth, together with wood ashes, as a sign of mourning or repentance or when praying for certain serious needs. Sackcloth can be worn under one's clothes as a scapular or vest and can be inexpensively but from burlap or rough cloth. Sackcloth traditionally figures in Lent as a symbol of repentance from sin. LORD, let me cloth myself in the sackcloth of repentance. My sins irritate my conscience as sackcloth irritates a body.

Wheat: At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Eucharist. The bread that became his Body was made from wheat. Jesus used wheat in a parable when He said, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies it bears much fruit." Jesus used wheat in a parable to refer to himself and the death that he was about to undergo. The parable also can refer to us in that we have to die to ourselves so that we can be resurrected to new life in Jesus. Just as all the grains of wheat are crushed to make flour for one loaf, so all of us who follow Christ will, through our sufferings, be united in His Body the Church.

Thorns: It reminds us of physical suffering, loneliness and injustices in the world.

Cross: It symbolizes victory over death and salvation from sin.



Saint Isidore of Seville's Story

The 76 years of Isidore's life were a time of conflict and growth for the Church in Spain. The Visigoths had invaded the land a century and a half earlier, and shortly before Isidore's birth they set up their own capital. They were Arians—Christians who said Christ was not God. Thus, Spain was split in two: One people (Catholic Romans) struggled with another (Arian Goths).

Isidore reunited Spain, making it a center of culture and learning. The country served as a teacher and guide for other European countries whose culture was also threatened by barbarian invaders.

Born in Cartagena of a family that included three other sibling saints—Leander, Fulgentius and Florentina—he was educated by his elder brother, whom he succeeded as bishop of Seville.

An amazingly learned man, he was sometimes called “The Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages” because the encyclopedia he wrote was used as a textbook for nine centuries. He required seminaries to be built in every diocese, wrote a Rule for religious orders, and founded schools that taught every branch of learning. Isidore wrote numerous books, including a dictionary, an encyclopedia, a history of Goths, and a history of the world—beginning with creation! He completed the Mozarabic liturgy, which is still in use in Toledo, Spain. For all these reasons, Isidore has been suggested as patron of the Internet. Several others—including Anthony of Padua—also have been suggested.

He continued his austerities even as he approached age 80. During the last six months of his life, he increased his charities so much that his house was crowded from morning till night with the poor of the countryside.

Reflection

Our society can well use Isidore's spirit of combining learning and holiness. Loving, understanding and knowledge can heal and bring a broken people back together. We are not barbarians like the invaders of Isidore's Spain. But people who are swamped by riches and overwhelmed by scientific and technological advances can lose much of their understanding love for one another.
