

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord April 10th, 2022 Is 50: 4-7 / Ps 22: 8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24 / Phil 2: 6-11 / Lk 22: 14-23:36 or 23: 1-49

This is a true story of a man named John Griffith. He worked in Missouri, at the edge of the Mississippi River, trending one of the great railroad bridges that spanned the massive river. John's job was to control the gears of the bridge. He would rise the bridge when barges and ships cross underneath, glide under it, and lower it when locomotive pass and roll by over it.

One day, in 1937, John brought his eight-year old son Greg with him at this worksite. Greg was amazed at how his father could single-handedly press down the gigantic lever that raised and lowered the huge bridge. At noontime, father and son went down into the observation deck for lunch. As they were eating, they were startled by the shrieking whistle of a distant train. John looked at his watch and saw it was already 1:07 p.m. Suddenly he remembered that the bridge was still raised and the Memphis Express train would be passing by in just a few minutes.

Not wanting to show panic, he instructed his son to stay put as he ran back to the control room. Once in, he made sure there were no ships below. But as he was about to lower the bridge, his heart froze. For there, below him in the massive gear box that housed the gears which moved the bridge, was his beloved son. Greg must have tried to follow his dad but had fallen off the catwalk; and he was wedged between the teeth of two revolving main cogs in the gearbox. Although he appeared to be conscious, his leg was bleeding a lot. John knew that lowering the bridge meant crushing to death his beloved son.

He thought of solutions, but he knew he wouldn't have much time. The train with its 400 passengers was fast approaching. What would happen to the 400 people if he did not lower the bridge? But how about Greg... his son... his only son... his pride... his joy? (I don't know what we would do if we were in his place.) But for him, there was one thing he should do and had to do. Covering his eyes under his left arm, he plunged down the lever lowering the bridge. The cries of his dying son were quickly drowned out by the sound of a roaring train. [taken from Christianity in Crisis by Hawk Haneygraaf, Oregon: Harvest House, 1992.]

John Griffith sacrificed his son for the sake of the lives of 400 passengers. But without taking away the merits of his heroism, he wouldn't have done that if he had other choices.

But there is a father who sacrificed his only son even if he had other choices. It is God our Father who willed... who loved... who has sacrificed his only beloved Son that we may not die but live.

Greg, the son, may have been a victim of circumstance. Jesus was not. By obedience, he willingly offered his life on the cross for our sake.

The 400 passengers didn't notice because they didn't know. Can we also say the same thing with the love of God and the sufferings of Christ?

Holy week is here not only as a commemoration, but as an opportunity for us to appreciate God's great love who "sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins" (1 John 4:10)... those sins that brought about the death of Christ.

In everything we do this Holy Week, let us bear in mind the anguish of John Griffith which might as well be what God is telling us: "Don't you know that I've sacrificed my Son for you? Don't you care?" Let us express our gratitude to the Father and to Christ by making this week specially holy. Hopefully, we can answer, "We do care."

Holy Week

"Holy week is ordered to the commemoration of Christ's passion, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem" (Universal norms, 31). It is the highest point of the Lenten Season. It opens with the blessing of Palms and the reading of the Passion of our Lord. The triumphal entry into Jerusalem ended on Calvary, but we know that Good Friday led to Easter Sunday.

The days of Holy week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, have precedence over all other celebrations. It is not fitting, except in the danger of death, that baptisms or confirmations be celebrated on these days since they have their natural place in Easter Vigil. On Palm Sunday the church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his paschal mystery.

The Sacred Paschal Triduum


What really do the liturgies of the triduum celebrate? Most all of us believe we know the answer. We assume that Thursday commemorates the day Jesus instituted the eucharist; Friday commemorates the day he was executed on the cross; and the vigil commemorates his emergence from the tomb.

They celebrate not what once happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God's taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community broken like bread for the world's life - a community rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and fearless in the search for justice and peace.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Pope Francis has asked parishes to support the annual Pontifical Good Friday Collection, to be held on April 15, 2022. This annual second collection is taken in Catholic churches throughout the world to support the work of the Franciscans working in the Holy Land. Specifically, the collection, funds Catholic schools, offers religious education, and helps to preserve the sacred shrines.

Last year's Pontifical Good Friday Collection supported numerous initiatives, including 23 parishes and three academic institutions, provided a home for 30 children from homes facing domestic violence, offered 400 scholarships for high school and university education, helped keep schools open for more than 10,000 pre-K through grade 12 students, supported 120 men preparing to be priests or brothers, restored and maintained more than 1,000 houses/apartments for Christian families, offered assistance at senior care facilities in Bethlehem and Nazareth, created 1,200 jobs in the Holy Land for Christians, and preserved 65 shrines connected with the life of Jesus and the prophets.

Thank you for supporting the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, as encouraged by Pope Francis. By supporting this cause, you join with Catholics around the world to stand in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land, and you become an instrument of peace in a troubled land.

Marian Festival

Our Lady of Good Health, also known as Our Lady of Vailankanni, is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary by devotees. She is said to have appeared twice in the town of Velankanni, Tamil Nadu, India, in the 16th to 17th centuries. Though there is no historical document or record about the apparitions of Mary at Velankanni, passed down through oral tradition from the 16th century. Also, the rescue of the Portuguese in Goa and Bombay-Bassein, who were who were sailing through a deadly storm, off the coast of the Coromandel region in the 17th century.

According to tradition, the first apparition is said to have occurred to a young boy delivering buttermilk to a man who lived far away. During his travels, the boy stopped to rest beside a lake that was shaded by a Banyan tree. A beautiful woman, carrying a child, is said to have appeared, and asked the boy for some milk to feed her child, which he gave. When he reached the home for his milk delivery, he apologised for the delay and that there would be less milk in his pot. But when they opened the lid of the milk pot, the container was brimming with milk.

The second apparition is alleged to have occurred a few years later. A lame boy would sell buttermilk to passing travellers, who would pause in the shade of a large Banyan tree, to escape the heat of the day. However, he had no customers. According to the account, suddenly, an ethereal woman, holding a child appeared before him, and asked for a cup of buttermilk. He gave her a cup, which she fed to her child. The woman asked the boy to go to Nagapattinam, and find a certain Catholic man in the town, and tell him to build a chapel at Vailankanni in her honour. Apparently cured, the boy ran to Nagapattinam, where he found the man and told him his story. The Catholic men of Nagapattinam subsequently built a thatched chapel at Vailankanni, dedicated to Mary under the title of "Our Lady of Good Health".

In the 17th century, a Portuguese merchant vessel sailing from Macau to Ceylon was caught in a severe storm in the Bay of Bengal. The sailors prayed fervently for Mary, Star of the Sea to save them, and promised to build a church in her honor wherever they could land. The sea became calm, and their ship landed near Vailankanni on 8 September, the Feast of the Nativity of Mary. To honor their promise, the Portuguese rebuilt the thatched chapel into a stone church. The church was later renovated twice in the early 20th century.

Although these alleged apparitions have been formally approved by the Holy See, they were implicitly approved by Pope John XXIII's 1962 elevation of the Vailankanni church to minor basilica status. The Pope's apostolic brief noted that pilgrims in large numbers had been visiting the shrine for a long period of time, and that it was hailed as the "Lourdes of the East

A Gothic-styled basilica stands in Velankanni in memory of the apparitions. The basilica erected by the Portuguese and the Indians stands at the site where the buttermilk seller saw Mary and Jesus. The iconic depiction of the Madonna is unique in that it is one of two only icons where Mary is portrayed wearing an Indian Sari,



while the other statue is said to have been buried with Aurangzeb, the Mughal Emperor. The basilica is known as a site for pilgrims from all over India and its assembly of multilingual prayers every Christmas.

8 September, the Feast of the Nativity of Mary, is also commemorated as the feast of Our Lady of Good Health. The celebration starts on 29 August and ends on the day of the feast. The feast day prayers are said in Tamil, Marathi, East Indian, Malayalam, Telugu, Kannada, Konkani, Hindi and English.

Saint Bernadette Soubirous's Story

Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844, the first child of an extremely poor miller in the town of Lourdes in southern France. The family was living in the basement of a dilapidated building when on February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. Bernadette, 14 years old, was known as a virtuous girl though a dull student who had not even made her first Holy Communion. In poor health, she had suffered from asthma from an early age.

There were 18 appearances in all, the final one occurring on the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked skepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of the curious. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel built on the spot of the visions. There, the people were to come to wash in and drink of the water of the spring that had welled up from the very spot where Bernadette had been instructed to dig.

According to Bernadette, the Lady of her visions was a girl of 16 or 17 who wore a white robe with a blue sash. Yellow roses covered her feet, a large rosary was on her right arm. In the vision on March 25 she told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." It was only when the words were explained to her that Bernadette came to realize who the Lady was.

Few visions have ever undergone the scrutiny that these appearances of the Immaculate Virgin were subject to. Lourdes became one of the most popular Marian shrines in the world, attracting millions of visitors. Miracles were reported at the shrine and in the waters of the spring. After thorough investigation, Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions in 1862.

During her life, Bernadette suffered much. She was hounded by the public as well as by civic officials

until at last she was protected in a convent of nuns. Five years later, she petitioned to enter the Sisters of Notre Dame of Nevers. After a period of illness she was able to make the journey from Lourdes and enter the novitiate. But within four months of her arrival she was given the last rites of the Church and allowed to profess her vows. She recovered enough to become infirmarian and then sacristan, but chronic health problems persisted. She died on April 16, 1879, at the age of 35. Bernadette Soubirous was canonized in 1933.

Reflection

Millions of people have come to the spring Bernadette uncovered for healing of body and spirit, but she found no relief from ill health there. Bernadette moved through life, guided only by blind faith in things she did not understand—as we all must do from time to time.






