

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER (C) May 1st, 2022 Acts 5: 27-32, 40b-41 / Ps 30: 2, 4-6, 11-13 / Rv 5: 11-14 / Jn 21: 1-19

The wonderful thing about Christ is that he continues to love us in spite of our failings. The forgiving love of Jesus is so great that even with our defeat by sin, what he sees in us is our desire to reconcile with him and our resolve to do better next time.

When Jesus in our Gospel reading appeared once again to the disciples, none of them presumed to inquire, "Who are you?," for they knew it was the Lord.

Many people also knew already about Jesus. The issue about him is not simply a matter of discussing and proving that God exists. Jesus had shown what kind of God his Father was. In his suffering and death on the cross, Christ reveled his Father's love and forgiveness; in his resurrection, he unveiled God's promise of eternal life.

This must be what he was explaining to Peter. He realized that Peter already believed in him, but he wanted to Peter to continue his mission of announcing God's love to all men and women. Yes, Peter loved him but Jesus wished him to proclaim to all the kind of Lord he was as Peter himself had learned and experienced.

Peter denied the Lord three times, and thus, Jesus gave Peter three chances to affirm his love for him. Each time that Peter would profess his love, Jesus would tell him: "Be a shepherd to my sheep... Feed my sheep." Jesus fore-told to him that he would die in carrying out his love for him as the shepherd of his flock. The day came when Peter went to Rome. There he met death. He was nailed to the cross with his head down, his feet up, for he had said that he was not worthy to die as his Lord died.

Our love for Christ is the greatest privilege in the world, but it also involves responsibility and sacrifice. We, too, are shepherds of Christ in the same sense that there are people under our care. We cannot really love Christ unless we are ready to face the task of loving the lambs entrusted to us — even if that would mean carrying the cross and dying for them as Christ, the Good Shepherd, did for us.

A rose is said to be a perfect symbol of romance. It lasts only for days. It withers and fades away. What remains are the thorns, the symbol of sufferings. We can truly love if we can behold not the rose but the thorns. A. Karr once said: "Some people are always grumbling because roses have thorns; I am thankful that thorns have roses."

There is no easy path to real loving. Let us profess our love for Christ aware of the thorns that will come over way and yet, hopeful that roses will bloom in the everlasting spring.

Mother's Day

On Sunday May 9th, we will be celebrating Mother's day. We recall one of the people who gave us life. I hope you will get a visit from your children or at least a phone call or text message.

Cardinal Sin loves to recall the story of Giuseppe Sarto who become a Pope and saint. He is known as Pius X. When he was consecrated Bishop of Mantua, he want to see his mother and showed her his precious episcopal ring, saying proudly: "Mother, look at the beautiful ring I received." She smiled and showed him her wedding ring and said: "My son, without this ring you wouldn't have received yours."

What is a mother? The late Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty described her as "the most important person on earth. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body."

St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Galatians: "When the fullness of time came, God sent his Son. He came born of a woman...in order to redeem... make us adopted sons and daughters of God. And because you are sons, God has sent into your hearts the spirit of his son which cries out: Abba! That is: Father!" (Gal. 4: 4-6).

This is the reason why mothers have a very glorious dignity because Jesus, the Redeemer had deemed it worthy to be born, formed and loved by a mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. All mothers are special before God.

We encourage you to participate in our Novena of Masses for our mothers. They need our prayers. Mother's Day novena envelopes are located next to the doors in the church and please return them before or on Mother's Day. We start the novena of masses that day at 9am. A special blessing and roses will be distributed for our mothers after all the masses.



Saint Athanasius' Story

Athanasius led a tumultuous but dedicated life of service to the Church. He was the great champion of the faith against the widespread heresy of Arianism, the teaching by Arius that Jesus was not truly divine. The vigor of his writings earned him the title of doctor of the Church.

Born of a Christian family in Alexandria, Egypt, and given a classical education, Athanasius became secretary to Alexander, the bishop of Alexandria, entered the priesthood and was eventually named bishop himself. His predecessor, Alexander, had been an outspoken critic of a new movement growing in the East—Arianism.

When Athanasius assumed his role as bishop of Alexandria, he continued the fight against Arianism. At first, it seemed that the battle would be easily won and that Arianism would be condemned. Such, however, did not prove to be the case. The Council of Tyre was called and for several reasons that are still unclear, the Emperor Constantine exiled Athanasius to northern Gaul. This was to be the first in a series of travels and exiles reminiscent of the life of Saint Paul.

After Constantine died, his son restored Athanasius as bishop. This lasted only a year, however, for he was deposed once again by a coalition of Arian bishops. Athanasius took his case to Rome, and Pope Julius I called a synod to review the case and other related matters.

Five times Athanasius was exiled for his defense of the doctrine of Christ's divinity. During one period of his life, he enjoyed 10 years of relative peace—reading, writing, and promoting the Christian life along the lines of the monastic ideal to which he was greatly devoted. His dogmatic and historical writings are almost all polemic, directed against every

aspect of Arianism.

Among his ascetical writings, his *Life of St. Anthony* achieved astonishing popularity and contributed greatly to the establishment of monastic life throughout the Western Christian world.

Reflection

Athanasius suffered many trials while he was bishop of Alexandria. He was given the grace to remain strong against what probably seemed at times to be insurmountable opposition. Athanasius lived his office as bishop completely. He defended the true faith for his flock, regardless of the cost to himself. In today's world we are experiencing this same call to remain true to our faith, no matter what.






