FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C) May 15th, 2022 Acts 14: 21-27 / Ps 145: 8-13 / Rv 21: 1-5a / Jn 13: 31-33a, 34-35

There was a girl who was born without an ear. She became a shy and introverted person. There were times when she would go home crying because her classmates made fun of her. When she became a teenager, her mother brought her to a surgeon who performed an ear transplant on her. The operation was successful and she became a happy person.

Not long after she had a boyfriend. After several years, she decided to get married. On the eve of her wedding day, she went inside her mother's room to thank her. But as she embraced her, she noticed something strange... something absent. She realized that beneath the long hair of her mother was a missing ear.

She cried and said, "It was you! All these years you didn't tell me it was you." The mother replied, "My child, I didn't tell you because I didn't want you to be sad for me. I did it because I want you to be happy, to see you happy with your life. You don't loose something when you give it to someone you love."

While the world teaches us to use and exploit people to our own advantage, Jesus rejoins is to live in his love by loving one another as he has loved us. We can be known as his true disciples by out love for one another.

What does Jesus have to tell us to love one another? Love is not something begged nor dictated. It is something earned and freely given. We only have to look at the crucifix with Jesus hanging in agony and death to remind us that he freely gave his life to prove his love for us. Our Lord gave us his life to prove his love for us. Our Lord gave us the example that love is stronger than sin. He did not condemn Mary Magdalene; he effected in the conversation with tax collectors like Matthew and Zacchaeus. He was not afraid to touch and heal the sick; he stretched out his hand to the lepers; he whispered forgiveness to the good thief. Love can renew life. Love can cleanse sin. Love can conquer death.

This is the reason why we have to love one another not in the measure of our human ability to love nor on account of how others can return our love, but as God has loved us. For Jesus said, "Love one another has I have loved you."

Your husband, may not be a perfect husband yet you have to love him not because he has met your expectations, but as Jesus loved us. Your wife may have her weaknesses and shortcomings, but as Jesus have loved us, you must love her. You may have frustrations with your children, but you continue to love them because of the love of Jesus. This principle is applied to all the people around us, whether they are our friends or our enemies.

In short, the measure of love is Jesus, This simply means love has transcended all the human standards. Love can find its real meaning and perfection in the divine love that Jesus unconditionally manifested to us.

St. John wrote, "This is love: not that we loved God but that he first loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins... No one has ever seen God, but if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love spreads freely among us... if anyone says, 'I love God,' while he hates his brother he is a liar. How can he love God who he does not see, if he does not live his brother whom he sees? We received from him this commandment: let him who loves God also love his brother" (1 Jn 4:10, 12,20).

In the offertory part of the Mass, we notice the wine poured into the chalice, and then a little water is added. The wine is strong and powerful. It represents the love of Christ. The water is weak and powerless. This represents our love. When the water is mixed wine, it becomes one with the water and is invigorated and strengthened. It is consecrated and raised up as a chalice of salvation.

Let our love me mingled with Christ's love. May it be a chalice of renewal, a spirit of healing and forgiveness, and sign of hope and discipleship. May God inspire us to pour it out until the end.

Saint Paschal Baylon's Story

In Paschal's lifetime the Spanish empire in the New World was at the height of its power, though France and England were soon to reduce its influence. The 16th century has been called the Golden Age of the Church in Spain, for it gave birth to Ignatius of Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, Peter of Alcantara, Francis Solano, and Salvator of Horta.

Paschal's Spanish parents were poor and pious. Between the ages of seven and 24 he worked as a shepherd and began a life of mortification. He was able to pray on the job and was especially attentive to the church bell, which rang at the Elevation during Mass. Paschal had a very honest streak in him. He once offered to pay owners of crops for any damage his animals caused!

In 1564, Paschal joined the Friars Minor and gave himself wholeheartedly to a life of penance. Though he was urged to study for the priesthood, he chose to be a brother. At various times he served as porter, cook, gardener, and official beggar.

Paschal was careful to observe the vow of poverty. He would never waste any food or anything given for the use of the friars. When he was porter and took care of the poor coming to the door, he developed a reputation for great generosity. The friars sometimes tried to moderate his liberality!

Paschal spent his spare moments praying before the Blessed Sacrament. In time, many people sought his wise counsel. People flocked to his tomb immediately after his burial; miracles were reported promptly. Paschal was canonized in 1690 and was named patron of eucharistic congresses and societies in 1897.

Reflection

Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament occupied much of Saint Francis' energy. Most of his letters were to promote devotion to the Eucharist. Paschal shared that concern. An hour in prayer before our Lord in the Eucharist could teach all of us a great deal. Some holy and busy Catholics today find that their work is enriched by those minutes regularly spent in prayer and meditation.
