SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C) May 22nd, 2022 Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29 / Ps 67: 2-3, 5-6, 8 / Rv 21: 10-14, 22-23 / Jn: 23-29

When the Risen Christ appeared to his disciples they only saw a vague form which they did not recognize. Worse than that, they thought it was a ghost. It was someone strange and ugly that they screamed in fear. Only after they looked again, more carefully, were they able to recognize him. "Look at my hands and feet; it's really I," Jesus told them, "Touch me" (Lk. 24:39). I have always wondered why Jesus in spite of his resurrection and assumption of a glorious body still bore the scars of his wounds in his hands, feet and heart. There were scars on his head where he was crowned with thorns; there were scars on his face where he received blows from the soldiers; there were scars on his back where he received severe lashing, and scars on his knees, when he fell on the ground as he carried the cross. Why can't Jesus become really beautiful in his glorious state, without the traces of the excruciating pains that he had endured?

I came across a poem by Rev. Charles Cook entitles "Scarred People are Beautiful". This somehow explains the presence of scars in Jesus' body even after his resurrection, I would like to share this poem with you.

SCARRED PEOPLE ARE BEAUTIFUL

I have seen a number of movies lately, Lord,

Like Romeo and Juliet.

The love of young people, at least in those movies, is beautiful... so simple... so total... so uncomplicated...

They seem so natural, so free in their emotions, so clear in their feelings.

I wish I could be like that, Lord

But it can't be; why is that so?

I've been so hurt, Lord.

I have trusted and betrayed at times.

I have loved and received nothing in return.

I have tried hard to care and failed often.

I have shared my secrets and heard them whispered to others.

I have been warm and received a cold shoulder.

I have been through it, Lord.

I have fallen in my face. I've banged my shins. I've been bruised.

Look, Lord, I'm covered with scars!

My son,

Maybe you haven't understood enough;

May you haven't learned that human life is like that: all the saints are scarred.

Young love isn't the highest form of human love.

The greatest love comes from scarred people.

I know that many people stop loving so they won't be hurt again.

But those people who do start over again, who continue in spite of it all,

Who leave themselves open to the possibility of hurt again,

These people are able to love again in a deeper way, a more understanding way, a richer way.


I think I know what you mean, Lord.

I've met people like that... and knowing them gives me courage.

The great people are those who continue to love their scars.

I like SCARRED PEOPLE LORD, THEY ARE BEAUTIFUL.

People who are flawless may be lovely and people who have scars may be ugly. Jesus was full with scars and must have looked terrible but his scars were truly a badge of glory for what he had done, a living proof of his love. Let us look at ourselves, at our parents, at our husbands and wives. Over the years of struggle and hurts, we are full of scars and our human beauty may be gone. But if we come to think of it, all the more we radiate with beauty. Real beauty is not in the face. This will fade away. It emanates from the scars etched by serving and loving. These will remain living testimonies of how we have lived our discipleship with Christ, the Lord who is beautiful because he is full of scars. We too could be beautiful even with our scars.

Saint Philip Neri's Story

Philip Neri was a sign of contradiction, combining popularity with piety against the background of a corrupt Rome and a disinterested clergy: the whole post-Renaissance malaise.

At an early age, Philip abandoned the chance to become a businessman, moved to Rome from Florence, and devoted his life and individuality to God. After three years of philosophy and theology studies, he gave up any thought of ordination. The next 13 years were spent in a vocation unusual at the time—that of a layperson actively engaged in prayer and the apostolate.

As the Council of Trent (1545-63) was reforming the Church on a doctrinal level, Philip's appealing personality was winning him friends from all levels of society, from beggars to cardinals. He rapidly gathered around himself a group of laypersons won over by his audacious spirituality. Initially, they met as an informal prayer and discussion group, and also served poor people in Rome.

At the urging of his confessor, Philip was ordained a priest and soon became an outstanding confessor himself, gifted with the knack of piercing the pretenses and illusions of others, though always in a charitable manner and often with a joke. He arranged talks, discussions, and prayers for his penitents in a room above the church. He sometimes led "excursions" to other churches, often with music and a picnic on the way.

Some of Philip's followers became priests and lived together in community. This was the beginning of the Oratory, the religious institute he founded. A feature of their life was a daily afternoon service of four informal talks, with vernacular hymns and prayers. Giovanni Palestrina was one of Philip's followers, and composed music for the services. The Oratory was finally approved after suffering through a period of accusations of being an assembly of heretics, where laypersons preached and sang vernacular hymns!

Philip's advice was sought by many of the prominent figures of his day. He is one of the influential figures of the Counter-Reformation, mainly for converting to personal holiness many of the influential people within the Church itself. His characteristic virtues were humility and gaiety.

After spending a day hearing confessions and receiving visitors, Philip Neri suffered a hemorrhage and died on the feast of Corpus Christi in 1595. He was beatified in 1615 and canonized in 1622. Three centuries later, Cardinal John Henry Newman founded the first English-speaking house of the Oratory in London.

Reflection

Many people wrongly feel that such an attractive and jocular personality as Philip's cannot be combined with an intense spirituality. Philip's life melts our rigid, narrow views of piety. His approach to sanctity was truly catholic, all-embracing, and accompanied by a good laugh. Philip always wanted his followers to become not less but more human through their striving for holiness.






