

#### Pentecost Sunday June 5th, 2022 Acts 2: 1-11 / Ps 104: 1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34 / 1 Cor 12: 3b-7, 12-13 / Jn 20: 19-23

In the second reading, St. Paul declares, "No one can say: Jesus is Lord, except in the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:3). The love that we show, the services we render, the talents we use, the faith and unity we witness and many more, are works of the Holy Spirit. Without the air we breathe in and breathe out, we cannot expect to live. In like manner, without the Holy Spirit, we cannot live our commitment as Christians.

There was a time too in the early Church when nothing seemed to happen. In the days before the Pentecost, the apostles were afraid; they were discouraged and disappointed. They hid and locked themselves in. They would have disintegrated as a community had it not been for Mary, the Mother of Christ. She was there to keep them united, to keep them believing in the promises of her Son. She might have told them, "Wait and pray. The Holy Spirit will come as it came to me."

And true enough, on the fiftieth day, with a great rush of wind and tongues of fire that came to rest on each of them, they were filled with the Holy Spirit. In an instant, they were changed from mediocrity into careless abandon. They forgot their concern for safety, but only remembered what Christ had commissioned them to do, that is, to preach the Good News of salvation to all the nations. Immediately, they burst with trust and obedience to carry out Christ's will to teach, heal and forgive. What was seemingly dead had become truly alive.

We too may not act differently from the disciples' actuations before the Pentecost event. The Holy Spirit was infused in us at our baptism and confirmation. But unfortunately, we keep our doors closed with our fears and hesitations. We remain powerless and emasculated to stand up courageously as followers of Christ.


Maybe we are afraid that if we really set free the Spirit that is already in us, we know that we have to change. We are aware that we will never be the same again. There will be a new creation, a new person, a new outlook, a renewed confidence to face the world.

This is why we are somehow reluctant to make the Spirit work in our lives. We keep it nicely hidden and restricted within us so that we would not be compelled to take risks nor tax ourselves with the possibilities of doing more than what we normally do. Is it the reason why we cannot still love, serve and forgive as Christ did? How about the fruit of the Spirit which is "charity, joy and peace, patience, understanding of others, kindness and fidelity, gentleness and self-control?" (Gal. 5:22). Do we have them?

History says that when man discovered fire, it was the beginning of progress of humanity. Fire opened the floodgates of possibilities. Fire can make something tough or it can make it soft. Fire can bend, it can give light, it can create; yes, it can change things.

It is in this context that we quote Tielhard de Chardin, a Jesuit paleontologist, who in his book "Divine Milieu" said: "Someday, after mastering the winds, the waves, the tides and gravity, we shall harness for God the energies of love and then for the second time in the history of the world, man will discover fire."

Indeed that someday should begin now. Yes, that fire will not be discovered from outside but from within because the Holy Spirit dwells in our hearts. Let it be that we pray, "Come, O Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of the faithful and enkindle them with the fire of your love. And maybe, none will doubt anymore our faith and worship. We will only talk "about the marvels God has accomplished" (Acts 2:11) in our lives. Let it be.




# **Ordinary Time**

Ordinary Time consists of 33 or 34 weeks outside the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Sundays and Weekdays in Ordinary Time unfold the other mysteries of Christ that are not explicitly commemorated by the seasons, During this time the Church calls attention to Our Lord's ministry of preaching, healing, and liberating. These, in some way, become present to us as we listen with faith to the biblical readings every Sunday and indeed every day. Of great importance, therefore, are the biblical readings, especially the gospel, during the Masses in Ordinary Time. When we listen to them we are enabled to listen to the reaching of Christ and experience the saving and healing power of his word. It is useful to keep in mind that his words and actions, which the gospel proclaims, allow us to paint the picture of our Father in heaven. We obtain knowledge of the Father through what Christ preached and performed. Likewise, the Prefaces during Ordinary Time are worthy of our attention. They proclaim the wonderful works of God in creation and salvation history through Jesus Christ.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary", but its message Sunday after Sunday, day after day, is not ordinary: it is always extraordinary, because it is about the person of Jesus Christ who reveals to us by his words and action the person of the Father.

Ordinary Time resumes on Monday following Pentecost (June 6th), with the 10th week.

# Blessed Angeline of Marsicano's Story

Born into an aristocratic family in Barcelona, Spain, Joachima was 12 when she expressed a desire to become a Carmelite nun. But her life took an altogether different turn at 16 with her marriage to a young lawyer, Theodore de Mas. Both deeply devout, they became secular Franciscans. During their 17 years of married life they raised eight children.


The normalcy of their family life was interrupted when Napoleon invaded Spain. Joachima had to flee with the children; Theodore remained behind and died. Though Joachima re-experienced a desire to enter a religious community, she attended to her duties as a mother. At the same time, the young widow led a life of austerity and chose to wear the habit of the Third Order of St. Francis as her ordinary dress. She spent much time in prayer and visiting the sick.

Four years later, with some of her children now married and younger ones under their care, Joachima confessed her desire to a priest to join a religious order. With his encouragement, she established the Carmelite Sisters of Charity. In the midst of the fratricidal wars occurring at the time, Joachima was briefly imprisoned and later exiled to France for several years.

Sickness ultimately compelled her to resign as superior of her order. Over the next four years she slowly succumbed to paralysis, which caused her to die by inches. At her death in 1854 at the age of 71, Joachima was known and admired for her high degree of prayer, deep trust in God, and selfless charity. Joachima was beatified by Pope Pius XII in 1940, and canonized by Pope John XXIII in 1959. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on August 28.

#### Reflection

Joachima understands loss. She lost the home where her children grew up, her husband, and finally her health. As the power to move and care for her own needs slowly ebbed away, this woman who had all her life cared for others became wholly dependent; she required help with life's simplest tasks. When our own lives go spinning out of control, when illness and bereavement and financial hardship strike, all we can do is cling to the belief that sustained Joachima: God watches over us always.






