The Most Holy Trinity June 12th, 2022 Prv 8:22-31 / Ps 8: 4-9 / Rom 5: 1-5 / Jn 16: 12-15

We contend that the Church is one, holy, catholic and apostolic, but we also add that she is indestructible. She cannot be destroyed by the power of her enemies nor by the weakness of her men because she is founded by the power of God. Christ told Peter: "On this rock I will build my Church; and never will the powers of death overcome it" (Mt. 16:18). When he commissioned his disciples to evangelize, he assured them: "I am with you always until the end of this world" (Mt. 28:20).

We have a subject in College that deals with the philosophy of knowledge, epistomology. It begs the question, "How can you know that you know that you really know?" Knowledge and truth can be construed subjectively depending upon one's appreciation of things.

The question I would like to ask therefore is: how can we know that we really know that the truths about our faith are really true? Of course, we based the truths on the light of the revelation of the Sacred Scriptures and Tradition as interpreted by the Church Magisterium. But how can the truths be accepted as true especially if we do not understand it fully well? I believe that ultimately it is God speaking into our hearts to convince us that these truths we hold and hear are really true. This is a gift of certainty given to us by God through the guidance of the Church's teaching.

One of the truths that we cannot fully understand is the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. When we talk about. mystery, it doesn't mean we know nothing about it nor we don't have any basis about it. Our limited human mind cannot simply discern everything about the truth of God. God is not completely beyond comprehension, neither is he within complete comprehension.

Be that as it may, the Blessed Trinity establishes the basis of personalizing the manner of our calling of God. It is said that the Germanic word "God" means the one we call, the one we invoke, the one called, the one we pray to.

Christ does not want us to experience this apprehension. He revealed to us who God is. In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus said, "I have made your name known to those you gave me from the world ... For this is eternal life: to know you, the only true God, and the One you sent, Jesus Christ" (17:6,3). Thus when Christ taught his disciples to pray, he told them to call God our Father in heaven, the one who created everything, the Creator; he calls God, Jesus Christ the Son, who redeemed us from our sins, the Savior; he calls God the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete to be our guide and advocate, the Sanctifier.

This is the reason why when we pray and start our church's celebration, we begin by naming persons: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Three names, three persons, one God. And we are baptized in the name of these three names, in the name of one God.

Our Lord did not only give us God's names. He also revealed our relationship with God and with one another. God's disclosure of himself as three persons tells us that we cannot live in autonomous individualism. We can only find fulfillment through our unselfish concern and love for those people around us. We are called upon to form a community of disciples in the spirit of the Blessed Trinity who are united as a community of persons. To accede to exclusiveness and selfishness within our family, church and our community, would only mean we are not living the Trinitarian mystery.

Saint Anthony of Padua's Story

The gospel call to leave everything and follow Christ was the rule of Saint Anthony of Padua's life. Over and over again, God called him to something new in his plan. Every time Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrificing to serve his Lord Jesus more completely.

His journey as the servant of God began as a very young man when he decided to join the Augustinians in Lisbon, giving up a future of wealth and power to be a servant of God. Later when the bodies of the first Franciscan martyrs went through the Portuguese city where he was stationed, he was again filled with an intense longing to be one of those closest to Jesus himself: those who die for the Good News.

So Anthony entered the Franciscan Order and set out to preach to the Moors. But an illness prevented him from achieving that goal. He went to Italy and was stationed in a small hermitage where he spent most of his time praying, reading the Scriptures and doing menial tasks.

The call of God came again at an ordination where no one was prepared to speak. The humble and obedient Anthony hesitantly accepted the task. The years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading sacred Scripture and of serving him in poverty, chastity, and obedience had prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. Anthony's sermon was astounding to those who expected an unprepared speech and knew not the Spirit's power to give people words.

Recognized as a great man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar, Anthony became the first friar to teach theology to the other friars. Soon he was called from that post to preach to the Albigensians in France, using his profound knowledge of Scripture and theology to convert and reassure those who had been misled by their denial of Christ's divinity and of the sacraments..

After he led the friars in northern Italy for three years, he made his headquarters in the city of Padua. He resumed his preaching and began writing sermon notes to help other preachers. In the spring of 1231 Anthony withdrew to a friary at Camposampiero where he had a sort of treehouse built as a hermitage. There he prayed and prepared for death.

On June 13, he became very ill and asked to be taken back to Padua, where he died after receiving the last sacraments. Anthony was canonized less than a year later and named a Doctor of the Church in 1946.

Reflection

Anthony should be the patron of those who find their lives completely uprooted and set in a new and unexpected direction. Like all saints, he is a perfect example of turning one's life completely over to Christ. God did with Anthony as God pleased—and what God pleased was a life of spiritual power and brilliance that still attracts admiration today. He whom popular devotion has nominated as finder of lost objects found himself by losing himself totally to the providence of God.
