

# Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) June 26th, 2022 1 Kgs 19: 16b, 19-21 / Ps 16:1-2, 5, 7-11 / Gal 5: 1, 13-18 / Lk 9: 51-62

There were occasions in the past especially after having attended a touching seminar or were moved by an inspiring event in our lives that we have declared: "I will follow you, Lord. Can we still say this with an honest resolve and commitment now? Why is it that it is becoming difficult for us to keep those words alive? Have we initially followed Christ and then abandoned him for any reason.

In the book of Revelations, the Lord said, "I have this complaint against you: you have less love now than you used to" (Rev. 2:4).

The Gospel reading today directs us to reflect on the conditions we have to bear if we follow the Lord.

The first man said to Jesus: "I will be your follower wherever you go." But Christ replied to him, "The foxes have lairs, the birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head."

The man must have been so excited that he was carried by his feelings and emotions to have uttered those words. He may not have really known what he was doing. This is why Christ confronted his enthusiasm by presenting to him the reality of discipleship.

He said to another man, "Follow me!" and he said, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." This expression does not necessarily mean that he had to bury his father who had died.

Life is always filled with moments of indecision. Many of us may rationalize that we are too young to be serious about Christ.

When I will be old and have nothing worthwhile to do, then I will follow and serve Christ. It does happen that we spend the best years of our life serving our own ambitions and only later, when we are cranky and feeble, that we want to be of service to our Lord.

The third man wanted to go with Christ, but he said "Let me it take leave of my people at home." But Christ said to him, "Whoever puts his hand to the plow but keeps looking back is unfit for the reign of God."

The gospels have one desire, to lead us to Christ. Christ has one desire, to lead us to God. And God has one desire, to bring us to eternal happiness. Today's gospel, in its goal to lead us to Christ does not picture Christ the way many people do in modern society as "an easy going, do whatever you want, you're all going to get to heaven anyway" kind of person. Jesus is seen as a strict, no nonsense person and his words today could be described as "hard sayings."

Let us pray that we may overcome our impatient and reluctant 'Yes' or even our minimal and disinterested 'YES'. May Mary lead us to an articulate and emphatic 'Yes' We are servants of Christ. May we say 'Yes', I will follow you with all my heart and life.



The two Hallways and the Center Classroom have been recarpeted and painted courtesy of the Ladies Guild!



### **Religious Education Information**

Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation is a two-year process. First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion typically takes place in the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. However we have many students who participate in our Sacraments class if your son or daughter is in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade or higher. The students must complete the first and second grade Religious Education classes before receiving Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Likewise, students who are preparing for Confirmation must attend the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation prep class prior to attending the 9<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation class. We welcome all High School students grades 9-12 to attend the Confirmation prep classes. You may fill out a Religious Education Registration Form anytime over the summer. Please visit or contact the office during office hours to begin the process for registration. We encourage your child to pray every night and begin their preparation for First Holy Communion by memorizing the following prayers over the summer:

Glory Be, Hail Mary, Our Father, Act of Contrition, Invitation to Communion & The Ten Commandments. Your son/daughter will be required to cite from memory all the prayers listed.

We are excited to welcome you to our program! Please follow the bulletin throughout the summer for updates and class dates.

Hail Mary, full of grace' The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and the hour of our death.

### Saints Peter and Paul's Story

**Peter** (d. 64?) Saint Mark ends the first half of his Gospel with a triumphant climax. He has recorded doubt, misunder-standing, and the opposition of many to Jesus. Now Peter makes his great confession of faith: "You are the Messiah" (Mark 8:29b). It was one of the many glorious moments in Peter's life, beginning with the day he was called from his nets along the Sea of Galilee to become a fisher of men for Jesus.

The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the apostles, chosen by Jesus to have a special relationship with him. With James and John he was privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of a dead child to life, and the agony in Gethsemane. His mother-in-law was cured by Jesus. He was sent with John to prepare for the last Passover before Jesus' death. His name is first on every list of apostles.

And to Peter only did Jesus say, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:17b-19).

But the Gospels prove their own trustworthiness by the unflattering details they include about Peter. He clearly had no public relations person. It is a great comfort for ordinary mortals to know that Peter also has his human weakness, even in the presence of Jesus.

He generously gave up all things, yet he can ask in childish self-regard, "What are we going to get for all this?" (see Matthew 19:27). He receives the full force of Christ's anger when he objects to the idea of a suffering Messiah: "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do" (Matthew 16:23b).

Peter is willing to accept Jesus' doctrine of forgiveness, but suggests a limit of seven times. He walks on the water in faith, but sinks in doubt. He refuses to let Jesus wash his feet, then wants his whole body cleansed. He swears at the Last Supper that he will never deny Jesus, and then swears to a servant maid that he has never known the man. He loyally resists the first attempt to arrest Jesus by cutting off Malchus' ear, but in the end he runs away with the others. In the depth of his sorrow, Jesus looks on him and forgives him, and he goes out and sheds bitter tears. The Risen Jesus told Peter to feed his lambs and his sheep (John 21:15-17).

Paul (d. 64?) If the most well-known preacher today suddenly began preaching that the United States should adopt Marxism and not rely on the Constitution, the angry reaction would help us understand Paul's life when he started preaching that Christ alone can save us. He had been the most pharisaic of Pharisees, the most legalistic of Mosaic lawyers. Now he suddenly appears to other Jews as a heretical welcomer of Gentiles, a traitor and apostate.

Paul's central conviction was simple and absolute: Only God can save humanity. No human effort—even the most scrupulous observance of law—can create a human good which we can bring to God as reparation for sin and payment for grace. To be saved from itself, from sin, from the devil, and from death, humanity must open itself completely to the saving power of Jesus. Paul never lost his love for his Jewish family, though he carried on a lifelong debate with them about the uselessness of the Law without Christ. He reminded the Gentiles that they were grafted on the parent stock of the Jews, who were still God's chosen people, the children of the promise.

#### Reflection

We would probably go to confession to Peter sooner than to any of the other apostles. He is perhaps a more striking

example of the simple fact of holiness. Jesus says to us as he said, in effect, to Peter: "It is not you who have chosen me, but I who have chosen you. Peter, it is not human wisdom that makes it possible for you to believe, but my Father's revelation. I, not you, build my Church." Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic, and courageous ambassadors of Christ the Church has ever had. But persecution, humiliation, and weakness became his day-by-day carrying of the cross, material for further transformation. The dying Christ was in him; the living Christ was his life.








