Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) July 10th 2022 Dt 30: 10-14 / Os 69: 14,17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37 / Col 1:15-20 / Lk 10:25-37

As we know, in every Gospel passage there is often a key word, or several key words, that reveal the inner meaning of the story. In today's passage, I would say the key words would be the following: "do," "love," and "eternal life".

The parable speaks for itself. Whereas the Samaritan showed concern for the wounded man and did something about it, the other two men failed to do anything. How could they justify this? There are at least two reasons. First, we presume that they were both scholarly men, knowledgeable in the law. This means that they were very aware of the commandment to love their neighbor, as written in the Book of Leviticus. (Lev. 19:18) However, this commandment had been so watered down during the years that it came to mean that they only had a duty to love other Jews, while ignoring everyone else. Secondly, they failed to connect this law with the command to love God with all their heart and soul. (Dt. 6:5) Thus the priest and Levite could feel that worshipping God in the Temple and, subsequently, ignoring their neighbor's needs was excusable.

However, for Jesus, it was inexcusable; the two commandments cannot be separated. One cannot love God without loving one's neighbors. The two commandments must go hand in hand.

In the parable, Jesus especially points out the need for compassion- not only the desire to help others, but the more difficult "doing-something- for-others, going so far as to treat the other person as an extension of one's self. That is what Jesus said to the lawyer who asked him, "What must I do to inherit everlasting life?" Let us repeat the words with which Jesus answered the lawyer's question. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

In the end we will be judged not on the number of prayers we memorize or our mere profession of faith n Jesus. The heart of real faith and real worship lies in how we live our love of God in our concrete expressions of love to our neighbors. With the story of the good Samaritan, who showed pity and compassion, Jesus tells us that if we want to have eternal life, we must go and do the same.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God's plan for human love and sexuality is good news and calls married couples to live with Christ-like love in sacramental marriage. While this call to authentic love is free, total, faithful and fruitful, the desire and need to manage human fertility remains part of the human experience. In response, the Church proposes Natural Family Planning (NFP) as a modern, scientific method available to couples for planning their families by enabling them to participate in God's creative action without breaking the inseparable link between the unitive and procreative meanings of the conjugal (marital) act. As NFP becomes a way of life, the couple cooperates with each other and God in responsibly planning their family without the devastating spiritual and physical harm caused by artificial contraceptive methods.

Each year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) sponsors a national educational campaign called Natural Family Planning Awareness week, to highlight the good news about God's perfect plan for human love and sexuality. This year, Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness week will be observed from July 24 through July 30 with the theme: Called to the Joy of Love, Natural Family Planning, Supporting God's gifts of love and life in marriage.

During this week, we also observe the anniversary of Pope Paul VI's papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* (July 25) that articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love, and responsible parenthood. This week also marks the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Mother and grandparents of her Son Jesus. Pope Francis has also designated that feast as World Grandparents' Day, a fitting commemoration during National NFP Awareness Week to highlight the importance of family and the wonderful blessing of children in our lives.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate those married couples who live out their marriage commitment to free, total, faithful and fruitful love. I encourage all married couples and those preparing for marriage to reflect on their current or future marriages and how they can authentically and responsibly fulfill their commitment to fruitful love. Saint Bonaventure's Story

Perhaps not a household name for most people, Saint Bonaventure, nevertheless, played an important role in both the medieval Church and the history of the Franciscan Order. A senior faculty member at the University of Paris, Saint Bonaventure certainly captured the hearts of his students through his academic skills and insights. But more importantly, he captured their hearts through his Franciscan love for Jesus and the Church. Like his model, Saint Francis, Jesus was the center of everything—his teaching, his administration, his writing, and his life. So much so, that he was given the title "Seraphic Doctor."

Born in Bagnoregio in 1221, Saint Bonaventure was baptized John, but received the name Bonaventure when he became a Franciscan at the age of 22. Little is known about his childhood, but we do know that his parents were Giovanni di Fidanza and Maria Ritell. It seems that his father was a physician and a man of means. While Saint Francis died about five years after the saint's birth, he is credited with healing Bonaventure as a boy of a serious illness.

Saint Bonaventure's teaching career came to a halt when the Friars elected him to serve as their General Minister. His 17 years of service were not easy as the Order was embroiled in conflicts over the interpretation of poverty. Some friars even ended up in heresy saying that Saint Francis and his community were inaugurating the era of the Holy Spirit which was to replace Jesus, the Church, and Scripture. But because he was a man of prayer and a good administrator, Saint Bonaventure managed to structure the Order through effective legislation. But more importantly, he offered the Friars an organized spirituality based on the vision and insights of Saint Francis. Always a Franciscan at heart and a mystical writer, Bonaventure managed to unite the pastoral, practical aspects of life with the doctrines of the Church. Thus, there is a noticeable warmth to his teachings and writings that make him very appealing.


Shortly before he ended his service as General Minister, Pope Gregory X created him a Cardinal

and appointed him bishop of Albano. But a little over a year later, while participating in the Second Council of Lyon, Saint Bonaventure died suddenly on July 15, 1274. There is a theory that he was poisoned.

Saint Bonaventure left behind a structured and renewed Franciscan Order and a body of work all of which glorifies his major love—Jesus.

Reflection

Bonaventure so united holiness and theological knowledge that he rose to the heights of mysticism while remaining a very active preacher and teacher, one beloved by all who met him. To know him was to love him; to read him is still for us today to meet a true Franciscan and a gentleman.






