

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 7th, 2022 Wis 18: 6-9 / Ps 33: 1, 12, 18-22 / Heb 11: 1-2, 8-19 / Lk 12: 32-48

Whenever I think of St. Paul, several words immediately come to mind: tough, active, hard working, knowledgeable, loving ... But, as we know, there is still another side to his personality: the value he put on prayer. In his Letter to the Thessalonians, he writes: "Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God" (1 Th. 5:17-18). He tells the community there that he always prays for them. (2 Th. 1:11) In his Letter to the Romans, he speaks about how the Holy Spirit helps us to pray properly. (Rm. 8:26) Clearly, Paul was a man of deep prayer. Today's Gospel also alludes to the need for constant prayer.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples, "Let your belts be fastened around your waists and your lamps be burning ready. Be like men awaiting their master's return from a wedding, so that when he arrives and knocks, you will open for him without delay." Let us reflect on the implication of these words for a short time.

Several months ago, I saw a very impressive video about Fr. Maximilian Kolbe. As is well-known, Fr. Kolbe was captured by the Nazis and put into the concentration camp at Auschwitz. One day, when a prisoner escaped from the camp, the Nazi commander ordered everyone in the camp to stand before him. Then, at random, he selected ten men and sentenced them to death. That would be a warning: if anyone else should escape, ten others would die. After the men were selected, one of them begged the commander not to condemn him, since he had a wife and several young children. Hearing this, Fr. Kolbe volunteered to take the man's place. The commander agreed, and so Fr. Kolbe joined the others who had been selected.

In the last part of the video, Fr. Kolbe is with the prisoners in a small cell. All of them are growing weaker because of starvation. However, to strengthen their faith, they all say the rosary over and over, trying desperately to focus their attention on God and die in peace. Eventually, one by one, they pass away.

In the parable for today, Jesus speaks about the need for watchfulness. "You know as well as I," he says,

"that if the head of the house knew when the thief was coming, he would not let him break into his house.

This is why prayer is so important. We thank God in our prayers for His countless blessings, and we praise Him by offering Him our heart. But at the same time, in prayer we prepare ourselves for whatever may happen in our life. Let us pray for the wisdom to realize this deep in our heart.


The Diocese strongly recommends these courses for the faithful, especially those serving in liturgical, educational, and spiritual ministries.

Saint Dominic's Story

If he hadn't taken a trip with his bishop, Dominic would probably have remained within the structure of contemplative life; after the trip, he spent the rest of his life being a contemplative in active apostolic work.

Born in old Castile, Spain, Dominic was trained for the priesthood by a priest-uncle, studied the arts and theology, and became a canon of the cathedral at Osma, where there was an attempt to revive the apostolic common life described in *Acts of the Apostles*.

On a journey through France with his bishop, Dominic came face to face with the then virulent Albigensian heresy at Languedoc. The Albigensians-or Cathari, "the pure ones"-held to two principles—one good, one evil—in the world. All matter is evil—hence they denied the Incarnation and the sacraments. On the same principle, they abstained from procreation and took a minimum of food and drink. The inner circle led what some people regarded as a heroic life of purity and asceticism not shared by ordinary followers.

Dominic sensed the need for the Church to combat this heresy, and was commissioned to be part of the preaching crusade against it. He saw immediately why the preaching crusade was not succeeding: the ordinary people admired and followed the ascetical heroes of the Albigenses. Understandably, they were not impressed by the Catholic preachers who traveled with horse and retinues, stayed at the best inns and had servants. Dominic therefore, with three Cistercians, began itinerant preaching according to the gospel ideal. He continued this work for 10 years, being successful with the ordinary people but not with the leaders.

His fellow preachers gradually became a community, and in 1215 Dominic founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans.

Dominic's ideal, and that of his Order, was to organically link a life with God, study, and prayer in all forms, with a ministry of salvation to people by the word of God. His ideal: *contemplata tradere*: "to pass on the fruits of contemplation" or "to speak only of God or with God."

Reflection

The Dominican ideal, like that of all religious communities, is for the imitation, not merely the admiration, of the rest of the Church. The effective combining of contemplation and activity is the vocation of truck driver Smith as well as theologian Aquinas. Acquired contemplation is the tranquil abiding in the presence of God, and is an integral part of any full human life. It must be the wellspring of all Christian activity.
