

## Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time August 21st, 2022 Is 66: 18-21 / Ps 117: 1-2 / Heb 12: 5-7, 11-13 / Lk 13: 22-30

My dear friends, there's a tendency to be exasperated when things seem to turn from bad to worse. We have our dreams of a perfect society and yet we ask: "Why is it that there's so much evil? Why is it that God is not doing something about it? What is the use of our religion when somehow it has not really influenced the culture of society? Why suffer for others? What good is it to be a Christian when you are at the losing end."

Perhaps our idea of the mission of the Church is that it produces immediate and quantitative results in people and society. We may think that Christianity is to yield fast and visible changes. Unfortunately, this is not the case, and we tend to be frustrated.

Let us remember that Abraham, Job, Elijah and many others were tested by God not for themselves alone, but as an example for others to edify: their faith, hope and trust in God even in the darkest hours of their lives. The perfect example is Christ our Lord, whose life and death was not for himself but for others. He represented and compensated before God what humanity failed to do. In his sacrifice and suffering, he reconciled us before God his Father.

In the same manner, the disciples of Christ are expected to continue the act of representation of Christ before God in their love and service not only for themselves, but in behalf of the many others who are unable to do so. Our coming to Mass, for instance, is not only for us and our family, but for the people who are not offering praise and thanksgiving to God this Sunday. Parents praying for their children, a group of individuals sacrificing for the conversion of people, or even a person who suffers for others have representational value before God.

St. Monica prayed for the conversion of her husband and son. God answered her prayers not for herself, but for her husband and son on account of her representation for them. St. John Vianney prayed for the conversion of his worldly parishioners, and God listened to his prayers offered to God in behalf of his people. St. Therese of Lisieux offered constantly her everyday sacrifices for the success of the missions and the conversion of sinners.

When we are honest and kind to the people in our place of work when many others are not, when we are saying our grace before meals in restaurants while it may be embarrassing because many others are not doing that, when we put ourselves in the trust of God in spite of our trials when others falter, there is value in doing them because we are representing before God what others have failed to do.

"Enter the narrow door," Christ tells us in our Gospel reading. St. Paul advised in our second reading to "bear(s) fruit in peace and goodness" through our suffering. The representations we will do will invite hardships, pains and even ridicule from people. But to be really free consists not in being affected by the criticisms of others, but in committing ourselves to the will of God, who is our ultimate Judge.

Christ refers to himself as the Vine, the Gate, the Door. Yes, he said too that he is "the Way."

The poet Robert Frost in his poem 'The Road Not Taken' wrote: "Two roads diverged in a wood, and I - I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference."

We travel the road of life. We make Christ the Way of our life. It is a way less traveled by. May we make a difference and yes, enter the narrow door.



## Saint Pope Pius X's Story

Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children.

The second of 10 children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto became Pius X at age 68. He was one of the 20th century's greatest popes.

Ever mindful of his humble origin, Pope Pius stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor." He was embarrassed by some of the pomp of the papal court. "Look how they have dressed me up," he said in tears to an old friend. To another, "It is a penance to be forced to accept all these practices. They lead me around surrounded by soldiers like Jesus when he was seized in Gethsemani."

Interested in politics, Pope Pius encouraged Italian Catholics to become more politically involved. One of his first papal acts was to end the supposed right of governments to interfere by veto in papal elections—a practice that reduced the freedom of the 1903 conclave which had elected him.

In 1905, when France renounced its agreement with the Holy See and threatened confiscation of Church property if governmental control of Church affairs were not granted, Pius X courageously rejected the demand.

While he did not author a famous social encyclical as his predecessor had done, he denounced the ill treatment of indigenous peoples on the plantations of Peru, sent a relief commission to Messina after an earthquake, and sheltered refugees at his own expense.

On the 11th anniversary of his election as pope, Europe was plunged into World War I. Pius had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me. I would gladly give my life to save my poor children from this ghastly scourge." He died a few weeks after the war began, and was canonized in 1954.

#### Reflection

His humble background was no obstacle in relating to a personal God and to people whom he loved genuinely. Pius X gained his strength, his gentleness and warmth for people from the source of all gifts, the Spirit of Jesus. In contrast, we often feel embarrassed by our backgrounds. Shame makes us prefer to remain aloof from people whom we perceive as superior. If we are in a superior position, on the other hand, we often ignore simpler people. Yet we, too, have to help "restore all things in Christ," especially the wounded people of God.






