

SIR 3:17-18,20,28-29 | PS 68:4-7, 10-11 | HEB 12:18-19, 22-24A | LK 14:1, 7-14

Our Lord teaches us in our Gospel reading today two instances whereby we learn the absurdity of pride and the need for the virtue of humility.

When he observed that the invited guests at a wedding banquet were competing with each other in getting the first seats, he took the occasion of instructing them: pride has no place in the kingdom of God. This means avoiding attitudes of self-importance and of superiority to others.

People like the Pharisees and scribes have a distorted sense and estimation of their goodness. They assure themselves of the right to special places of honor in heaven compared to others. The Pharisees and scribes thought that they are not only the children of Abraham, but that they can likewise appease God with their theatrical goodness done in the spirit of impressing people and the desire to receive praises. In real terms, however, their hearts are full of evil desires and wickedness.

The model of humility is Christ who became the servant among the servants. Although he is king, he came "not to be served but to serve and to give his life to redeem many" (Mt. 20-28). St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians declared: though being divine in nature, he did not cling to his equality with God, but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave ... He humbled himself by being obedient to death, death on the cross... That is why God exalted him and gave him a name above all other names..." (2:6-11). If this fundamental lesson of humility becomes the cornerstone of all our actions, we will have no difficulty in understanding others. Conversion ... Repentance ... Obedience ... Compassion .. Service ... Forgiveness are consequential fruits of such humility of the heart.

And yes, true giving. The charity of a humble person stems from an uncontrollable outflow of love. We give not out of our selfish interest, not out of our feeling of superiority nor to pander the acclamations of men, but in imitation of the generosity of God. Men must give from a grateful heart aware that they have nothing that they have that they have not received from God.

St. Paul reminds us: "You know well the generosity of Christ Jesus, our Lord. Although he was rich, he made himself poor to make you rich through his poverty" (2 Cor. 8:9).

Indeed, Christ said in our Gospel today, "Everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled and he who humbles himself shall be exalted." For us who aspire to be included "in the resurrection of the just," let us strive to make this paradox of the kingdom the underlying principle of our life.





SAINT AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO FEAST DAY: AUGUST 28

A Christian at 33, a priest at 36, a bishop at 41: Many people are familiar with the biographical sketch of Augustine of Hippo, sinner turned saint. But to get to really know the man is a rewarding experience.

There quickly surfaces the intensity with which he lived his life, whether his path led away from or toward God. The tears of his mother, the instructions of Ambrose and, most of all, God himself speaking to him in the Scriptures, redirected Augustine's love of life to a life of love.

Having been so deeply immersed in creaturepride of life in his early days and having drunk deeply of its bitter dregs, it is not surprising that Augustine should have turned, with a holy fierceness, against the many demon-thrusts rampant in his day. His times were truly decadent: politically, socially, morally. He was both feared and loved, like the Master. The perennial criticism leveled against him: a fundamental rigorism.

In his day, Augustine providentially fulfilled the office of prophet. Like Jeremiah and other greats, he was hard-pressed but could not keep quiet. "I say to myself, I will not mention him/I will speak in his name no more/But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart/imprisoned in my bones/I grow weary holding it in/I cannot endure it" (Jeremiah 20:9).

Reflection

Augustine is still acclaimed and condemned in our day. He is a prophet for today, trumpeting the need to scrap escapisms and stand face-to-face with personal responsibility and dignity.
