IS 50:5-9A | PS 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 | JAS 2:14-18 | MK 8:27-35

The world in which we live is filled with lost sons and daughters, full of lost men and women.

The prodigal son had also undergone such a miserable state, He left his father and took with him his inheritance. He wanted to be free of parental control, away from all restraints. But he soon was lost when he squandered his money on booze and women, with good weather friends who left him when he got broke. He was hungry and alone. He was reduced to the state of a slave herding pigs. He remembered his father as the young man in our opening story remembered God, He resolved to himself, "I will break away and return to my father."

The father welcomed his lost son with open arms, He restored his dignity by putting back his identity as a son, The father's love healed his alienation and forgave his past indiscretions, His son's actual repentance and conversion would correct the future, What was paramount was the joy of finding his son again.

The older brother resented his father's acceptance of his younger brother. He spent many years working hard and he was faithful to his father. He accused his father of grave injustice, He believed that his relationship with his father was based on merit and reward, He must have complained: "My brother had his chance. He spoiled it. Let him rot in hell." He must presumed that he had earned his sonship while the younger son did not. His rigid morality made him childish and selfish.

The Gospel reading teaches us the seeking love of God. Men may give up hope on sinners, but God will always search out for them. Nobody is unimportant in the eyes of God. By human standards, we have the tendency to a more biased attention to the majority over the minority. Even as God loves those people who never stray, there is a joy in his heart when a lost one has been found. Even if the lost sheep constitutes only one percent of the total number, he goes out to look for him. For God, every person is worth looking for, every one of us is worth loving, every individual is worth saving.

St. Paul in the second reading declares, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." He came to seek those who are away from his Father. He shed his blood not only for some, but for all.

We are that lost sheep, that lost coin and that lost brother. Our Lord is inviting us to return home, to get out from our misery of sin and guilt. Our faults will not be held against us. Through him, we will be reconciled to our Father who is waiting for us to finally come home.

We, too, are called upon to be searchers of our brothers. In our own time we see many people in trouble, people who are lost, people who need forgiveness, people who need healing, people who need a place to call home. In the same measure that God has forgiven us, may it be that we can also learn to forgive and receive those people who need our mercy. May we have the joy of a forgiven person as well as the joy of a person who was able to forgive. Hopefully, we can rejoice together with the Father by being one in our brotherhood as a family of God.

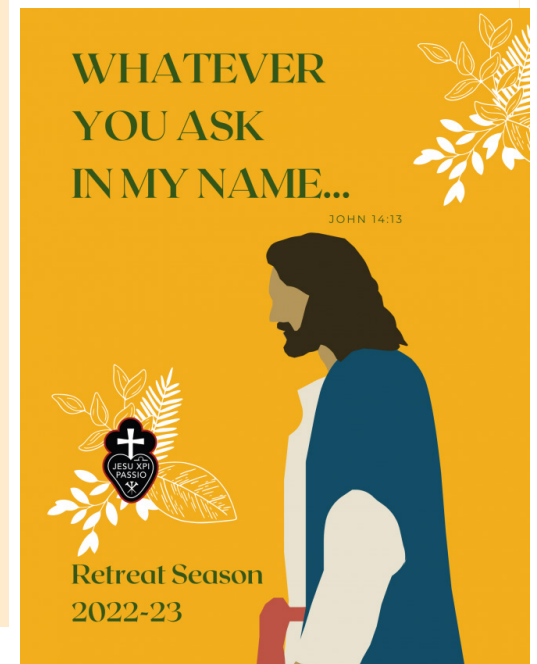
WOMEN'S RETREAT

SAINT CORNELIUS

FEAST DAY: SPETEMBER 16

There was no pope for 14 months after the martyrdom of Saint Fabian because of the intensity of the persecution of the Church. During the interval, the Church was governed by a college of priests. Saint Cyprian, a friend of Cornelius, writes that Cornelius was elected pope “by the judgment of God and of Christ, by the testimony of most of the clergy, by the vote of the people, with the consent of aged priests and of good men.”

The greatest problem of Cornelius’s two-year term as pope had to do with the Sacrament of Penance and centered on the readmission of Christians who had denied their faith during the time of persecution. Two extremes were finally both condemned. Cyprian, primate of North Africa, appealed to the pope to confirm his stand that the relapsed could be reconciled only by the decision of the bishop.

In Rome, however, Cornelius met with the opposite view. After his election, a priest named Novatian (one of those who had governed the Church) had himself consecrated a rival bishop of Rome—one of the first antipopes. He denied that the Church had any power to reconcile not only the apostates, but also those guilty of murder, adultery, fornication, or second marriage! Cornelius had the support of most of the Church (especially of Cyprian of Africa) in condemning Novatianism, though the sect persisted for several centuries. Cornelius held a synod at Rome in 251 and ordered the “relapsed” to be restored to the Church with the usual “medicines of repentance.”

The friendship of Cornelius and Cyprian was strained for a time when one of Cyprian’s rivals made accusations about him. But the problem was cleared up.

A document from Cornelius shows the extent of organization in the Church of Rome in the mid-third century: 46 priests, seven deacons, seven subdeacons. It is estimated that the number of Christians totaled about 50,000. He died as a result of the hardships of his exile in what is now Civitavecchia.

Reflection

It seems fairly true to say that almost every possible false doctrine has been proposed at some time or other in the history of the Church. The third century saw the resolution of a problem we scarcely consider—the penance to be done before reconciliation with the Church after mortal sin. Men like Cornelius and Cyprian were God’s instruments in helping the Church find a prudent path between extremes of rigorism and laxity. They are part of the Church’s ever-living stream of tradition, ensuring the continuance of what was begun by Christ, and evaluating new experiences through the wisdom and experience of those who have gone before.
