There is a true story of a hotel receptionist who was manning the front desk one stormy night. As the rain fell in torrents and the wind blew hard, a couple arrived at the hotel to ask for a room. The receptionist politely said, "I'm sorry, but all the rooms in this hotel are taken. However, I don't want to drive you away in this turbulent weather. If you don't mind, I'm offering my quarters in the basement. It is not as comfortable, but you can take refuge there tonight."

After one month, the receptionist got an unexpected long-distance call. It was from the man whom he had accommodated in his quarters. The man on the line made a surprising offer to him. He said,

"I am making you the manager of one of my hotels. If you have been trustworthy in your job as a receptionist, I'm sure you will do as well as a manager."

The receptionist turned manager reportedly established the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York, one of the most famous and prestigious hotels in the world.

The story reveals the truth of the Gospel reading today: "If you can trust a man in little things, you can also trust him in great ones" (Lk. 16:10). To be faithful in doing the small responsibilities is the best proof of our fitness to be entrusted with a bigger task. No man will be promoted to a higher position unless he has proven his capability and integrity first in his small position. It is unlikely that one is given a great responsibility when one has been found incompetent in small ones.

Jesus extends this principle to eternity. If on this earth, we have to be faithful in our ordinary obligations to be raised to a higher office so then in order to earn heaven, we have to be trustworthy in our duties on earth. We are stewards in this world. We are in charge of things, so to speak, that are lent to us by God. Only if we can discharge wisely our duties and take proper care of the things of which we are only stewards shall we be deserving of the reward of eternal life.

Strictly speaking, our material possessions do not really belong to us. They belong to God. Their true value does not lie in the fact that we are keeping them, but in our using them toward the real treasure that shall last forever. The paradox of the kingdom is that what we have is not our real treasure, but what we gave away. The permanent lesson remains: if we are truly wise, we will build on things which we cannot lose. Our real treasures are not in things, but in God. If we set our hearts on this world we may lose sight of the world beyond this world. If our efforts are fixed on eternity, we will not be attached to the things of this world.

Jesus said, "No servant can serve two masters." If a man decides to serve the Lord, it means every moment of time and every ounce of energy are dedicated to God. It is a full-time arrangement. Serving God cannot be a part-time affair. Seeking the kingdom cannot be a spare-time job.


WOMEN'S RETREAT



SAINT JANUARIUS' STORY

FEAST DAY: SPETEMBER 19

Little is known about the life of Januarius. He is believed to have been martyred in the Emperor Diocletian's persecution of 305. Legend has it that Januarius and his companions were thrown to the bears in the amphitheater of Pozzuoli, but the animals failed to attack them. They were then beheaded, and Januarius' blood ultimately brought to Naples.

"A dark mass that half fills a hermetically sealed four-inch glass container, and is preserved in a double reliquary in the Naples cathedral as the blood of St. Januarius, liquefies 18 times during the year...Various experiments have been applied, but the phenomenon eludes natural explanation...."




