

We may have the impression that Christianity consists only of prohibitions. We are taught that "we should not do to others what we would not have them do to us." It is never difficult to follow this rule. How? By simple inaction. Many people may claim that they are not bad at all because they have not been cruel to anybody, they have not injured others, they have not been unjust, and they have not stolen from anyone. Yes, they are not bad. But the real question is: are they good?


We can be good not by merely avoiding the doing of bad things, but by doing good deeds. Christ said: "Do to others whatever you would that others do to you" (Mt. 7:12). This positive rule compels us not only to evade things or actions but to go out of our way to help others. We try to forgive as we wish to be forgiven, to understand as we wish to be understood, to help as we wish to be helped always, to love as we wish to be loved.

We might fulfill all that is required by the law, but we can only truly follow Christ by acting on the demands of love.
As St. Augustine would say, "Love and do what you like."

What brought the rich man to hell was not what he did but what he did not do. He saw Lazarus in pain, and hungry, and there was no love that pierced his heart. Christ said: "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted" (Mt. 5:4). This beatitude does mean: blessed is the man who responds with love to the sufferings and the needs of others. Clearly, the rich man was indifferent, and he was not given comfort on his death. He who was not moved with compassion for his fellowmen was judged without mercy.

You may have heard the story of a rich man who did not receive a mansion in heaven. He complained to St. Peter: "This is unfair. I was living in a huge house during my earthly life, and you provide me here with a shanty even smaller than my dog's house." St. Peter replied: "I'm sorry. Don't blame us. That little and shaky hut is the only thing we could build out of the materials you sent us here."

We have learned another paradox of the kingdom: the poor will become rich before God; the selfish will lose everything. Our attitude towards wealth and the needs of others in this life can make or unmake our destiny when we die. Indeed, the kingdom of God is at hand!



# SAINT THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX'S STORY

### **FEAST DAY: OCTOBER 1**

"I prefer the monotony of obscure sacrifice to all ecstasies. To pick up a pin for love can convert a soul."

These are the words of Thérèse of Lisieux, a Carmelite nun called the "Little Flower," who lived a cloistered life of obscurity in the convent of Lisieux, France. And her preference for hidden sacrifice did indeed convert souls. Few saints of God are more popular than this young nun. Her autobiography, The Story of a Soul, is read and loved throughout the world. Thérèse Martin entered the convent at the age of 15 and died in 1897 at the age of 24. Life in a Carmelite convent is indeed uneventful and consists mainly of prayer and hard domestic work. But Thérèse possessed that holy insight that redeems the time, however dull that time may be. She saw in quiet suffering a redemptive suffering, suffering that was indeed her apostolate. Thérèse said she came to the Carmel convent "to save souls and pray for priests." And shortly before she died, she wrote: "I want to spend my heaven doing good on earth."

Thérèse was canonized in 1925. On October 19, 1997, Pope John Paul II proclaimed her a Doctor of the Church, the third woman to be so recognized in light of her holiness and the influence of her teaching on spirituality in the Church. Her parents, Louis and Zélie, were beatified in 2008 and canonized in 2015.

### Reflection

Thérèse has much to teach our age of the image, the appearance, the "self." We have become a dangerously self-conscious people, painfully aware of the need to be fulfilled, yet knowing we are not. Thérèse, like so many saints, sought to serve others, to do something outside herself, to forget herself in quiet acts of love. She is one of the great examples of the gospel paradox that we gain our life by losing it, and that the seed that falls to the ground must die in order to live.


Preoccupation with self separates modern men and women from God, from their fellow human beings, and ultimately from themselves. We must re-learn to forget ourselves, to contemplate a God who draws us out of ourselves, and to serve others as the ultimate expression of selfhood. These are the insights of Saint Thérèse, and they are more valid today than ever.
