HB 1: 2-3, 2:2-4 | PS 95: 1-2, 6-9 | 2 TM 1: 6-8, 13-14 | LK 17: 5-10

This is also true with faith/ We should not be discouraged by our seemingly insignificant faith. No matter how small it is, it opens us to the possibilities that we have never dreamed of. Even things that may look impossible become possible if it is approached with faith.

A faith like the size of a mustard seed? In effect, Christ might be saying to us, "Why not?" With that faith, Christ said, "You could say to this sycamore, be uprooted and transplanted into the sea, and it would obey you.

We are wont to make excuses, not to try at all: we can't pray yet because we don't have enough faith, we can't be charitable because we are still selfish, we can't leave our sins and vices because we are still weak, we can't fully commit ourselves to Christ because we are not yet prepared. Jesus might be telling us, "Don't fool yourselves. A little faith can already work wonders. How can you expect to have a greater one if you don't try to begin with what you have?"

We are challenged to do our duties as servants of God by nurturing the gift of faith that he has given us. As we encounter difficulties and trials while performing our duties, there will be a gradual increase of our faith. Why?

This is because we realize more our helplessness in trusting in our own human powers and capacities. Thus, we will be able to trust more in God's power.

"The upright man will live by his faithfulness, the Lord tells us in the first reading. St. Paul in the second reading reminds us: "God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the spirit of power, love and self control ... Bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God. We are prone to discouragement. We acquit ourselves of any responsibility as we complain to God, "We don't have enough faith. Like the prophet Habakkuk, we murmur with impatience, "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen!"

We are called, however, to become faithful servants of Christ in our family, community and society. Notwithstanding our little acts of love and the absence of immediate results, the seeds of faith that we planted may slowly bring forth God's glory and God's kingdom. God is not demanding from us spectacular achievements, but fidelity to Him; not passive waiting doing nothing, but the active participation of doing what we have been commanded to do. Only then are we able to say, "We are useless servants. We have done no more than our duty."

After all, we are useless, not for nothing, but for something. Yes, for someone.

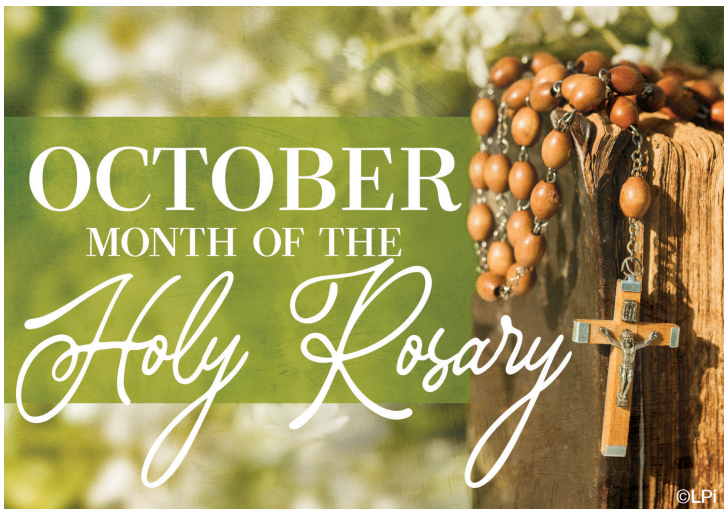

## LETTER FROM THE BISHOP

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

On this Respect Life Sunday, October 2, at the beginning of the annual Respect Life Program entitled, Called to Serve Moms in Need, we have much to be grateful for regarding the positive advances in the acknowledgment of respect for life within our culture and nation. The Supreme Court decision of June 24, 2022, was a watershed moment in reversing almost 50 years of legalized abortion within our nation through its tragic decision of Roe v. Wade. However, there is still so much more that continues to challenge us in regard to engendering a respect for the sacredness of human life from the moment of conception until natural death.

There is a need to continue, in a Christian and positive manner, to deal with the harsh opposition which has arisen against the recent Supreme Court decision. We must do all we can, through proper legal persuasion and prayer, to curtail state legislation permitting abortion. In keeping with this year's emphasis, Called to Serve Moms in Need, we need to continue to provide assistance and to walk with women who have found themselves in a difficult situation through a pregnancy, as well

as after the birth of their child. In the Diocese of Palm Beach, our Catholic Charities outreach excels in this mission as it continues to expand these services which we fully support.

Abortion is a foundational issue in regard to respect for life. However, it is not the only issue and does not in any manner lessen the emphasis that must be made regarding the respect for life on behalf of the person on death row, the elderly, the sick, the immigrant, and any person whose right to life and well-being are undermined in our culture today.

I wish to thank all of you, the faithful men and women of our Diocese, who are witnesses to life and continue to pray for and support laws and programs that respect life. You make a tremendous difference, and it is an inspiration to know you. May the Lord continue to bless you, your families and all your efforts. We all join together on this Respect Life Sunday in recommitting ourselves to the sanctity of life and to serving moms in need. With every prayerful wish, I am

## SAINT MARIA FAUSTINA KOWALSKA'S STORY

**FEAST DAY: OCTOBER 5**

Saint Faustina's name is forever linked to the annual feast of the Divine Mercy, the Divine Mercy chaplet, and the Divine Mercy prayer recited each day at 3 p.m. by many people.

Born in what is now west-central Poland, Helena Kowalska was the third of 10 children. She worked as a housekeeper in three cities before joining the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925. She worked as a cook, gardener and porter in three of their houses.

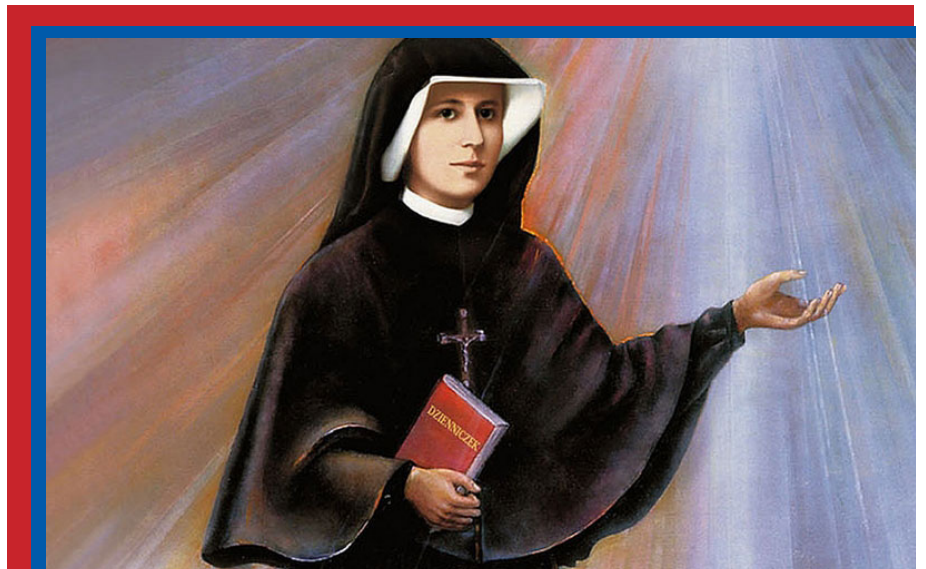
In addition to carrying out her work faithfully, generously serving the needs of the sisters and the local people, Sister Faustina also had a deep interior life. This included receiving revelations from the Lord Jesus, messages that she recorded in her diary at the request of Christ and of her confessors.

At a time when some Catholics had an image of God as such a strict judge that they might be tempted to despair about the possibility of being forgiven, Jesus chose to emphasize his mercy and forgiveness for sins acknowledged and confessed. "I do not want to punish aching mankind," he once told Saint Faustina, "but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart." The two rays emanating from Christ's heart, she said, represent the blood and water poured out after Jesus' death.

Because Sister Maria Faustina knew that the revelations she had already received did not constitute holiness itself, she wrote in her diary: "Neither graces, nor revelations, nor raptures, nor gifts granted to a soul make it perfect, but rather the intimate union of the soul with God. These gifts are merely ornaments of the soul, but constitute neither its essence nor its perfection. My sanctity and perfection consist in the close union of my will with the will of God." Sister Maria Faustina died of tuberculosis in Krakow, Poland, on October 5, 1938. Pope John Paul II beatified her in 1993, and canonized her seven years later.

### Reflection

Devotion to God's Divine Mercy bears some resemblance to devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In both cases, sinners are encouraged not to despair, not to doubt God's willingness to forgive them if they repent. As Psalm 136 says in each of its 26 verses, "God's love [mercy] endures forever."
