

2 KGS 5:14-17 | PS 98:1, 2-3, 3-4 | 2 TM 2:8-13 | LK 17:11-19

The gospel teaches us this striking lesson in gratitude. There were 10 lepers, nine Jews and one Samaritan Their leprosy did not only disfigure their bodies, it also caused them to be banished from their community. In the Middle Ages, if a man became a leper, the priest would bring the man to the church, and perform the burial service on him. The leper is considered a dead man.

Out of their common misery and common need for each other, the ten lepers were together on their way to death. However, they saw Christ from a distance, and in their desperation, they shouted in unison: "Jesus! Master! Take pity on us." Christ healed their leprosy.

However, only one returned to Jesus to give thanks, and he was a foreigner, a Samaritan. When the nine got what they wanted, they never came back. Ingratitude is so ignoble that Christ, even though he was selfless, could not ignore it. He said: "The other nine, where are they?" The very ones who prided themselves as the chosen ones were those who failed to take God's favors with gratitude.

We are often proud of our importance that we take everything given to us as if it were our due. Our hearts may be blinded that we do not remember the many undeserved favors we received from others. Particularly, we are often ungrateful to our parents. There were years when we were completely dependent on them. Yet when we could already stand on our own, it happens that we neglect them, especially in their old age. Some people may even consider their parents as a nuisance, a burden, an affliction to carry.

Not only are we ungrateful to our fellow humans, but oftentimes, we are lacking in gratitude to God. We may think that since God created us, he owes it to us to give us everything we need. We may also assume that what we have is purely earned from our own efforts and good fortune. God grants us our provisions, not because he is in any way compelled to do so, but out of the abundance of his love and goodness.

Our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist, a sacrifice of thanksgiving. It is derived from a Greek word signifying thanksgiving. Developing the virtue of gratitude begins with our authentic appreciation of the value of the Eucharist. Christ, God and man, is the one mediating between us and his Father that we may pray, "Father, it is our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ" (Preface of the Mass).

We were once like the lepers on our way to death, but Christ healed us with his love. Let us remain in communion as one people in our way to eternal life, thanking God's infinite mercy in this Mass of his Son, our Savior.

SAINT TERESA OF AVILA'S STORY

FEAST DAY: OCTOBER 15

Teresa lived in an age of exploration as well as political, social, and religious upheaval. It was the 16th century, a time of turmoil and reform. She was born before the Protestant Reformation and died almost 20 years after the closing of the Council of Trent.

The gift of God to Teresa in and through which she became holy and left her mark on the Church and the world is threefold: She was a woman; she was a contemplative; she was an active reformer.

As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She was "her own woman," entering the Carmelites despite strong opposition from her father. She is a person wrapped not so much in silence as in mystery. Beautiful, talented, outgoing, adaptable, affectionate, courageous, enthusiastic, she was totally human. Like Jesus, she was a mystery of paradoxes: wise, yet practical; intelligent, yet much in tune with her experience; a mystic, yet an energetic reformer; a holy woman, a womanly woman. Teresa was a woman "for God," a woman of prayer, discipline, and compassion. Her heart belonged to God. Her ongoing conversion was an arduous lifelong struggle, involving ongoing purification and suffering. She was misunderstood, misjudged, and opposed in her efforts at reform. Yet she struggled on, courageous and faithful; she struggled with her own mediocrity, her illness, her opposition. And in the midst of all this she clung to God in life and in prayer. Her writings on prayer and contemplation are drawn from her experience:

powerful, practical, and graceful. She was a woman of prayer; a woman for God.

Teresa was a woman "for others." Though a contemplative, she spent much of her time and energy seeking to reform herself and the Carmelites, to lead them back to the full observance of the primitive Rule. She founded over a half-dozen new monasteries. She traveled, wrote, fought—always to renew, to reform. In her self, in her prayer, in her life, in her efforts to reform, in all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life.

Her writings, especially the Way of Perfection and The Interior Castle, have helped generations of believers.

In 1970, the Church gave her the title she had long held in the popular mind: Doctor of the Church. She and St. Catherine of Siena were the first women so honored.

Reflection

Ours is a time of turmoil, a time of reform, and a time of liberation. Modern women have in Teresa a challenging example. Promoters of renewal, promoters of prayer, all have in Teresa a woman to reckon with, one whom they can admire and imitate.

MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP

At this time, we join in prayer for all those in Florida, as well as in other areas, so adversely affected by Hurricane Ian. Direct assistance can be offered through Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Palm Beach or Catholic Charities USA as found on our Diocesan website. A great deal of the damage and loss cannot even be determined at this time, and many will rely upon our prayers and generosity, both now and for the long recovery ahead. We pray for our brothers and sisters so adversely affected, for those who have lost their lives, and we also give thanks for the safety we have experienced in southern Florida at this time. While we do not believe that God causes such catastrophes, it is always faith and prayer that enables us to deal with them. Like the disciples caught with the Lord in a storm, we cry out, "Who then is this whom even the wind and sea obey" (Mk 4:41)?"
