# TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

04 EMMANUEL CATHOLIC CHURCH

**OCTOBER 16, 2022**

EX 17:8-13 | PS 121:1-8 | 2 TM 3:14-4:2 | LK 18:1-8

The widow in the parable of our Gospel today is also a symbol of a defenseless person, without support of any kind. But she had one important quality of a person in need - persistence. She was relentless in her request that she may be given her rights against her opponent. Even if the judge was corrupt, he had to give in to the widow's perseverance; he granted her demand.

Jesus is teaching us a lesson: "If that judge who did not fear God nor respect men was able to grant the request of the widow because of her sheer determination, how much more will God readily answer the fervent prayers of his children?" We must remember that God is not a stern God nor a grudging one. We don't have to twist his arms, so to speak, so that he would give the things we ask from him. A person hardly hears two people talking to him at the same time, but God can hear us even if we all call on him simultaneously. People get annoyed by the constant requests of their friends, but God loves a person even more when he incessantly asks God for whatever he needs all the time.

When we are asking something from God, Jesus teaches us to use the present imperative language. In the Gospel of Matthew, for instance, he said: "Keep on asking, and it will be given to you; keep on seeking, and you will find; keep on knocking, and it will be opened to you" (7:7). This means we must persist in prayer. Let us not give up nor be discouraged. Clearly then lies the test of our sincerity: to be able to pray for something unceasingly with humility and perseverance.

St. Monica prayed for over twenty years for the conversion of her husband and son, Augustine. Her persistence bore fruit, her prayers were heard by the Lord.

If in any event our prayers are not granted in the way We want, it is not that God refuses to give what we ask. He who knows everything may have something better for us. No loving father will give a can of poison to his child simply because he asked for it. No sane parents would hand a gun or a knife to their child simply because he thinks it is a toy to play with.

Our prayers are always answered. If God gives a negative answer, he surely has his reasons. We therefore pray, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." For even the seeming refusal is the answer of the wisdom of God and the love he has for us, as our Father.

In conclusion, I want to share with you a prayer that was found in a pocket of a dead soldier.

I asked for health that I might achieve,  
God made me weak that I might obey.

I asked for riches that I might be happy,  
God gave me poverty that I may be wise.

I asked for strength to do greater things,  
God gave me infirmity that I might  
do better things.

I asked for power that I might win  
the praise of men,  
God sent me weakness that I might feel  
the need of God.

I asked for all things that I might enjoy life,  
God gave me life that I might enjoy all things.

I received nothing that I asked for.  
Yet much more than I hope for.

My prayers were answered.  
I am the most blessed of all men.

## SAINT LUKE'S STORY

**FEAST DAY: OCTOBER 18**

Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy
- 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation
- 3) The Gospel of the Poor
- 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation
- 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit
- 6) The Gospel of Joy

### **Reflection**

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians. His Gospel and Acts of the Apostles reveal his expertise in classic Greek style as well as his knowledge of Jewish sources. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works. The treasure of the Scriptures is a true gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church.




