

SIR 35:12-14, 16-18 | PS 34:2-3, 17-19, 23 | 2 TM 4:6-8, 16-18 | LK 18:1-8

Competition may be healthy exercise in the business world. This is particularly true in enterprises dealing with products and services. Companies will lock horns against one another in producing better products and this can result in cheaper and superior commodities. Firms will outvie one another in providing fast and effective deliveries, and this can facilitate prompt and competent service. The consumers, the endusers, will definitely benefit from such corporate rivalries. The opposite, however, happens in the spiritual realm when people start competing and comparing with one another. Anyone who boasts of himself before God about his goodness, while at the same time looks with contempt on others, becomes blinded. It makes a person fall into a trap of seeing only his good works and judging others on their shortcomings.

This is what happened to the Pharisee in our Gospel reading today. He felt his perfection before God as he prayed in the temple. He used God as a jumping board for his own glory and took the credit to himself for being worthy of praise. He did not really pray for he did not ask for anything from God.) He was a person who was wrapped up in his own self-image and distorted perception of righteousness.

Nobody can really say a true prayer to God with such arrogance and pride. We cannot be truly good by our own efforts. It is only through the gift of God's grace that we can respond to the possibility of doing authentic goodness. It is on our bended knees that we can admit with humility that we have our many failings and realize that we always need God's mercy.

If we despise others, when we think we are superior to them,

there is the danger that we envy them when we cannot get ahead of them.

St. Paul the Apostle said: "How could I venture to equate or compare myself with people who proclaim their own merits? Fools! They measure themselves with their own measure and compare themselves with themselves. As for me, I will not boast beyond measure, for I will not go past the limits that the God of true measure has set for me; He gave the measuring stick when he made me set foot in your place" (2 Cor 10: 12-13).

The Pharisee in our Gospel met all what was demanded by the law and even more; he fasted twice a week when it was supposed to be done once a year only; he tithed even on the insignificant things when it was to be exacted only from the main products, but there was no word on his acts of kindness, charity, justice and love.

The tax collector, on the other hand, did not even dare "to raise his eyes to heaven. All he did was to beat his breast and say, 'O God, be merciful to me, a sinner,' He came home justified. His awareness of his sins and self-despising and confession won for him the acceptance of God.

If we set our lives and what we have done beside the life and deeds of Christ, all that is left for us to say is, "God be merciful to me - a sinner.







SAINT ANTHONY MARY CLARET'S STORY

FEAST DAY: OCTOBER 24

1868.

Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the "spiritual father of Cuba." He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.


From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins. He was recalled to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.

Reflection

Jesus foretold that those who are truly his representatives would suffer the same persecution as he did. Besides 14 attempts on his life, Anthony had to undergo such a barrage of the ugliest slander that the very name Claret became a byword for humiliation and misfortune. The powers of evil do not easily give up their prey. No one needs to go looking for persecution. All we need to do is be sure we suffer because of our genuine faith in Christ, not for our own whims and lack of prudence.




