WIS 11:22-12:2 | PS 145:1-2, 8-11, 13, 14 | 2 THES 1:11-2:2 | LK 19:1-10

Zacchaeus was a wealthy man, but he was lonely. He had everything, but he was not happy. No doubt he was at the top of his profession, but he was despised by his fellowmen. He was a tax-collector, and he was regarded as notoriously dishonest as well as a traitor by his own people. Collecting taxes on behalf of the Romans, the colonizers of the Jews, did not stand well with people who were rabid nationalists.

The old adage about money not buying happiness was once again proven true in Zacchaeus. A writer in the Wall Street Journal called money "an article which may be used as a universal passport to everywhere except heaven, and as a universal provider of everything except happiness."

Zacchaeus wanted to relocate his lost soul, his lost person, his lost identity, his lost being. He needed someone who will compassionately understand his situation instead of condemning it outrightly. He had heard of Jesus who welcomed sinners and tax-collectors like him. In the midst of desperation, he had the courage to face the bleak criticism of people to reach out after the love of God.

He climbed a sycamore tree. He forgot his status. Only a child can unashamedly do what he did. But it was exactly in climbing a tree that proved his resolve to be a child of God again. When Jesus came to the place, he stopped ... he looked up... he must have seen his

begging eyes ... he must have heard the pounding of his heart thirsty for love ... and he said: "Zacchaeus, come down quickly. I want to be your guest."

It must have been Jesus' way of saying, "Do not be afraid to come down from your exalted status. I'm here to be the guest in your lonely heart, to be a healer of your lost life.

Jesus must have smiled. He knew that he found once again what was lost. He knew Zacchaeus regained his true identity, his goodness as a person, the purity of his soul, the love in his heart. Jesus said to him: "Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a son of Abraham. The Son of Man has come to search out and save what was lost."

Zacchaeus lost his wealth but found honor. He lost his belongings but found happiness. He lost his comforts but found his dignity. It is this dignity as a child of God who was saved by Christ that made him find his destiny. It is this destiny that we should not lose even as we struggle against the temptations of the world. Let us not go into situation that Zacchaeus left behind. Let us rather focus our hearts to what he has found in Christ.







COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

FEAST DAY: NOVEMBER 2

The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased retained such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of prayer for the departed members. In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on November 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church.

The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgment of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and insisted that the prayers of the living can speed the process of purification.

Superstition easily clung to the observance.

Medieval popular belief held that the souls in purgatory could appear on this day in the form of witches, toads or will-o'-the-wisps. Graveside food offerings supposedly eased the rest of the dead.

Observances of a more religious nature have survived. These include public processions or private visits to cemeteries and decorating graves with flowers and lights. This feast is observed with great fervor in Mexico.

Reflection

Whether or not one should pray for the dead is one of the great arguments which divide Christians. Appalled by the abuse of indulgences in the Church of his day, Martin Luther rejected the concept of purgatory. Yet prayer for a loved one is, for the believer, a way of erasing any distance, even death. In prayer we stand in God's presence in the company of someone we love, even if that person has gone before us into death.


