2 SM 5: 1-3 | PS 122:1-5 | COL 1:12-20 | LK 23: 35-43

A Cardinal narrates a story about a child telling her mother, "Oh, mother, I can't understand if Christ is really powerful." "How is that my child?" asked the mother. "You see," the child explained, "if the fish in the sea can produce many other fishes, and the birds in the sky can produce many more birds, can Christ produce many other Christ's?"

The challenge for all of us on this feast of Christ the King is not only to be admirers nor mere devotees of Christ, but to produce within ourselves another Christ. This can be done by imitating the very life Christ has set for us to follow: to love and serve unconditionally. With arms outstretched on the cross, our Lord revealed to us his all-embracing love.

Sometimes we can't help question God's goodness whenever we witness the many miseries in our midst. We can't help asking, "Why did God allow this to happen? Why doesn't he do something about it?" But if we have to look on ourselves and examine closely what we stand for as Christians, we can humbly realize: "Yes, God did something about it. What am I here for?" Indeed, "He has no other hands but mine."

The king of kings makes us participate in his kingship. At our baptism, this declaration is made: "I am anointing you priest, prophet and king!" Christ said, "Just as the kingship has been given to me by my Father, so I give it to you. You will eat and drink at my table in my kingdom,

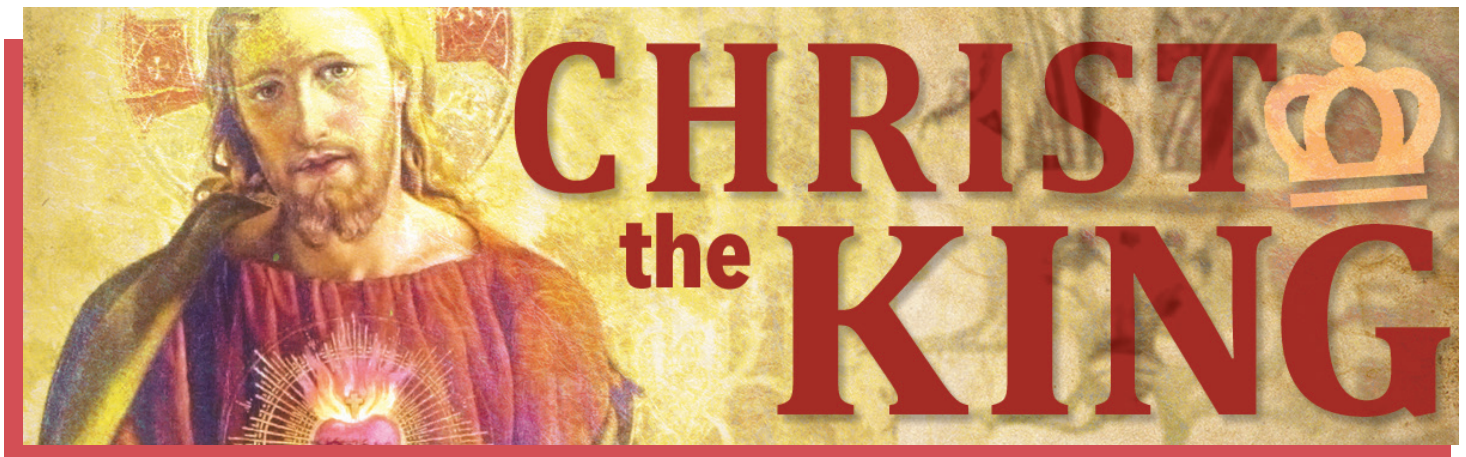
and you will sit on thrones" (Lk. 22:29-30).

It is not a question of doing spectacular things which is important, but the helping in simple things. "We cannot do great things," according to Mother Teresa, "only little things done in great love."

Our help must be a natural reaction from a loving heart. The help given for the sake of recognition is not real help, but disguised selfishness to pander one's self-esteem. Those who merit the kingdom are those who help because they cannot stop being generous.

Our Lord set for us this pattern of perfect giving. St. Paul said, "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for our sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:9). Our helping should not be done as a self-righteous and self-seeking exercise of duty. We must give to others as Christ gave himself to us.

The paradox of the kingdom is this - the person who aims for reward does not receive it; the person whose only motive is love is the one who is amply rewarded.

The liturgical or Church year begins on the first Sunday of ADVENT. The Season of Advent has four weeks. During this time the Christian people recall in joyful expectation the two comings of Jesus Christ into the world.

The first of these comings happened when he became incarnate in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary and was born on Christmas day. The second coming will take place on the Last Day when he will come in glory to judge the living and the dead.

The biblical readings and the prefaces of the Mass initially commemorate the second coming of Christ and then gradually shift the focus on his first coming by recalling the roles played by John the Baptist, his precursor, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, his mother.

Advent is not as strongly penitential in character as Lent.

However, the proximity of Christmas joy should not eliminate the penitential spirit of Advent. Amidst our busy preparation for Christmas we should find time to pause and interiorize the meaning of Advent through prayer, self-denial, and works of generosity especially toward the poor.



ADVENT WREATH

A popular symbol in many churches, may be placed in the narthex or gathering area or near the ambo. Each Sunday the candle(s) of the wreath might be borne in procession, following the thurible and cross. To be blessed at the 4:00pm vigil mass

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE



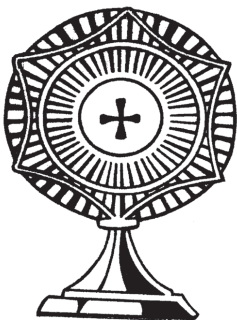
Sunday November 20th is the 34th or Last Sunday of Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Think of this: Moses worked 40 years to establish Judaism. For 45 years Buddha taught the way of enlightenment. For 23 years Muhammad preached his doctrine to his followers. The carpenter on the cross, with the sign above his head, Jesus Christ, king of the Jews, from the backwater, a religiously insignificant area of Galilee, worked for only three years to preach the kingdom of God. And after two thousand years about two billion people, including ourselves, call him our king! That in itself is a miracle. That shows tremendous foolishness or tremendous faith. We have chosen to follow a king who does not parade around in worldly glory or demonstrate worldly power. We follow a king who we believe to be "the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation." Our king was willing to come down to our level, to know first hand what suffering, rejection, misunderstanding, humiliation was like, and he proclaimed he has the power to transport us to a better life, a kingdom of peace and love and joy, if we want to follow him there. Other than royal robes and golden crowns, the other thing we automatically associate with kings is that they order people around.

They have the authority to make rules. Jesus told us what he wants. He wants us to enjoy eternal life and everlasting happiness with him in the kingdom of God. And the rules he gave us exist only to help us get there. And this is where it is a little harder for all of us to follow him as king. It's easy to admire him as a great and loving person. It stretches our faith a little more to admit he is God's Son and "the image of the invisible God" in the most literal sense of the words. But it really proves whether we see him as our king, if we are willing to recognize he has the authority to tell us how to live. When we admit that he has the authority to us that we should pray, that we must keep the commandments, that we are to forgive others, to share our resources with those less fortunate, to live chaste lives, to believe in and nourish ourselves with his unique presence in the Eucharist, then, in the most concrete way, we acknowledge him as our king.

Christ did not take up a cross just for the fun of it.

He suffered to save us. But he can only save us if we do not forget that he is always our king, not just in an abstract way but in our concrete, everyday lives.

SAINT AGNES OF ASSISI'S STORY

FEAST DAY: NOVEMBER 19

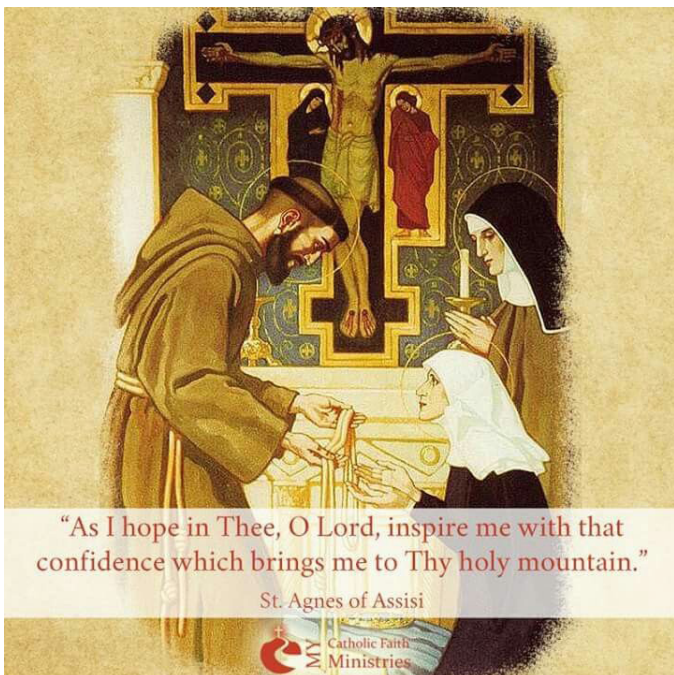
Born Caterina Offreducia, Agnes was the younger sister of Saint Clare, and her first follower. When Caterina left home two weeks after Clare's departure, their family attempted to bring her back by force. They tried to drag her out of the monastery, but her body suddenly became so heavy that several knights could not budge it. Her uncle Monaldo tried to strike her but was temporarily paralyzed. The knights then left Caterina and Clare in peace. Saint Francis himself gave Clare's sister the name Agnes, because she was gentle like a young lamb.

Agnes matched her sister in devotion to prayer and in willingness to endure the strict penances that characterized the Poor Ladies' lives at San Damiano. In 1221, a group of Benedictine nuns in Monticelli near Florence asked to become Poor Ladies. Saint Clare sent Agnes to become abbess of that monastery. Agnes soon wrote a rather sad letter about how much she missed Clare and the other nuns at San Damiano. After establishing other monasteries of Poor Ladies in northern Italy, Agnes was recalled to San Damiano in 1253, as Clare lay dying.

Three months later Agnes followed Clare in death, and was canonized in 1753.

Reflection

God must love irony; the world is so full of it. In 1212, many in Assisi surely felt that Clare and Agnes were wasting their lives and were turning their backs on the world. In reality, their lives were tremendously life-giving, and the world has been enriched by the example of these poor contemplatives.
