

IS 11:1-10 | PS 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17 | ROM 15:4-94 | MT 3:1-12

John the Baptist who lived in a desert was a sign of protest and of hope as well. He was a symbol of our longing for Something better and different. The prophet shouted at the top of his voice: "Make ready the way of the Lord .. Repent for the kingdom of God is at hand."

There must be a better way to celebrate Christmas than just submitting to the status quo of the world, than to equate our superficial trimmings to this event of our salvation. The greatest gift that we can offer to the Child Jesus is the gift of ourselves. This is only possible if we can open ourselves to the possibility of conversion, of a real change of our life.

A missionary met a woman carrying a handful of sand. "Do you know what this is?" asked the woman. The missionary answered: "It looks like sand." "Well, these are my sins, countless as the sands on the seashore," she explained. The missionary replied: "Since you got the sand from the shore, take it back there and watch the waves come in, and wash it slowly and completely. That is how God's forgiveness works because his mercy is as boundless as the ocean." Let us remove all fear and self-righteousness. We cannot imitate the complacency of the Pharisees and scribes who thought they could be spared from destruction because they were sons of Abraham. We have to be proud that we have a merciful God ready


to forgive those who humble themselves by repenting for their sins.

There are times that we readily complain about everything and everyone else, except ourselves. The season of Advent invites us to look deeper into ourselves and humbly admit that we have failed God's expectations of us.

A man said: "When I was young, I prayed: 'Lord, give me the energy to change the world.' As I approached middle age and realized that half of my life was gone without having changed a single soul, I changed my prayer to: 'Lord, give me the grace to convert all those who come into contact with me. Just my family and friends, and I shall be satisfied.'

"Now, that I'm an old man and my days are num-bered, I have begun to see how foolish I have been. My prayer now is: 'Lord, give me the grace to change my-self.' If I had prayed for this from the start, I would not have wasted my life."

Think about it my friends. John is pointing out to us the possibility in us to change and thus change the world with ourselves. The coming of Christ on Christmas day makes these things a reality. Why can't we make it happen?

SAINT JUAN DIEGO'S STORY

FEAST DAY: DECEMEBER 9

Thousands of people gathered in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe July 31, 2002, for the canonization of Juan Diego, to whom the Blessed Mother appeared in the 16th century. Pope John Paul II celebrated the ceremony at which the poor Indian peasant became the Church's first saint indigenous to the Americas.

The Holy Father called the new saint "a simple, humble Indian" who accepted Christianity without giving up his identity as an Indian. "In praising the Indian Juan Diego, I want to express to all of you the closeness of the Church and the pope, embracing you with love and encouraging you to overcome with hope the difficult times you are going through," John Paul said. Among the thousands present for the event were members of Mexico's 64 indigenous groups.

First called Cuauhtlatohuac ("The eagle who speaks"), Juan Diego's name is forever linked with Our Lady of Guadalupe because it was to him that she first appeared at Tepeyac hill on December 9, 1531. The most famous part of his story is told in connection with the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. After the roses gathered in his tilma were transformed into the miraculous image of Our Lady, however, little more is said about Juan Diego.


In time he lived near the shrine constructed at Tepeyac, revered as a holy, unselfish, and compassionate catechist, who taught by word and especially by example.

During his 1990 pastoral visit to Mexico, Pope John Paul

Il confirmed the long-standing liturgical cult in honor of Juan Diego, beatifying him. Twelve years later the same pope proclaimed him a saint.

Reflection:

God counted on Juan Diego to play a humble, yet huge role in bringing the Good News to the peoples of Mexico. Overcoming his own fear and the doubts of Bishop Juan de Zumarraga, Juan Diego cooperated with God's grace in showing his people that the Good News of Jesus is for everyone. Pope John Paul II used the occasion of Juan Diego's beatification to urge Mexican lay people to assume their responsibilities for passing on the Good News and witnessing to it.
