

JANUARY 8, 2023

IS 60:1-6 | PS 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13 | EPH 3:2-3A, 5-6 |MT 2:1-12

The word MAGI comes from the original Greek text which calls them Magoi. Most likely they were from Persia or Babylon and were priests of the Zoroastrian religion known for their wisdom and their ability to interpret dreams and astrological phenomenon's.

In our Gospel reading today, God used a special and unusual star which twinkled across the heavens, drawing the wise men from the east, all the way to Jerusalem. Embarking on a long journey, they left home and security behind, and experienced hardships as well as the momentary disappearance of the star. They were led on by the hope that at the end of the arduous search they would come upon the light of the world.

The perseverance of the magi inspires us on our long journey from this life to the kingdom. We can easily see God's presence in our good fortune and successes, but we feel abandoned by him in our times of trials and failures. On this feast of Epiphany, we are reminded that even in the trying moments of our existence, God's love is beaming. Like a star, though seemingly absent during storms and cloudy nights, it remains firm and shining. Like a star, though invisible during the day, it comes visibly bright in the dark times of our life. The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as the eternal light that dispels the darkness of the world. As the prophet Isaiah suggests in the first reading, the Gentiles, represented by the wise men, gathered to share the joy and transforming power of God's revelation. St. John says of this event: "the word was the true light that enlightens all; and he was coming into the world" (Jn 1:9). Jesus, however, had foreseen that his presence will bring hostility from others as he said: "Light has come into the world and people loved"

darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil" (Jn. 3:19).

There are people who see Christ as a threat to their worldly values and ambitions. They consider him as an obstacle that convicts them in their bad actions, and defeats their evil plans. Like Herod, some people may gladly destroy Jesus because he interferes in their way of life.

There are some who would have nothing to. do with Christ. They can be so engrossed with their own affairs and beliefs that he means nothing to them. Like the chief priests and scribes, we can be nailed down with our own pride that we can only react with indifference to the Gospel and the Church.

The magi, (however) reacted with joy and adoration when the star finally led them to the presence of the Child Jesus. These people of knowledge and stature were filled with reverent worship as they prostrated themselves before the King of kings. They were people who sought faithfully the light of truth and once they found it, they humbly submitted themselves to it.

We are the modern day magi following the light of the Gospel that will eventually bring us to the fullness of Jesus. We look with the eyes of faith, sustained with hope. that on our pilgrimage in this life, God's love endures until the end. Let us also pray that we too may become stars to other people, that through our word and example, we can animate them to follow Jesus. May all become "members of the same body and sharers of the promise through the preaching of the Gospel" (Eph. 3:6)

ORDINARY TIME

ORDINARY TIME consists of 33 or 34 weeks outside the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, The Sundaysand Weekdays in Ordinary Time unfold the other mysteries of Christ that are not explicitly commemorated by the seasons. During this time the Church calls attention to Our Lords ministry of preaching, healing, and liberating. these, in some way, become present to us as we listen with faith to the biblical readings every Sunday and indeed every day.

Of great importance, therefore, are the biblical readings, especially the gospel, during the Masses

in Ordinary Time when we listen to them we are enabled to listen to the preaching of Christ and experience the saving and healing power of his word. It is useful to keep in mind that his words and actions, which the gospel proclaims, allow us to paint the picture of our Father in heaven. We obtain knowledge of the Father through what Christ preached and performed.

Likewise, the Prefaces during Ordinary Time are worthy of our attention. They proclaim the wonderful works of God in creation and salvation history through Jesus Christ.

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary", but its Sunday after Sunday, day after day, is not ordinary: it is always extraordinary, because it is about the person of Jesus Christ who reveals to us by his words and action the person of the Father.

Ordinary Time begins on Tuesday, 10 January, and continues through Tuesday, 21 February, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season. It will resume when the Easter season ends, that is, on Monday, 29 May, the day following Pentecost. Jesus shares the plight of us sinners; he descends into the river, and into the wounded history of humanity.



SAINT ANGELA OF FOLIGNO'S STORY

FEAST DAY: JANUARY 8TH


Some saints show marks of holiness very early. Not Angela! Born of a leading family in Foligno, Italy, she became immersed in the quest for wealth and social position. As a wife and mother, she continued this life of distraction.

Around the age of 40, she recognized the emptiness of her life and sought God's help in the Sacrament of Penance. Her Franciscan confessor helped Angela to seek God's pardon for her previous life and to dedicate herself to prayer and the works of charity.

Shortly after her conversion, her husband and children died. Selling most of her possessions, she entered the Secular Franciscan Order. She was alternately absorbed by meditating on the crucified Christ and by serving the poor of Foligno as a nurse and beggar for their needs. Other women joined her in a religious community. At her confessor's advice, Angela wrote her Book of Visions and Instructions. In it she recalls some of the temptations she suffered after her conversion; she also expresses her thanks to God for the Incarnation of Jesus. This book and her life earned for Angela the title "Teacher of Theologians." She was beatified in 1693, and canonized in 2013.

Reflection:

People who live in the United States today can understand Saint Angela's temptation to increase her sense of self-worth by accumulating money, fame or power. Striving to possess more and more, she became more and more self-centered. When she realized she was priceless because she was created and loved by God, she became very penitential and very charitable to the poor. What had seemed foolish early in her life now became very important. The path of self-emptying she followed is the path all holy men and women must follow. The liturgical feast of Saint Angela of Foligno is celebrated on January 7.
