SIR 15:15-20 | PS 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 | 1 COR 2:6-10 | MT 5:17-37

"Love God with all your heart"

As a focus for today's Gospel, let us remind ourselves of the commandments Jesus stressed so forcefully: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." And

"you must love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt. 22:37, 39).

These commandments, as we know, were already given by God in the Old Testament, however, in different places: in Deuteronomy (6:5), and in Leviticus (19:18). Unfortunately, some people, like the Pharisees, did not realize the intimate relation between the two, which led them to see love and reverence for God as separate from love for their fellow man. Jesus, on the other hand, emphasized the necessity of seeing the two commandments as, in fact, one. Thus one cannot love God and hate one's fellow man. We can see, then, how Jesus fulfills and teaches the commands of God. Indeed, he himself is the model of how the two commandments can be complemented, since he dies in obedience to the Father's will, while at the same time showing his love for the world. In today's passage, Jesus speaks about three other Old Testament commandments: the command not to murder; the prohibition against adultery; and the injunction not to take false oaths. Just as Jesus teaches the need to find the ideals hidden within the Old Testament command to love God

and our neighbor, in the same way, he tells the people to go beyond a literal reading of the words. Thus, rather than simply avoiding murder, he insists that we avoid hateful thoughts towards our neighbor.

Rather than merely avoiding adultery, we must do away with all unchaste thoughts and desires. And rather than appealing to God as a witness that we will carry out a promise or oath, Jesus condemns oath-taking as such, since it implies a lack of trust between people.

In all this, Jesus points to the deeper meaning of the law, which basically calls for a loving, merciful, chaste, and trusting relationship with people. It is all summed up in the command to love God and to love our neighbor. And it is exemplified in the person of Jesus, who loved God intensely, showing it by giving his life on a cross. May God help us do the same.

The Season of LENT starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday before the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. From then on until Easter Sunday the Church celebrates the Easter Triduum of Christ's passion and death, burial, and resurrection.

Lent is characterized by penance for our past sins, works of mercy especially toward the poor, and personal preparation for the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter Vigil. Thus Lent has two features: penitential and baptismal. Our tears of penance renew in our hearts and souls the water of baptism.

The ashes imposed on us on Ash Wednesday remind us that we are dust and to dust we shall return and that therefore the entire life of a Christian should be marked by works of self denial and generosity. The traditional discipline of Lent consists of constant prayer and reading of God's word, fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, abstinence from meat on Fridays, and works of mercy especially to those who have less in life. What is important is that through prayer and good works we allow God's grace to bring about our interior conversion. The sacrament of penance should accompany our Lenten observance.

Holy Week is the high point of the Lenten season. It opens with the procession with blessed palms and the gospel reading at the passion and death of Our Savior. The triumphal entry into Jerusalem ended on Calvary, but we know that Good Friday led to Easter Sunday.

The biblical readings and prefaces extol the virtue of conversion of life, the need to fulfill our baptismal promises, joyful acceptance of daily trials for the love of God, and unselfish service to all who need our assistance.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINTS CYRIL AND METHODIUS' STORIES

FEAST DAY: FEBRUARY 14

Because their father was an officer in a part of Greece inhabited by many Slavs, these two Greek brothers ultimately became missionaries, teachers, and patrons of the Slavic peoples.

After a brilliant course of studies, Cyril (called Constantine until he became a monk shortly before his death) refused the governorship of a district such as his brother had accepted among the Slavic-speaking population. Cyril withdrew to a monastery where his brother Methodius had become a monk after some years in a governmental post.

A decisive change in their lives occurred when the Duke of Moravia asked the Eastern Emperor Michael for political independence from German rule and ecclesiastical autonomy (having their own clergy and liturgy). Cyril and Methodius undertook the missionary task.

Cyril's first work was to invent an alphabet, still used in some Eastern liturgies. His followers probably formed the Cyrillic alphabet. Together they translated the Gospels, the psalter, Paul's letters and the liturgical books into Slavonic, and composed a Slavonic liturgy, highly irregular then.

That and their free use of the vernacular in preaching led to opposition from the German clergy. The bishop refused to consecrate Slavic bishops and priests, and Cyril was forced to appeal to Rome. On the visit to Rome, he and Methodius had the joy of seeing their new liturgy approved by Pope Adrian II. Cyril, long an invalid, died in Rome 50 days after taking the monastic habit.

Methodius continued mission work for 16 more years. He was papal legate for all the Slavic peoples, consecrated a bishop and then given an ancient see (now in the Czech Republic). When much of their former territory was removed from their jurisdiction, the Bavarian bishops retaliated with a violent storm of accusation against Methodius. As a result, Emperor Louis the German exiled Methodius for three years. Pope John VIII secured his release.

Because the Frankish clergy, still smarting, continued their accusations, Methodius had to go to Rome to defend himself against charges of heresy and uphold his use of the Slavonic liturgy. He was again vindicated. Legend has it that in a feverish period of activity, Methodius translated the whole Bible into Slavonic in eight months. He died on Tuesday of Holy Week, surrounded by his disciples, in his cathedral church.

Opposition continued after his death, and the work of the brothers in Moravia was brought to an end and their disciples scattered. But the expulsions had the beneficial effect of spreading the spiritual, liturgical, and cultural work of the brothers to Bulgaria, Bohemia and southern Poland. Patrons of Moravia, and specially venerated by Catholic Czechs, Slovaks, Croatians, Orthodox Serbians and Bulgarians, Cyril and Methodius are eminently fitted to guard the long-desired unity of East and West. In 1980, Pope John Paul II named them additional co-patrons of Europe.

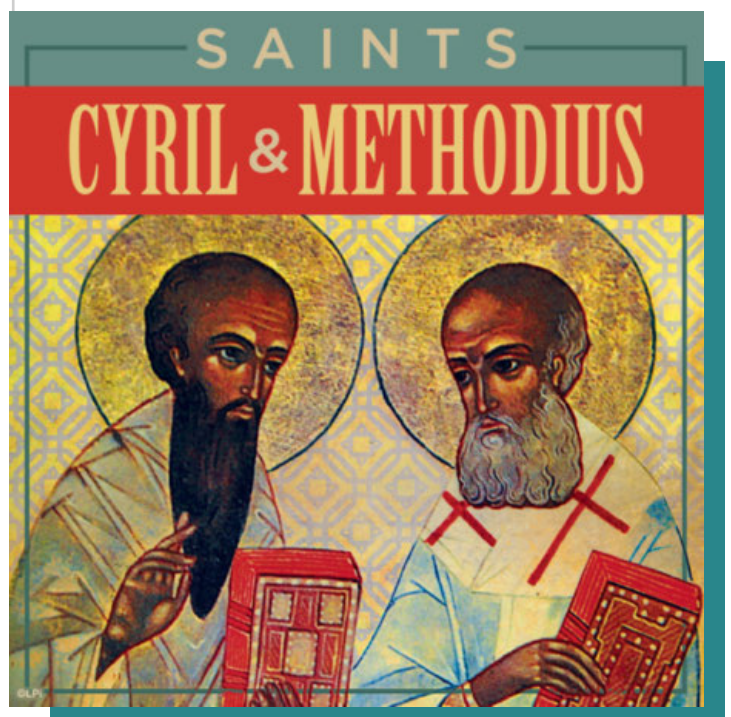
Reflection:

Holiness means reacting to human life with God's love: human life as it is, crisscrossed with the political and the cultural, the beautiful and the ugly, the selfish and the saintly. For Cyril and Methodius much of their daily cross had to do with the language of the liturgy. They are not saints because they got the liturgy into Slavonic, but because they did so with the courage and humility of Christ.

Our First Communion students attended their Good Shepherd retreat in preparation for their First Reconciliation (February 11th). Ms. Sandra and Ms. Domenica provided a visual experiment to teach the class how confession clears the darkness of sin from our souls. They began with a vase of clear fresh water. All the children thought of a sin they were sorry for and added one drop of food coloring into the water to represent the sin. The water changed to a dark and ugly blackness by the time they were done. Then Ms. Sandra showed them how through confession Jesus can wash away our sins. To represent this, she added bleach to the water as she gave examples of sins. She explained this is like telling their confessions to the Priest. The kids watched as the blackness in the water cleared up to a pale blue color. They could understand that because of original sin, they can never go back to perfectly clear water, but through reconciliation they could clear up their souls and experience the incredible feeling of forgiveness and know that Jesus died on the cross to forgive us of our sins.

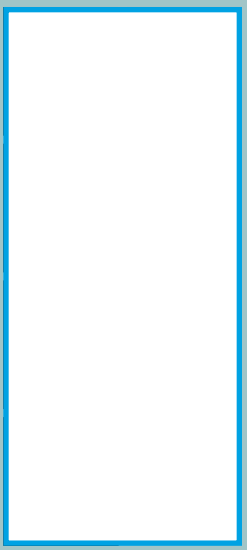

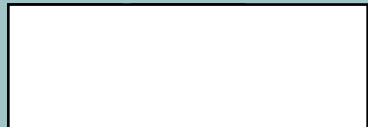
