GN 12:1-4A | PS 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22 | 2 TM 1:8B-10 | MT 4:1-11

The first reading presents to us the call of Abram to leave his country and journey to a land that God has prepared for him and his family.

St. Paul exhorted Timothy to remain steadfast in the gospel of the Lord Jesus.

In the gospel, Matthew brings us to the mountain where Jesus was transfigured in the presence of the apostles Peter, James, and John with the voice from the clouds affirming Jesus' identity and dignity and commanding the disciples to listen to him.

Christian life is a journey towards our final destination, the Father's house. In this journey we pass through different routes, meet diverse trials and difficulties and experience various moments of joys and graces. Spiritual writers would call the latter "mountain top experiences". In Jesus' journey from Galilee to Jerusalem, he had that experience in the Transfiguration. In it, God has declared the glory that awaits Jesus. Together with his Transfiguration, the words of the Father came, assuring him, "This is my Son, the Beloved, my Chosen One. Listen to him."


In our life journey, the Father is always with us and he is reminding us that our destination is to be in glory with him

and his Son and with all the saints. And we can only reach that destination if we remain focus to the voice of the Lord. Doing so will keep us on the right path.

In the depths of our hearts is an ardent cry for God's love that grows increasingly unheard. We have become experts at keeping busy, hopping from one activity to the next, filling eyes, ears, and hearts with distractions often misconstrued as important yet unable to satisfy. We end up exhausted and still clueless about where true joy is, where God is.

Yet God remains ever-present with us, especially in the Holy Eucharist. The highest form of prayer, the Mass quenches our thirst with the Living Water. We partake of Jesus' Body and Blood. We are bathed in the Light of Christ and granted a foretaste of heaven, becoming transfigured ourselves.

The Eucharist thus functions like the mountains in Scripture: a privileged means for us to encounter the divine. Hence, we should go to church as we would trek a mountain: leaving behind all distractions, we come to Mass to truly seek God with our whole being. Only then do we find him there, always present, eagerly anticipating. And then, our own transfiguration may begin, and we can exclaim together with Peter: "Lord, it is good that we are here."


LENTEN FISH FRY



SAINT FRANCES OF ROME'S STORY

FEAST DAY: MARCH 9

Frances' life combines aspects of secular and religious life. A devoted and loving wife, she longed for a lifestyle of prayer and service, so she organized a group of women to minister to the needs of Rome's poor. Born of wealthy parents, Frances found herself attracted to the religious life during her youth. But her parents objected and a young nobleman was selected to be her husband.

As she became acquainted with her new relatives, Frances soon discovered that the wife of her husband's brother also wished to live a life of service and prayer. So the two, Frances and Vannozza, set out together—with

their husbands' blessings—to help the poor. Frances fell ill for a time, but this apparently only deepened her commitment to the suffering people she met. The years passed, and Frances gave birth to two sons and a daughter. With the new responsibilities of family life, the young mother turned her attention more to the needs of her own household.

The family flourished under Frances' care, but within a few years a great plague began to sweep across Italy. It struck Rome with devastating cruelty and left Frances' second son dead. In an effort to help alleviate some of the suffering, Frances used all her money and sold her possessions to buy whatever the sick might possibly need. When all the resources had been exhausted, Frances and Vannozza went door to door begging. Later, Frances' daughter died, and the saint opened a section of her house as a hospital.

Frances became more and more convinced that this way of life was so necessary for the world, and it was not long before she requested and was given permission to found a society of women bound by no vows. They simply offered themselves to God and to the service of the poor. Once the society was established, Frances


chose not to live at the community residence, but rather at home with her husband. She did this for seven years, until her husband passed away, and then came to live the remainder of her life with the society—serving the poorest of the poor.

Reflection:

Looking at the exemplary life of fidelity to God and devotion to her fellow human beings which Frances of Rome was blessed to lead, one cannot help but be reminded of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, who loved Jesus Christ in prayer and also in the poor. The life of Frances of Rome calls each of us not only to look deeply for God in prayer, but also to carry our devotion to Jesus living in the suffering of our world. Frances shows us that this life need not be restricted to those bound by vows.

Father Timothy Canaan has been a priest of the Diocese of Ogdensburg in New York since May 22, 1993. In addition to being a pastor and a parish priest Father Timothy has served the Diocese of Ogdensburg as its Vocation Director, Director of Admissions of Wadhams Hall Seminary-College and Diocesan Director of Campus Ministry. Shortly after Father Timothy's ordination to the priesthood he began preaching retreats in the Diocese of Ogdensburg. He has preached numerous Parish Missions and has been the retreat director for Commissioned Lay Ministers, and Vocation Candidates, Father Timothy's gift of preaching enables him to preach the gospel message through the use of real life stories and everyday situations. In January of 2019 Father Timothy had to retire from active ministry due to severe cardiac issues. His retirement brought him to South Florida where he now resides and assists in celebrating Mass here at Emmanuel.

BISHOP'S LETTER- SECOND COLLECTION

March 4, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Next weekend, March 11th and 12th is the annual Diocese of Palm Beach collection for the education of seminarians and the formation of priests. The funds raised in this collection are used to support the cost of tuition, housing, education, and pastoral training of our seminarians. For example, the cost of tuition for one seminarian per year is \$22,000, and the room and board for one seminarian is \$12,100 per year. The priestly discernment and seminary formation process is important, and these seminarians need our spiritual and financial support.

Currently, there are eight seminarians from our Diocese who are dedicating themselves to this important process of understanding their vocation. With God's grace, we will have two ordinations this year: one priestly ordination (Rev. Mr. Marc Gustinelli) and one diaconate ordination (Mr. Joshua Martin).

By your generosity, our seminarians can devote themselves fully to the task of priestly formation, without having to worry about the financial burden of seminary. With them, you walk the journey of faith and ensure that the sacraments will continue to nourish the faithful for generations to come.

With gratitude for your continued generosity and every prayerful wish, I am


