



FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

MARCH 19, 2023

1 SM 16:1B, 6-7, 10-13A | PS 23: 1-6 | EPH 5:8-14 | JN 9:1-41

When bad things happen in our lives we often question God and ask why. Why did my spouse, child, or friend die? Why was I betrayed? Why did I get sick? Why am I depressed or why do I suffer from anxiety and fear? All of these and many other sufferings can make us question our faith in God. We wonder what we could have done to possibly deserve our suffering.

We hear something similar from the disciples in today's Gospel, those who were closest to Jesus. "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind". The disciples are looking for something to blame, a reason for the evil and suffering they see in the world. Jesus' response is poignant. He responds by saying that "Neither he nor his parents sinned;

it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him." What Jesus says here is the key to understanding the suffering and pain of the man born blind. His suffering is not the result of some sin or evil committed by either him or his family. The suffering in his life was permitted by God so that God's power might be made visible through the healing of his suffering.

When we look at our own lives and the suffering and the pain that we carry do we respond to it like

the disciples by asking what is wrong, what did I do that God is punishing me, or do we allow our suffering to become the meeting place with the power of God? Jesus did not come just to take away our suffering and pain, to wipe it away as though it had never existed. Rather, Jesus came to transform it and show us that, in suffering we can touch the glory of God. The question for us then is will we invite the presence of Jesus into our lives which gives meaning and purpose to our suffering or will we look for something to blame for our misery, pain and hurt.

During this Lent we are being invited to bring the areas of suffering in our lives to Jesus, in preparation for Holy Week. On Good Friday Jesus enters into the greatest sufferings of the world and rather than asking his Father why this is happening to me he embraces it. He carries his cross all the way to the end so that in dying upon the cross he may rise on Easter Sunday, so that the glory of the Father may be made manifest in him. The Lord wants us to experience the same glory as he experienced on Easter Sunday. So, let us bring our suffering our and pain to Jesus this lent so that we might be healed and know the power and glory of God living inside of us.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO'S STORY

FEAST DAY: MARCH 23

Together with Rose of Lima, Turibius is the first known saint of the New World, serving the Lord in Peru, South America, for 26 years.

Born in Spain and educated for the law, he became so brilliant a scholar that he was made professor of law at the University of Salamanca and eventually became chief judge of the Inquisition at Granada. He succeeded too well. But he was not sharp enough a lawyer to prevent a surprising sequence of events.

When the archdiocese of Lima in Peru required a new leader, Turibius was chosen to fill the post: He was the one person with the strength of character and holiness of spirit to heal the scandals that had infected that area.


He cited all the canons that forbade giving laymen ecclesiastical dignities, but he was overruled. Turibius was ordained priest and bishop and sent to Peru, where he found colonialism at its worst. The Spanish conquerors were guilty of every sort of oppression of the native population. Abuses among the clergy were flagrant, and he devoted his energies and suffering to this area first. He began the long and arduous visitation of an immense archdiocese, studying the language, staying two or three days in each place, often with neither bed nor food. Turibius confessed every

morning to his chaplain, and celebrated Mass with intense fervor. Among those to whom he gave the Sacrament of Confirmation was the future Saint Rose of Lima, and possibly the future Saint Martin de Porres. After 1590, he had the help of another great missionary, Francis Solanus, now also a saint.

Though very poor his people were sensitive, dreading to accept public charity from others. Turibius solved the problem by helping them anonymously.

Reflection

The Lord indeed writes straight with crooked lines. Against his will, and from the unlikely springboard of an Inquisition tribunal, this man became the Christlike shepherd of a poor and oppressed people. God gave him the gift of loving others as they needed it.




