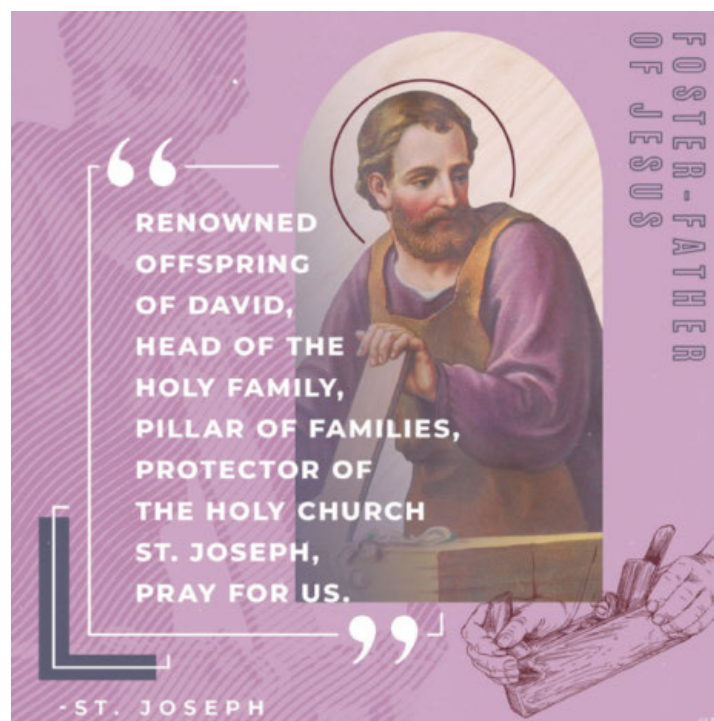

EZ 37:12-14 | PS 130:1-8 | ROM 8:8-11 | JN 11:1-45

“With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption”. We hear these words today in our psalm but what do they actually mean? As Catholics we can become accustomed to hearing religious language, words such as mercy and redemption, without taking the time to really understand what they mean. They become so common place that we no longer stop to reflect on their true meaning and the impact they should have on us.

To understand better what these words mean it is good to understand where they came from. Mercy comes from the Latin compound *misericors* which in turn comes from two Latin words *miserere* whose root is related to both the words “pity” and “wretched” and *cor* which means “heart”. In seeing this what we learn is that mercy means something equivalent to heart of pity upon misery. Although its root is different, the root of redemption has a very similar focus to that of mercy. The word itself comes from *redemptio*, meaning to “buy back”. The biblical usage of this word carries with it a sense of being brought out of slavery as the Israelites were brought out of captivity in Egypt. One who is redeemed in this sense or brought out of slavery is brought out of misery. Here we can see the connection between

the two words. Redemption is the result of mercy. In this psalm we then see that the mercy of the Lord, his heart of pity turned toward our misery buys us or brings us out of our slavery and misery.

But we are not an enslaved people. We live in the land of the free and the home of the brave. While this may be true of our political and social life how many of us are truly free in the biblical and spiritual sense. Our modern understanding of freedom asserts that we can do whatever we want as long as we don’t hurt other people. The biblical and spiritual understanding of freedom that Christ offers to us is quite different. Freedom is not freedom from restraint but freedom for the good. Freedom is there to be used to pursue whatever is true, good, and beautiful in life. And what stops us from being able to pursue and live in true freedom? Sin.

Our sin, our egotistical pride, keeps us from asking God and others for forgiveness, keeps us from being able to realize that our inner world is full of misery. It is the mercy of the Lord that calls us out of our misery and sin leading us into the fullness of redemption, the fullness of a life lived in true inner freedom which comes only through his presence. It is with God then that we can say, “With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption”.

SAINT PETER REGALADO'S STORY

FEAST DAY: MARCH 30

Peter lived at a very busy time in history. The Great Western Schism (1378-1417) was settled at the Council of Constance (1414-1418). France and England were fighting the Hundred Years' War, and in 1453, the Byzantine Empire was completely wiped out by the loss of Constantinople to the Turks. At Peter's death, the age of printing had just begun in Germany, and Columbus's arrival in the New World was less than 40 years away.

Peter came from a wealthy and pious family in Valladolid, Spain. At the age of 13, he was allowed to enter the Conventual Franciscans. Shortly after his ordination, he was made superior of the friary in Aguilar. He became part of a group of friars who wanted to lead a life of greater poverty and penance. In 1442, he was appointed head of all the Spanish Franciscans in his reform group.

Peter led the friars by his example. A special love of the poor and the sick characterized Peter.

Miraculous stories are told about his charity to the poor. For example, the bread never seemed to run out as long as Peter had hungry people to feed.

Throughout most of his life, Peter went hungry; he lived only on bread and water.

Immediately after his death on March 31, 1456, his grave became a place of pilgrimage. Peter was canonized in 1746.

Reflection

Peter was an effective leader of the friars because he did not become ensnared in anger over the sins of others. Peter helped sinning friars rearrange the priorities in their lives and dedicate themselves to living the gospel of Jesus Christ as they had vowed. This patient correction is an act of charity available to all Franciscans, not just to superiors.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation Attire

The Bishop's guidelines for Confirmation attire is "the Confirmation candidates should be appropriately dressed which expresses the dignity of the Sacrament." The following suggestions are given:

BOYS:

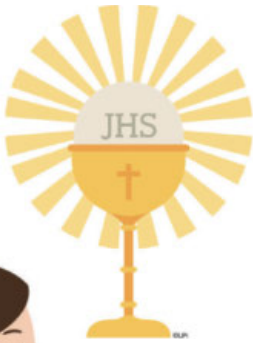
Jacket or suit is optional, white shirt and tie, suit pants/trousers, dress shoes.

ABSOLUTELY NO JEANS of any kind, **TENNIS /ATHLETIC SHOES OR FLIP FLOPS.**

GIRLS: Dress that is simple, modest, any color and dress shoes or sandals. (Backless and off the shoulder dresses are not appropriate for this Mass) and should be covered with a sweater or jacket.



FIRST COMMUNION INFORMATION



GIRLS:

Girls receiving their First Holy Communion should wear an all white dress. It may be simple or ornate but should not have any colored ribbons or adornments.

A child may wear a white veil to accompany the dress. It can be topped with another hair accessory such as a small tiara.

Alternately, a white headband, a white barrette, a white ribbon or a white floral crown are allowed. Girls may wear white hose, knee socks, stockings, and white dress shoes or sandals.

Please **NO GLOVES, PURSES** or other items that may distract the child during the mass.

BOYS:

Boys receiving their First Holy Communion may wear a light or dark colored suit, sports coat or jacket. A lighter colored suit is more suitable for this occasion but a dark or navy will be fine.

They may also wear a white suit but this is not mandatory. A white shirt with a collar with long or short sleeves. Light or dark dress pants, with a belt. Boys should wear a solid colored tie in white, or blue or a tie with a subtle pattern. Dress shoes with socks. **NO SNEAKERS.**

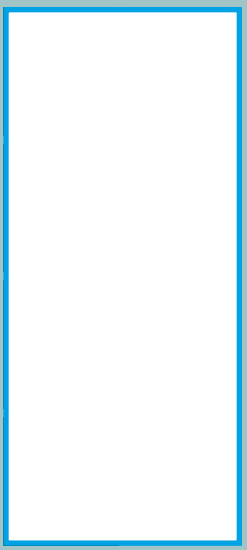
