

ACTS 10:34A, 37-43 | PS 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 | COL 3:1-4 OR 1 COR 5:6B-8 | JN 20:1-9

One of the incontrovertible truths of being human is that, at some point, we all die. Whether rich or poor, famous or unknown it is the inevitable fate of all humans that death comes for us sooner or later. For many people the unstoppable march towards death is overwhelming and terrifying. So many people do everything they can to avoid thinking or talking about it, preferring to live in denial than face their own mortality.

This fear of death is nothing new. Most cultures have expressed a similar anxiety. The Greeks believed that Hades, the land of the dead, was a shadow existence which even the greatest heroes of their culture could not escape. Death lead to a miserable afterlife. For much of Israel's history, even during the time of Jesus, many Jews did not believe in an afterlife. Even those who did believe in some sort of an afterlife thought of it as a place similar to Hades, a shadowy half-life called Sheol.

At a certain point in Israel's history this began to change though. There were some Jews who began to believe that not only was there an afterlife but began to believe in a literal resurrection. These Jews began to believe that this world we live in with suffering, sin, and ultimately death does not have the final word. In the Gospels the Pharisees were some of these people who expressed a belief in the resurrection. This was in contrast to the Sadducees, the ruling elites, who denied the resurrection from the dead.


We hear one of the clearest affirmations of the resurrection in the Gospels from Martha the brother of Lazarus when she says in response to her brother's death that, "I know... he (Lazarus) will rise again in the resurrection on the last day" (John 11:24). In response to Martha's statement of belief Jesus responds by saying something radical. He says, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" (John 25, 26). Jesus is not saying that he will lead us to the resurrection or to some sort of enlightenment like other great teachers of the world. No, Jesus is claiming

that resurrection and life are part of who he is; they are part of his identity!

For the disciples of Jesus, their ability to believe that he was the resurrection and the life in the face of his brutal death on the cross was too much to bear. How could someone, who had claimed power that belonged to God alone have died on the cross? The weight of belief in Jesus' claim to be the resurrection and the life became too much to bear in the face of the horrors that were inflicted during the passion and crucifixion. All the evidence pointed to the contrary, that Jesus wasn't who he said he was and that the disciples had been dupped. They lost their faith in Jesus under the weight of the that terrible day.

But something extraordinary happened. The tomb was empty 3 days later and the disciples began to see Jesus! At first they thought he was a ghost. For although the doors were locked Jesus appeared in their midst. Jesus told Thomas "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe" (John 20:27). In doing this Jesus showed Thomas and the whole world that suffering, sin and death did not have the final word. As the Apostle Paul put it so aptly, "Where, O death, is your sting". Death is no longer something to be feared. In Jesus Christ it is now the entrance into eternal life glory in the presence of God forever.

This is what we believe as Christians. That Christ conquered death and rose on the third day and that he offers an eternal life of glory to each and every person. The fear of the world that death will be the end no longer has power over us who have faith in Jesus Christ. So let us rejoice today for Christ is truly risen!





SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT MARTIN IS' STORY

FEAST DAY: APRIL 13

When Martin I became pope in 649, Constantinople was the capital of the Byzantine empire and the patriarch of Constantinople was the most influential Church leader in the eastern Christian world. The struggles that existed within the Church at that time were magnified by the close cooperation of emperor and patriarch. A teaching, strongly supported in the East, held that Christ had no human will. Twice, emperors had officially favored this position: Heraclius by publishing a formula of faith, and Constans II by silencing the issue of one or two wills in Christ. Shortly after assuming the office of the papacy—which


he did without first being confirmed by the emperor—Martin held a council at the Lateran in which the imperial documents were censured, and in which the patriarch of Constantinople and two of his predecessors were condemned. In response, Constans II first tried to turn bishops and people against the pope.

Failing in this and in an attempt to kill the pope, the emperor sent troops to Rome to seize Martin and to bring him back to Constantinople. Already in poor health, Martin offered no resistance, returned with Calliopas, the exarch of Constantinople, and was then submitted to various imprisonments, tortures, and hardships. Although condemned to death and with some of the imposed torture already carried out, Martin was saved from execution by the pleas of a repentant Paul, patriarch of Constantinople, who was himself gravely ill.

Tortures and cruel treatment having taken their toll, Martin died shortly thereafter. He is the last of the early popes to be venerated as a martyr.

Reflection

The real significance of the word martyr comes not from the dying but from the witnessing, which the word means in its derivation. People who are willing to give up everything, their most precious possessions, their very lives, put a supreme value on the cause or belief for which they sacrifice. Martyrdom, dying for the faith, is an incidental extreme to which some have had to go to manifest their belief in Christ. A living faith, a life that exemplifies Christ's teaching throughout, and that in spite of difficulties, is required of all Christians. Martin refused to cut corners as a way of easing his lot, to make some accommodations with the civil rulers.



APRIL Is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every April, Catholic parishes and schools across the United States participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month.



The Effects of ABUSE

When a child is abused, the effects are grave and can last a lifetime. Some of the most common effects of abuse include:

- · Loss of faith and trust in God.
- Post-traumatic stress disorder, psychological distress, and other indirect signs of trauma, such as anxiety, trouble sleeping, chronic stomach pain, and headaches.
- A greater risk of developing behavioral problems, substance abuse, and suicide.

The sense of violation goes deep into a person's psyche and feelings of anger, shame, hurt, and betrayal can build long after the abuse has taken place.

Steps to Prevent ABUSE

Communicate with Your Children

It is extremely important to communicate openly with your children. Let them know that they can talk to you about anything that bothers them. This will help you identify warning signs and grooming behaviors perpetrated by offenders before they escalate to abuse.

Educate Yourself and Your Children on Abuse

Learning how to identify, prevent, and report abuse is key. Parents and guardians should empower their children to protect themselves from harm and to report abuse. Ask your diocesan safe environment coordinator or parish delegate about opportunities for safe environment training.

Identify and Report Warning Signs of Child Abusers

Grooming behaviors are the actions abusers take to project the image that they are kind, generous, caring people, while their intent is to lure a minor into an inappropriate relationship. Offenders can be patient and may groom their victim, his or her family, or community for years.

Some abusers isolate a potential victim by giving him or her undue attention or lavish gifts, while others allow young people to participate in activities which their parents or guardians would not approve, such as watching pornography, drinking alcohol, using drugs, and excessive touching, such as wrestling and tickling. Abusers also often try to isolate their victims from family or friends and encourage their victims to keep secrets from their parents or other caring adults.

Holding Offenders ACCOUNTABLE

To help hold offenders accountable, report all suspected abuse to local public authorities. You can also contact your local diocesan victim assistance coordinator to make a report and seek outreach for the abused.

In accordance with diocesan policy, when a single act of sexual abuse is admitted or established, the offender is to be removed permanently from ministry.

CONFIRMATION

The Bishop's guidelines for Confirmation attire is "the Confirmation candidates should be appropriately dressed which expresses the dignity of the Sacrament." The following suggestions are given: BOYS:

Jacket or suit is optional, white shirt and tie, suit pants/trousers, dress shoes. ABSOLUTELY NO JEANS of any kind, TENNIS /ATHLETIC SHOES OR FLIP FLOPS. GIRLS: Dress that is simple, modest, any color and dress shoes or sandals. (Backless and off the shoulder dresses are not appropriate for this Mass) and should be covered with a sweater or jacket.



FIRST COMMUNION INFORMATION



GIRLS:

Girls receiving their First Holy Communion should wear an all white dress. It may be simple or ornate but should not have any colored ribbons or adornments.

A child may wear a white veil to accompany the dress. It can be topped with another hair accessory such as a small tiara. Alternately, a white headband, a white barrette, a white ribbon or a white floral crown are allowed. Girls may wear white hose, knee socks, stockings, and white dress shoes or sandals.

Please NO GLOVES, PURSES or other items that may distract the child during the mass. BOYS:

Boys receiving their First Holy Communion may wear a light or dark colored suit, sports coat or jacket. A lighter colored suit is more suitable for this occasion but a dark or navy will be fine. They may also wear a white suit but this is not mandatory. A white shirt with a collar with long or short sleeves. Light or dark dress pants, with a belt. Boys should wear a solid colored tie in white, or blue or a tie with a subtle pattern. Dress shoes with socks. NO SNEAKERS.


