


In the year 2000 as the world was celebrating the new millennium Pope John Paul II instituted a new feast for the entire Church on the Sunday after Easter Sunday; the Feast of Divine Mercy which we celebrate today. The new millennium was dedicated by John Paul II to Divine Mercy after the horrors of the 20th century, a century which was the most violent and bloody century in history. Pope John Paul II had witnessed the horrors of the 20th century first hand having lived through both the brutal invasion and decimation of Poland by the Nazis during World War II as well as the Communist oppression of eastern Europe by the Soviets. This first hand experience of the horrors of the 20th century had a deep impact upon him as a person but what had an even deeper impact on him was the message of Divine Mercy.

As a young man, when he was secretly studying for the priesthood during the Nazis occupation of Poland he worked in a chemical factory on the outskirts of Krakow to hide his involvement with the underground seminary he was attending. Not far from the factory where he worked though was the convent where Sr. Maria Faustina Kowolska had lived and eventually died. John Paul II would visit the chapel in the convent and pray there on a frequent basis while he worked at the chemical factory and what he received being there utterly changed him forever.

Sr. Faustina was a Polish nun who had died at the age of 33 from tuberculosis in 1938, just 1 year before the Nazis invaded Poland. At the age of 18 however, even before she was thinking of becoming a nun she had begun to receive visions of Jesus along with messages for the world. In the visions Jesus revealed to Sr. Faustina of his unending mercy for the world and for sinners and of his desire to shower his infinite mercy upon each human person. This was the message that John Paul II began to hear about in the midst of World War II and it shaped him and transformed him even as the world around him was falling apart. It made such an impact on

him that even through all the horrors of the 20th century he only grew stronger in his belief in the unending mercy and love of God for the world. It became the deepest belief of his pontificate to the point that at the dawn of the new millennium he chose to dedicate the world to Divine Mercy. John Paul II believed that we live in a special time of Divine Mercy in which God is showering the world with untold grace and blessing.

This is the message of both Sr. Faustina's life and the life of John Paul II: that the mercy and love of God has no limits if only we would turn to him and accept his love for us and it is the message of Easter which we continue to celebrate until May 18th with the feast of the Ascension of Jesus. During the season of Easter and this millennium of Mercy the Lord invites each of us to a new experience of his love and mercy for us. John Paul II believed in the message of Divine Mercy even as the world around him seemed like it was falling apart. It is an invitation for us to believe and experience in our own lives the tremendous love and mercy of God for us and for our world.







SAINT BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS' STORY

FEAST DAY: APRIL 16

Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844, the first child of an extremely poor miller in the town of Lourdes in southern France. The family was living in the basement of a dilapidated building when on February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. Bernadette, 14 years old, was known as a virtuous girl though a dull student who had not even made her first Holy Communion. In poor health, she had suffered from asthma from an early age.

There were 18 appearances in all, the final one occurring on the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked skepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of the curious. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel built on the spot of the visions. There, the people were to come to wash in and drink of the water of the spring that had welled up from the very spot where Bernadette had been instructed to dig.

According to Bernadette, the Lady of her visions was a girl of 16 or 17 who wore a white robe with a blue sash. Yellow roses covered her feet, a large rosary was on her right arm. In the vision on March 25 she told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." It was only when the words were explained to her that Bernadette came to realize who the Lady was.


Few visions have ever undergone the scrutiny that these appearances of the Immaculate Virgin were subject to. Lourdes became one of the most popular Marian shrines in the world, attracting millions of visitors. Miracles were reported at the shrine and in the waters of the spring. After thorough investigation, Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions in 1862.

During her life, Bernadette suffered much. She was hounded by the public as well as by civic officials until at last she was protected in a

convent of nuns. Five years later, she petitioned to enter the Sisters of Notre Dame of Nevers. After a period of illness she was able to make the journey from Lourdes and enter the novitiate. But within four months of her arrival she was given the last rites of the Church and allowed to profess her vows. She recovered enough to become infirmarian and then sacristan, but chronic health problems persisted. She died on April 16, 1879, at the age of 35. Bernadette Soubirous was canonized in 1933.

Reflection

Millions of people have come to the spring Bernadette uncovered for healing of body and spirit, but she found no relief from ill health there. Bernadette moved through life, guided only by blind faith in things she did not understand—as we all must do from time to time.



APRIL Is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every April, Catholic parishes and schools across the United States participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month.



The Effects of ABUSE

When a child is abused, the effects are grave and can last a lifetime. Some of the most common effects of abuse include:

- · Loss of faith and trust in God.
- Post-traumatic stress disorder, psychological distress, and other indirect signs of trauma, such as anxiety, trouble sleeping, chronic stomach pain, and headaches.
- A greater risk of developing behavioral problems, substance abuse, and suicide.

The sense of violation goes deep into a person's psyche and feelings of anger, shame, hurt, and betrayal can build long after the abuse has taken place.

Steps to Prevent ABUSE

Communicate with Your Children

It is extremely important to communicate openly with your children. Let them know that they can talk to you about anything that bothers them. This will help you identify warning signs and grooming behaviors perpetrated by offenders before they escalate to abuse.

Educate Yourself and Your Children on Abuse

Learning how to identify, prevent, and report abuse is key. Parents and guardians should empower their children to protect themselves from harm and to report abuse. Ask your diocesan safe environment coordinator or parish delegate about opportunities for safe environment training.

Identify and Report Warning Signs of Child Abusers

Grooming behaviors are the actions abusers take to project the image that they are kind, generous, caring people, while their intent is to lure a minor into an inappropriate relationship. Offenders can be patient and may groom their victim, his or her family, or community for years.

Some abusers isolate a potential victim by giving him or her undue attention or lavish gifts, while others allow young people to participate in activities which their parents or guardians would not approve, such as watching pornography, drinking alcohol, using drugs, and excessive touching, such as wrestling and tickling. Abusers also often try to isolate their victims from family or friends and encourage their victims to keep secrets from their parents or other caring adults.

Holding Offenders ACCOUNTABLE

To help hold offenders accountable, report all suspected abuse to local public authorities. You can also contact your local diocesan victim assistance coordinator to make a report and seek outreach for the abused.

In accordance with diocesan policy, when a single act of sexual abuse is admitted or established, the offender is to be removed permanently from ministry.

The Bishop's guidelines for Confirmation attire is "the Confirmation candidates should be appropriately dressed which expresses the dignity of the Sacrament." The following suggestions are given: BOYS:

Jacket or suit is optional, white shirt and tie, suit pants/trousers, dress shoes. ABSOLUTELY NO JEANS of any kind, TENNIS /ATHLETIC SHOES OR FLIP FLOPS. GIRLS: Dress that is simple, modest, any color and dress shoes or sandals. (Backless and off the shoulder dresses are not appropriate for this Mass) and should be covered with a sweater or jacket.



FIRST COMMUNION INFORMATION



GIRLS:

Girls receiving their First Holy Communion should wear an all white dress. It may be simple or ornate but should not have any colored ribbons or adornments.

A child may wear a white veil to accompany the dress. It can be topped with another hair accessory such as a small tiara. Alternately, a white headband, a white barrette, a white ribbon or a white floral crown are allowed. Girls may wear white hose, knee socks, stockings, and white dress shoes or sandals.

Please NO GLOVES, PURSES or other items that may distract the child during the mass. BOYS:

Boys receiving their First Holy Communion may wear a light or dark colored suit, sports coat or jacket. A lighter colored suit is more suitable for this occasion but a dark or navy will be fine. They may also wear a white suit but this is not mandatory. A white shirt with a collar with long or short sleeves. Light or dark dress pants, with a belt. Boys should wear a solid colored tie in white, or blue or a tie with a subtle pattern. Dress shoes with socks. NO SNEAKERS.


