


ACTS 1:1-11 | PS 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9 | EPH 1:17-23 | MT 28:16-20

There are many things that can bring enjoyment to our lives. Our family and friends, hobbies and career. Do we think of our relationship with God as a source of enjoyment and pleasure though? Oftentimes when people talk about the Church and God they speak about it in terms of obligations. It is the do's and don'ts which most often define our relationship with God and the Church. One of the best examples of this is the Ten Commandments. While these are of fundamental importance, they are the basics of the faith, we rarely move beyond them. They are like the basic movements that a weightlifter or a dancer needs to learn before they can move on to more advanced movements. Most Christians though never move onto anything more advanced. They never go beyond the basics of the faith, beyond the do's and don'ts.

Finding pleasure and enjoyment in something can only happen as a person grows beyond the basics. In the beginning of studying a language you have to memorize conjugations, lists of vocabulary and rules of grammar. It isn't until you have gone through the pain of mastering these basics that you will be able to find pleasure and enjoyment in a new language. Most Christians stay bogged down in the fundamentals and the basics, struggling their whole lives to improve in these areas. This is not to say that we forget or don't focus on these fundamentals. A good dancer or weightlifter will still spend large amounts of their time making sure that their base skills stay strong. They do this though so that they stay strong enough to move to higher skill levels with safety and ease. Most Christians though don't know that there is anything beyond the basics. They are unaware of

the pleasure and delight that relationship with Jesus has to offer. Jesus doesn't want to just give us a list of do's and don'ts. Rather he wants to take us to the heights and depths of life and love. Through relationship with Jesus there is so much more. He wants to give us a love so deep and unimaginable that we could never have even hoped for it.

So while we always need to stay grounded and stay strong in the basics, we should also strive, in the love of Jesus, for the heights. In 1st Corinthians 12:31 St. Paul says this very thing when he says, "Strive eagerly for the higher gifts". These are not things that we attain on our own effort though. These are gifts as St. Paul says. They are gifts which God freely bestows upon those who ask for them. So let us begin to ask for more in our relationship with God. Let us not settle for a relationship of do's and don'ts but rather for the depths of loving relationship with God. Relationship which will bring with it enjoyment, pleasure and delight.

The Voyage of Life is a series of four paintings created by the American artist Thomas Cole in 1840 and reproduced with minor alterations in 1842, representing an allegory of the four stages of human life. The paintings, Childhood, Youth, Manhood, and Old Age, depict a voyager who travels in a boat on a river through the mid-19th-century American wilderness. In each painting the voyager rides the boat on the River of Life accompanied by a guardian angel. The landscape, each reflecting one of the four seasons of the year, plays a major role in conveying the story. With each installment the boat's direction of travel is reversed from the previous picture. In childhood, the infant glides from a dark cave into a rich, green landscape. As a youth, the boy takes control of the boat and aims for a shining castle in the sky. In manhood, the adult relies on prayer and religious faith to sustain him through rough waters and a threatening landscape. Finally, the man becomes old and the angel guides him to heaven across the waters of eternity.



STORY OF SAINT RITA OF CASCIA

FEAST DAY: MAY 22ND

Like Elizabeth Ann Seton, Rita of Cascia was a wife, mother, widow, and member of a religious community. Her holiness was reflected in each phase of her life.

Born at Roccaporena in central Italy, Rita wanted to become a nun but was pressured at a young age into marrying a harsh and cruel man. During her 18-year marriage, she bore and raised two sons. After her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons had died, Rita tried to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Unsuccessful at first because she was a widow, Rita eventually succeeded.

Over the years, her austerity, prayerfulness, and charity became legendary. When she developed wounds on her forehead, people quickly associated them with the wounds from Christ's crown of thorns. She meditated frequently on Christ's passion. Her care for the sick nuns was especially loving. She also counseled lay people who came to her monastery.


Beatified in 1626, Rita was not canonized until 1900. She has acquired the reputation, together with Saint Jude, as a saint of impossible cases. Many people visit her tomb each year.

Reflection

Although we can easily imagine an ideal world in which to live out our baptismal vocation, such a world does not exist. An "If only" approach to holiness never quite gets underway, never produces the fruit that God has a right to expect. Rita became holy because she made choices that reflected her baptism and her growth as a disciple of Jesus. Her overarching, lifelong choice was to cooperate generously with God's grace, but many small choices were needed to make that happen. Few of those choices were made in ideal circumstances—not even when Rita became an Augustinian nun.


