

THE STILLPOINT OF A DANCING WORLD

Rest. It is something that is essential for us as human beings. And oftentimes, in our lives, in ironic counterpoint, we put greater emphasis and thus, a higher valuation, on our labor.

The things we spend our time working towards and where we place all of our energy are given a great importance and rightly so. The things we give our effort and energy to show what is important to us and give us purpose in our lives. If all we do is expend energy and effort though we won't get very far.


In athletics, it is not just your training that is important. Equally as important is the rest that a person takes. The time spent recovering has a huge impact on one's ability to regain strength and energy. It is like this in our spiritual life as well. There are moments in our lives where we will give much of our effort and energy. We need to remember though how important it is to rest. If we do not rest we will not have the energy to be able to move forward in life.

As Christians then, it is important to know where we find our rest. In the context of this reflection, this Rest is only found in the presence of the Lord. In Psalm 46:10 the psalmist says, "be still and know that I am God". It is in stillness that we rest as Christians. It is in stillness and silence that we enter into the presence of God who renews, refreshes and gives us rest. Learning to sit in silence and recognize the presence of God is so important for us all. Without this place where we can rest and find renewal, living the Christian life is impossible.

Silence can often be a difficult thing for us as modern persons. We have so much input from different sorts of media that, even when we are able to get away from all of the external noise, our minds and our hearts are not at rest. They are caught up with the many words, ideas and images which have been barraging us. This is why it is so important to begin to cultivate a time of silence in our lives where, each day, we become aware of the restful presence of God. It is this rest, which is an awareness and a lived experience of God's presence that we are invited into. Without it our inner life becomes so weighed down because we are not able to live from a place of rest.

God calls us to live from a place of rest. From this place of receptivity where we are not tired and exhausted Christians but Christians who are filled with life and vigor. So create some time for silence in your life, some time when you can begin to enter into the rest which Jesus calls us to when he says, "Take my yoke upon you... for my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:29–30).


PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS



Day 1: Wednesday, April 3, 2024 Overnight Flight Travel to the Holy Land on an inspirational journey that visits some of the most ancient sites in the world.

Day 2: Thursday, April 4, 2024 Tel Aviv, Israel - Tour Begins Your tour begins in Tel Aviv, a bustling city brimming with culture and history, situated on the Israeli Mediterranean coastline. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a dinner at your hotel. (D)

Day 3: Friday, April 5, 2024 Tel Aviv - Caesarea - Mount Tabor -Cana - Tiberias Travel to the walled city and Roman ruins of Caesarea. It was here that St. Peter converted the first pagan, Centurion Cornelius, to become a Christian, and where St. Paul was imprisoned for two years. Travel to Mount Tabor, the site of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Your day continues with a visit to Cana, the site of Jesus' first miracle, at a wedding feast. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the First Miracle, where you can opt to renew your marriage vows.* Arrive in Tiberias for a 2-night stay. (B, D)

Day 4: Saturday, April 6, 2024 Tiberias - Sea of Galilee - Tabgha - Capernaum - Tiberias This morning, travel to nearby Tabgha and visit the Church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and the Fishes, built to commemorate the miraculous feeding of five thousand. Stop at the Mount of Beatitudes for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Beatitudes. Continue to the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter, where Our Lord appeared to the apostles after His resurrection. In Capernaum, visit the church built over the ruins of St. Peter's house. Finally, visit Yardenit, the Jordan River baptismal site where you may opt to renew your baptismal vows.** Later this afternoon, take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, where many of the Apostles were fishermen and where Our Lord preached. Relax over dinner at a local restaurant featuring traditional Middle Eastern cuisine such as assorted appetizers and grilled meats. (B, D)





Day 5: Sunday, April 7, 2024 Tiberias - Nazareth - Bethlehem -Jerusalem In Nazareth, visit the Church of the Annunciation. Proceed to Bethlehem and enjoy a stop at Shepherds' Field, where the Angels appeared on the first Christmas night. Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Nativity, built on the birth site of Our Lord. *** Later. arrive in one of the holiest cities in the world, Jerusalem. (B, D)

Day 6: Monday, April 8, 2024 Jerusalem - Garden of Gethsemane Your visit to Jerusalem begins with a stop at the Church of the Pater Noster ("Our Father"), built on the traditional site where Jesus taught His disciples the Lord's Prayer. Next, make your way down the steep descent of the Palm Sunday route to the site where Our Lord wept over the city, now known as Dominus Flevit. Afterwards, reflect at the Church of All Nations, built over the rock on which Our Lord prayed the night before He was crucified. Visit the Garden of Gethsemane, the site of Christ's betrayal by Judas. Next, visit the Church of the Dormition (commemorating Our Lady's Assumption) and the nearby Hall of the Last Supper. Pause at Caiaphas' Palace – known today as St. Peter in Gallicantu - where St. Peter once denied Our Lord in one of its courts. This afternoon, travel to Ein Karem to visit the Church of St. John the Baptist, built over the Grotto of his birthplace, and celebrate Mass. (B, D)

Day 7: Tuesday, April 9, 2024 Jerusalem The day is yours to explore the city on your own. Perhaps you'll choose to take an optional excursion to Jericho, Bethany and the Dead Sea. No matter how you spend your day, gather in the evening with your fellow travelers to celebrate Mass. (B, D)

Day 8: Wednesday, April 10, 2024 Jerusalem, the Old City Follow in the footsteps of Our Lord today as you visit the Church of St. Anne, marking the place where the parents of the Blessed Mother lived. Pause for a moment of devotion close to St. Stephen's Gate, where the first Christian martyr was stoned to death. Continue to the nearby Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the paralytic, and see



BLESSED RAYMOND LULL

SAINT OF THE DAY FOR JUNE 26


Raymond worked all his life to promote the missions and died a missionary to North Africa.

Raymond was born at Palma on the island of Mallorca in the Mediterranean Sea. He earned a position in the king's court there. One day a sermon inspired him to dedicate his life to working for the conversion of the Muslims in North Africa. He became a Secular Franciscan and founded a college where missionaries could learn the Arabic they would need in the missions. Retiring to solitude, he spent nine years as a hermit. During that time he wrote on all branches of knowledge, a work which earned him the title "Enlightened Doctor."

Raymond then made many trips through Europe to interest popes, kings, and princes in establishing special colleges to prepare future missionaries. He achieved his goal in 1311, when the Council of Vienne ordered the creation of chairs of Hebrew, Arabic, and Chaldean at the universities of Bologna, Oxford, Paris, and Salamanca. At the age of 79, Raymond went to North Africa in 1314 to be a missionary himself. An angry crowd of Muslims stoned him in the city of Bougie. Genoese merchants took him back to Mallorca, where he died. Raymond was beatified in 1514 and his liturgical feast is celebrated on June 30.

Reflection

Raymond worked most of his life to help spread the gospel. Indifference on the part of some Christian leaders and opposition in North Africa did not turn him from his goal. Three hundred years later Raymond's work began to have an influence in the Americas. When the Spanish began to spread the gospel in the New World, they set up missionary colleges to aid the work. Saint Junípero Serra belonged to such a college.


