THE BLESSING OF MOTHERS

The woman who approached Jesus is described by the Gospel passage as a Canaanite. She was not a Jew. She was considered an outsider in Jewish society. Because of this, Jesus - in his response - compared her case to that of dogs waiting for food from the master of the house. Dogs were considered as "unclean animals."

In granting the woman's prayer for the healing of her daughter, Jesus gave credit to the woman's faith. More than this, though, the story evokes in me a reflection on something else: a mother's love.

The woman could have been a Canaanite, an outsider, someone whom the Jews considered "unclean" because of her religious background... but she had the heart of a great mother. She loved her daughter, as any other mother would, and she only wanted the best for ailing daughter. Amidst the possibilities of being rebuffed and rejected...she approached Jesus. She was willing to do all for her daughter who was blood of her blood, and flesh of her flesh. Her great motherly heart could have reminded Jesus about his own great mother. And Jesus' heart melted...and Jesus healed her daughter.

Yes, whoever you are, and whatever their characters...mothers with their big hearts... are blessings!

SPIRITUAL CHALLENGE

This month, let us challenge ourselves to arrive early to Mass and spend time recollecting our souls in preparation for the reception of Word and Sacrament during the liturgy. Secondly, instead of rushing out of the church after Mass, let us spend five extra minutes giving thanks to the Lord so that we may reap the interior fruits of the divine Gift we have just received.

"JUST A CLOSER WALK WITH THEE"

Jesus walks along, but he hopes for something: he desires our company, he hopes that we will fix our eyes on him. Perhaps he hopes to open the windows of my soul, of your soul, of each of our souls. How unattractive are those self-centered souls that strive and smile only inwardly. They make no sense! Yet, Jesus walks along expressing his hope through love and tenderness, so as to give us consolation, to dry the tears of our lives."

These words were part of an address that Pope Francis gave at World Youth Day two weeks ago in Lisbon Portugal. I had the privilege of leading a small group of young Catholics to participate in World Youth Day. For those of you who may not know what World Youth Day is, it is an event that Pope St. John Paul II began in the late 1980's in which millions of young Catholics from around the world come together to pray with the Holy Father and encounter Christ more deeply. My small group of 8 people was part of a larger group of 160 people that Jesus Youth America led. We brought young people on this pilgrimage so that they could be with the Holy Father as he spoke to them and prayed with them. It was an incredible experience of seeing how the Lord was working in the lives of so many young people and how Jesus is still calling people to himself.

At different points throughout the week we were able to hear from the Holy Father and to pray with him. One of the highlights of the whole event is when all the pilgrims gather for the Stations of the Cross on Friday with the Pope. Before the Stations of the Cross began the Pope gave a short reflection. At this point along with so many other addresses he gave during the week he called young people to walk with Jesus and draw close to him. To understand that he is the only person, the only thing that will fulfill their lives and give them meaning. It was a week of hearing the Holy Father call all the young people of the world to holiness.


For me though, I walked away with one very profound impression and it is that Jesus is alive inside of me. That his presence has never left me and will never abandon me. This World Youth Day was not an easy one. There were many things that

were not planned well and that made it a difficult experience. From poor and overcrowded accommodations, difficult access to food along with poorly planned crowd control it was a taxing and exhausting experience which, on the outside seemed like a failure. Through all the exterior struggles though there was a profound realization that the Lord was with us and not just in that moment but at every moment of our lives Jesus is with us.

So for me, hearing the Holy Father say that Jesus desires my company and hopes that I will fix my eyes on him was a beautiful reminder of what God was already doing within me. He was saying that he would never abandon me and asked me to never abandon him.

This is the truth of our lives, that Jesus is with us through it all and he wants us to stay with him through it all. No matter the good or the bad Jesus is with us and in us. All we need to do is keep our eyes fixed on him walking with him no matter what comes. May we all keep our eyes fixed on Jesus through all our sin, brokenness and weakness. Let us keep our gaze upon him and he will lead us to our heavenly home.

Religious Education

Dear Parents,

It is that time again to register for 2023-2024 Religious Education Classes (CCD). Attached you will find the Registration Form. It is important that you complete all sections especially the **EMERGENCY CONTACT Info. in the top right-hand corner**. We must have a contact phone number and email address for you to provide you updated information throughout the school year.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES & REMINDERS

Registration Form: Complete a Registration Form for each child in your family.

Sacramental Grades: 1st & 2nd, 8th & 9th. Preparation for the sacraments of Reconciliation & First Holy Communion and Confirmation is a two-year process. Therefore, students must complete first and second grade Religious Education classes before receiving First Holy Communion. Likewise, students must complete eighth and ninth grade classes before receiving Confirmation. The sacraments are a tremendous grace from God, which necessitate a thorough preparation before reception. **If you have a child in grades 9-12 who did not attend Religious Education classes or a Catholic school last year, your child will need to enroll in our eighth-grade prep class this year.** Please let us know if your child needs to be baptized, this is the first sacrament they must have prior to First Communion. We will make special arrangements to have your child baptized.

If your child is in 8th grade or higher and has not yet received Reconciliation or First Holy Communion, they will need to enroll in their grade as well as the Sacramental Preparation Class. They will need to **MEMORIZE the following prayers: Glory Be, Hail Mary, Our Father, Act of Contrition, Invitation to Communion & The Ten Commandments.** Your child will be tested verbally along with written tests to ensure they know the prayers. So please begin now working with your child. Otherwise, a lot of time is taken during each class to ensure that all students know them individually. Please make sure you get a copy of the Prayer List and Parent Letter so your child comes to class already knowing the prayers!

Baptismal Certificates: Include a Baptismal Certificate for all students receiving a Sacrament (2nd grade: Reconciliation & First Holy Communion, 9th grade Confirmation)

Fee: \$25.00 per student and may be paid by credit card through the office or in cash or check made out to Emmanuel Catholic Church. You may make one check for multiple students, just list the students name on the notation part of the check. Please attach payment to the Registration Form.


