A JEALOUS GOD

""You shall not bow down to any other god, for the LORD—"Jealous" his name—is a jealous God ". Exodus 34:14.

"You shall not make for yourself an idol or a likeness of anything in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or serve them.d For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God " Exodus 20:4-5

The two passages above can seem rather jarring at first glance. We have all been told since our childhood that jealousy is a bad thing. So why is God, in these two passages saying that he is jealous of Israel, and by extension, of us? Is God committing some sort of sin? To answer this question we have to ask ourselves what the nature of jealousy is. Oftentimes, when we think of jealousy, we are thinking of one person being jealous of another for something that they have or possess. That person is prettier than I am, that person has more opportunities than I have, that person is stronger and more athletic than I am, etc. In this sort of jealousy what is wrong is that one person is desiring for themselves something that doesn't belong to them. The good looks, the opportunities and the strength of the other person do not belong to one they belong to the other. This is the sort of jealousy that we have always been told is wrong and sinful.

This is not the sort of jealousy that God has though. The sort of jealousy that God has is not about what doesn't belong to him. Instead it is about what does belong to him. Have you ever seen a husband or a wife who is jealous of their spouse? Maybe you've experienced it. Sometimes it can be the first kind of jealousy. It is a sinful and unflattering jealousy. Sometimes it is different though . It is more like the jealousy that God has. The attention that one spouse should be giving to the other ends up going to someone or something else that does not have a rightful claim.

This is the sort of jealousy that God has towards us, his people. There are certain things which God rightly expects and when they don't happen he becomes jealous. The thing which God becomes jealous about is worship. We can see throughout the Old Testament how, whenever anything bad happened to Israel it was because they had stopped worshiping the Lord and had turned away from giving to God what was rightfully his. This can still sound a lot like God is jealous in the first way that we were speaking about. It sounds like God is angry that he is not getting something he wants just like Billy is jealous and angry when he doesn't get the cookie he wants. What we need to do though is understand in a new way what worship is. Very often we can think of worship as something we choose to do or not do. If we worship we might feel good, or something good might happen to us. This is a pagan way to worship. It is transactional. I put something in and I get something out. This is not the way in which the God of Abraham, Issac and Jacob is worshiped though. God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The worship of God, not as the pagans worship, but as the one and only God is to be worshiped is about rightly ordered relationship. It is about being in conversation with God, drawing close to him, knowing who he is. Knowing his love and mercy along with his wrath and anger. Knowing that he is a God who wants us for himself out of a jealous love. He is in love with us as a young man is in love with a woman and wants her for himself. It is not a controlling or self-centered way. Rather it is wanting in an exclusive way. A way in which both parties know that they are wanted and desired for who they are.

This is the jealousy of God for us and it is why worship belongs to him alone. Only God who is Lord deserves to have the place of worship within our lives and hearts. Oftentimes we can let other things or people take the place of God. We can worship at other altars, many of which may seem appealing and even good. We can worship at the altar of success or of helping others, of pleasure seeking and of working hard, of taking care of our children and of our friendships. Any of these things when they take a higher place than the worship of God become an altar of false worship.

It is these altars of false worship that God becomes jealous of. He desires us to rightly order our lives so that we may know and experience his love. "For as a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; And as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you." Isaiah 62:5. The Lord loves us jealously, may we return to the true worship of God.

DIOCESE OF SORSOGON (PHILIPPINES) Mission Appeal 2023

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Sorsogon is a local Church in Region V of the Philippine Archipelago which was established in June 29, 1951 pastoring 30 parishes and 2 mission stations. Its current bishop is the Most Rev. Jose Alan V. Dialogo, DD, who took office in 2019. Until now, our diocese has been known as one of the poorest in the country. One of our pressing concerns is to raise funds for the consistent support of the retirement of the clergy and the continuous operations of our provincial seminaries (Our Lady of **Peñafrancia Seminary**) which has now three departments: High School, Philosophy and Theology Departments.

In the summer of 2006, the Diocese under the care of Bishop Emeritus Arturo M. Bastes, SVD, preceding Bp. Dialogo, has established the Home for the Clergy, located at the Our Lady of Peñafrancia Seminary Compound at Bibincahan, Sorsogon City. Its purpose is to serve as "a living quarter of our retired, elderly and sickly priests but also a Home for Formation" (Bp. Bastes). It has been welcoming some of our retired priests for 17 years now since its establishment. This beautiful place of respite for our elderly priests is one of the many ways to thank them for their long years of pastoral service for the faithful of the local church but on the one hand it is not enough. The diocese is still looking for many different ways to organize the retirement plan for our priests with health care programs and pension benefits as its top priorities.

Furthermore, our seminary has long been standing for more than 75 years since it was founded in 1945, six years before the Diocese of Sorsogon was even established. It is indeed struggling to support itself since the institution depends primarily from the meager contributions of the seminarians and the relative amount of donations from the region. It is even more challenging now that a new department, the Theology Department, which was just erected in the year 2020 during the height of the pandemic, is being equally sustained. In addition, the Philosophy Department is currently undergoing chapel renovations approximately amounting to 1.5 million pesos (about 27, 000 dollars).

With these present conditions, there is an utmost urgency to seek help and support from foreign missions to enable our local church to concretely respond to these serious concerns. The diocese has been sending mission appeals abroad for the past several years which only proves that she is still a developing infant church which truly needs generous assistance.



As we head into a new school year, let us pray that our Heavenly Father will fill our teachers, faculty, educators, and parents with a spirit of patience and understanding. He sent us his Son to teach us by word and example that true wisdom comes from him alone. Registration Form: Complete a Registration Form for each child in your family.

Sacramental Grades: 1st & 2nd, 8th & 9th. Freparation for the sacraments of Reconciliation & First Holy Communion and Confirmation is a two-year process. Therefore, students must complete first and second grade Religious Education classes before receiving First Holy Communion. Likewise, students must complete eighth and ninth grade classes before receiving Confirmation. The sacraments are a tremendous grace from God, which necessitate a thorough preparation before reception. If you have a child in grades 9-12 who did not attend Religious Education classes or a Catholic school last year, your child will need to enroll in our eighth-grade prep class this year. Flease let us know if your child needs to be baptized, this is the first sacrament they must have prior to First Communion. We will make special arrangements to have your child baptized.

If your child is in 3rd grade or higher and has not yet received Reconciliation or First Holy Communion, they will need to enroll in their grade as well as the Sacramental Preparation Class. They will need to MEMORIZE the following prayers: Glory Be, Hail Mary, Our Father, Act of Contrition, Invitation to Communion & The Ten Commandments. Your child will be tested verbally along with written tests to ensure they know the prayers. So please begin now working with your child. Otherwise, a lot of time is taken during each class to ensure that all students know them individually. Please make sure you get a copy of the Prayer List and Parent Letter so your child comes to class already knowing the prayers!

Baptismal Certificates: Include a Baptismal Certificate for all students receiving a Sacrament (2nd grade: Reconciliation & First Holy Communion, 9th grade Confirmation)

Fee: \$25.00 per student and may be paid by credit card through the office or in cash or check made out to Emmanuel Catholic Church. You may make one check for multiple students, just list the students name on the notation part of the check. Flease attach payment to the Registration Form.
