



ONE WAY, JESUS!

Often, when we come to church we hear about the love and the mercy of God. That God forgives us of our sins and has compassion upon us. And we need to hear this message over and over again in our lives since the love of God and forgiveness of our sins is central to the Gospel. It is at the core of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. In choosing to accept that love of God and enter into a life of faith we enter into the very life of Jesus, a life which included much suffering. In fact Jesus said that following him would make our lives more difficult, not less.

This is not a pleasant thing to accept though. As human beings we don't want to suffer. Even Jesus, in the Garden of Gethsemane, asked that the cup of suffering be taken away from him. To follow Jesus means that even in those moments where we are afraid, in pain, confused and don't know what to do we are called to rely on the love of God. That is what Jesus did in Gethsemane. He chose to accept the will of the Father which was for him to take up the cross. If Jesus underwent these things how could we expect anything less than what he received. It is why Jesus said "If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, the world would

love its own; but because you do not belong to the world, and I have chosen you out of the world, the world hates you. Remember the word I spoke to you, 'No slave is greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you. "John 15:18-20.

If we are Jesus' disciples then it means he is the master and we are his followers and we are called to imitate him in all things. That means that while we don't create suffering and pain we don't shy away from it when it comes our way. For as Jesus said, "I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world."

Jesus is supposed to be our peace. Even as the world hates us, despises us and persecutes us we are called to rest in Jesus. For HE has overcome the world! Jesus must become our everything. He is our only prize, our only peace, our only joy and consolation. Nothing else that the world offers us will ever satisfy. So let us not be discouraged when the world mocks us and puts us down for following Jesus. This is what we are supposed to expect. Let us take consolation in knowing that we have a master who has gone before us in all things and is with us even now.


Is It the Thought That Counts?

TO FOLLOW THE FOOTSTEPS OF GIANTS

08 EMMANUEL CATHOLIC CHURCH

St Francis of Assisi

The patron saint of Italy, Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally—not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.

Serious illness brought the young Francis to see the emptiness of his frolicking life as leader of Assisi's youth. Prayer—lengthy and difficult—led him to a self-emptying like that of Christ, climaxed by embracing a leper he met on the road. It symbolized his complete obedience to what he had heard in prayer: "Francis! Everything you have loved and desired in the flesh it is your duty to despise and hate, if you wish to know my will. And when you have begun this, all that now seems sweet and lovely to you will become intolerable and bitter, but all that you used to avoid will turn itself to great sweetness and exceeding joy."

From the cross in the neglected field-chapel of San Damiano, Christ told him, "Francis, go out and build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." Francis became the totally poor and humble workman.

He must have suspected a deeper meaning to "build up my house." But he would have been content to be for the rest of his life the poor "nothing" man actually putting brick on brick in abandoned chapels. He gave up all his possessions, piling even his clothes before his earthly father—who was demanding restitution for Francis' "gifts" to the poor—so that he would be totally free to say, "Our Father in heaven." He was, for a time, considered to be a religious fanatic, begging from door to door when he could not get money for his work, evoking sadness or disgust to the hearts of his former friends, ridicule from the unthinking.

But genuineness will tell. A few people began to realize that this man was actually trying to be Christian. He really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (Luke 9:1-3).

Francis' first rule for his followers was a collection of texts from the Gospels. He had no intention of founding an order, but once it began he protected it and accepted all the legal structures needed to support it. His devotion and loyalty to the Church were absolute and highly exemplary at a time when various movements of reform tended to break the Church's unity.

Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favor of the latter, but always returned to solitude when he could. He wanted to be a missionary in Syria or in Africa, but was prevented by shipwreck and illness in both cases. He did try to convert the sultan of Egypt during the Fifth Crusade. During the last years of his relatively short life, he died at 44, Francis was half blind and seriously ill. Two years before his death he received the stigmata, the real and painful wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side.

On his deathbed, Francis said over and over again the last addition to his Canticle of the Sun, "Be praised, O Lord, for our Sister Death." He sang Psalm 141, and at the end asked his superior's permission to have his clothes removed when the last hour came in order that he could expire lying naked on the earth, in imitation of his Lord.

Reflection

Francis of Assisi was poor only that he might be Christ-like. He recognized creation as another manifestation of the beauty of God. In 1979, he was named patron of ecology. He did great penance—apologizing to "Brother Body" later in life—that he might be totally disciplined for the will of God. Francis' poverty had a sister, Humility, by which he meant total dependence on the good God. But all this was, as it were, preliminary to the heart of his spirituality: living the gospel life, summed up in the charity of Jesus and perfectly expressed in the Eucharist.





Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

Sunday, October 1, is *Respect Life Sunday* which initiates October as *Respect Life Month* as well as the annual Respect Life Program entitled this year, *Radical Solidarity*. While we are very grateful for the decision of the Supreme Court last year in reversing legalized abortion as a national mandate, since then we have experienced so much division in regard to issues dealing with the basic right to life on the political scene within our nation.

The focus of the abortion debate has now turned to the states and their laws pertaining to the legal prohibition or permission for abortion. There is a fundamental error in so far as the right to life is neither a federal nor state issue, it is a fundamental right given by God. Our nation came into existence on the foundation that the "right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" is granted to all persons by God. Once the right to life of an unborn child is questioned, the right to life of everyone is called into question. We have seen how this has become so prevalent in our culture today.

Radical Solidarity calls us to be united in the respect for the gift of life at all stages from the moment of conception until natural death. Radical Solidarity reminds us that we are one human family, and we need to join with each other in promoting the right to life as fundamental to who we are. Radical Solidarity calls us to provide loving assistance to mothers who find themselves in a difficult situation through an unexpected pregnancy as well as after the birth of their child. We are blessed in the Diocese of Palm Beach with the mission of our Catholic Charities which excels in this regard.

I am deeply grateful to the faithful men and women of our Diocese who demonstrate what *Radical Solidarity* is all about as it relates to the right to life. You join together in a witness that is loving, prayerful and supportive of the unborn child and of the life of everyone within our community. You make a tremendous difference in raising the conscience of our culture and in challenging our legal system especially by your example. May the Lord continue to bless you and all that you do. We all join together on this *Respect Life Sunday* in *Radical Solidarity* appreciating the right to life which God has given us.
