Real Presence

A family invited me for dinner, at one point, the mother called the attention of her daughter who was busy texting while we were eating. The mom candidly asked her, "Darling, are you with us?" The daughter replied, "Yes, Mom." The mom followed up, "Are you really present with us? Or you are just physically here but mentally out there? We need your real presence here now." I was struck by what she said particularly by the words "real presence." For us Catholics, the term real presence refers to the Eucharist. It is a doctrine of the Catholic Church that in the Eucharist the bread and wine are objectively transformed and become, in a real sense, the Body and Blood of Christ. Today's gospel reading is part of the long discourse in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel on the Bread of Life. For us Catholics, the Bread of Life is Christ in the Eucharist. In today's gospel reading, Jesus asserts, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever. . ." Do we understand the meaning and implication of this? One gospel commentary points out that in the Gospel of John, eating the Bread of Life encompasses the notions of believing in Jesus, obeying his commandments, hearing his voice, sharing in his life. Eating the Bread of Life means living in a manner where Christ is experienced as truly present in one's being. "Whoever eats this bread will live forever..." Is this Bread of Life still giving life to the world? Is it still giving life to us? How aware are we of being in the presence of the Lord when we are in the presence of the Living Bread and when we celebrate the Eucharist?

"I am the bread of life, and whoever comes to me will never hunger or thirst " The big question is: Do we want this bread? Do we want this bread of justice and peace? Do we want this bread of forgiveness and reconciliation?

Do we want this bread of communion with God and with one another? "Real Presence" must not be understood as a one sided thing. Yes, it refers to the fact that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist; but it also refers to the personal presence of the Lord among us. As such, it includes the issue of relationship that is, how we are relating to the presence of Jesus. The presence of the Lord in the Eucharist always calls out a response from us. If we want to make the Eucharist more meaningful and relevant to our lives, we have to see it from the point of view of giving more than receiving. Because sharing in the Eucharist means joining actively with Christ. The Eucharist is not just something we receive or benefit from; it is also something we bring and share to the needy.

The Eucharist is not just a ritual we exercise every Sunday; it is also a way of life for all of us. The Eucharist is not just a remembering of what Jesus did; it is also the source of our strength to do what Jesus did. May we always experience the real, personal and dynamic presence of the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist that we celebrate and receive. Let us allow the powerful presence of the Eucharistic Lord to transform and empower us to be food for others food that gives life to others, as Jesus did. 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven... the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.'

Statement on Equality

We have undertaken the opening of our churches in the Diocese of Palm Beach on the foundation of prayer, prudence, and patience to ensure the safety of all and to eliminate the pandemic of the coronavirus. Tragically, we also are in the midst of other destructive viruses which also requires prayer, prudence, and patience for their elimination. They are the virus of racism which continues to infect our nation and the virus of violence which has erupted in response to it. We must do all we can to eliminate the devastating destruction which these viruses cause to our great nation.

One of the blessings of our country is the right to express our opinion in a legitimate manner and the right to protest injustice and inequality in a legal manner. However, the employment of violence in such expression is of the same nature as the injustice and inequality of racism that is rightly being protested. When we encounter racism and violence, we are in the face of the most infectious forces of evil.

As Pope Francis recently stated, “We cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of every life. ... At the same time, we have to recognize that ‘the violence of recent nights is self-destructive and self-defeating. Nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost.’”

We pray in a very special way for George Floyd, his family and for all those afflicted by racism and violence. We join with and pray for all those seeking peace and healing within our nation and for those who offer their lives for the protection of others.

Reminder

As we start re-opening our vigil and Sunday masses, please follow the following protocols from our bishop which will be carefully observed for the common good of all.

1 - Appropriate social distancing will be observed. Except for families and couples. The member of the ministry of Hospitality and the Knights of Columbus are available in all masses to help accommodate this protocol.

2 - It is highly recommended that facemasks be utilized while in church except for the reception of Holy communion.

3 - Holy water fonts will remain empty.

4 - There will be no alter servers for the present time.

5 - Hymnals, missalettes and other liturgical aids will not be available.

6 - There will be no offertory procession for the presentation of the gifts. Collection boxes are available in our sanctuary, in the middle and in the back of our church to put your offerings before or after the mass.

7 - The line for the reception of Holy Communion will also follow appropriate distancing. The center aisle is marked with blue tapes. We will have three stations for Holy communion. At the front, middle and the back. For the safety of others as well the recipient, receiving the eucharist in the hand be employed at this time. Please understand this is for the common good. The priest, deacon or extraordinary minister will wear face masks for the distribution of Holy Communion. No gloves are to be worn by the ministers or recipient.

8 - The church and other venues for mass will be appropriately sanitized, hand sanitizer are available at the doors inside the church.

9 - No public gatherings before or after mass.

10 - Livestreaming mass in our church will continue. Every Sunday at 9:00 am for those who cannot go to the church for any reason.

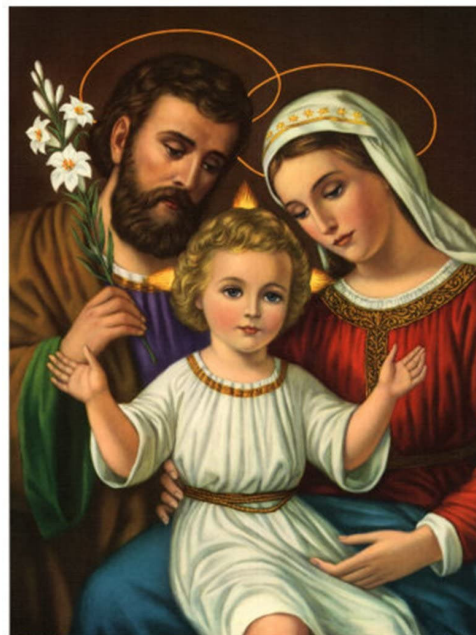


Devotions/Prayer Groups

Diocese of Palm Beach Catholics are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. This is meant to ensure the well-being and safety of all, not only the elderly and those who are at risk for illness, but anyone of any age who is making a prudent decision about their own well-being as well as that of others. Faithful are invited to continue to enjoy the weekly Televised Catholic Mass or attend their parish during the hours they are open.



Diocese of Palm Beach Phased Reopening of Churches and Safety Protocols:

- Wear facemasks during the Sacrament of Reconciliation and in your parish (with the exception of reception of Holy Communion).
- Social distancing will be observed, with spacing of 6 feet and use of every other pew (except for families and couples).
- Hand sanitizers and safety-wipes should be used.
- There will be no reception of the Precious Blood or sign of peace, greeting of peace or holding of hands during the Our Father.
