The Lord through the prophet Isaiah, expresses His enduring faith in His word believing they will eventually bear fruit in the hearts of men and women. The apostle Paul then asks the suffering Christians in Rome to also patiently wait for the glory promised by God. Jesus reiterates God's willingness to risk and wait as he sows His word on different soils hoping that what he sowed will come back fruitfully.

The four different soils are present in each of us. God patiently journeys with our progression to maturity in absorbing His word. At the first stage, we are indifferent to His word, unable to see its relevance in our lives. At the second stage, God's word penetrates a little. However, the many concerns that clog our heart and mind hinder His word to take root. At the third stage, we can already swallow God's word but it is not integrated yet in our life. At the last stage, we have become fertile recipients of His word and finally bear fruit.

We all have the full variety of ground in us. Some areas of our life are "good soil" and we truly show the fruits of God's spirit in our good deeds, but we also have thorny patches, and rocky areas where God's grace is either grudgingly accepted or find no home in us, or perhaps lacks the foundation to truly cultivate the good habits we need for a virtuous life. Perhaps we are proud or angry, unforgiving or unaccepting. Perhaps we can do this, but not that. We are in other words, complicated rather than unconditioned.

Let us also remember that the sower is sowing seeds without concern for where it lands. God does not have favorites. In the mystery of his love, he loves each one of us with an infinite, unconditional love.

So, let us pray that we might increase the good soil in us to truly hear and understand God's word and allow it to change our hearts. Amen.

Reminder

As we start re-opening our vigil and Sunday masses, please follow the following protocols from our bishop which will be carefully observed for the common good of all.

1 - Appropriate social distancing will be observed. Except for families and couples. The member of the ministry of Hospitality and the Knights of Columbus are available in all masses to help accommodate this protocol.

2 - It is highly recommended that facemasks be utilized while in church except for the reception of Holy communion.

3 - Holy water fonts will remain empty.

4 - There will be no alter servers for the present time.

5 - Hymnals, missalettes and other liturgical aids will not be available.

6 - There will be no offertory procession for the presentation of the gifts. Collection boxes are available in our sanctuary, in the middle and in the back of our church to put your offerings before or after the mass.

7 - The line for the reception of Holy Communion will also follow appropriate distancing. The center aisle is marked with blue tapes. We will have three stations for Holy communion. At the front, middle and the back. For the safety of others as well the recipient, receiving the eucharist in the hand be employed at this time. Please understand this is for the common good. The priest, deacon or extraordinary minister will wear face masks for the distribution of Holy Communion. No gloves are to be worn by the ministers or recipient.

8 - The church and other venues for mass will be appropriately sanitized, hand sanitizer are available at the doors inside the church.

9 - No public gatherings before or after mass.

10 - Livestreaming mass in our church will continue. Every Sunday at 9:00 am for those who cannot go to the church for any reason.

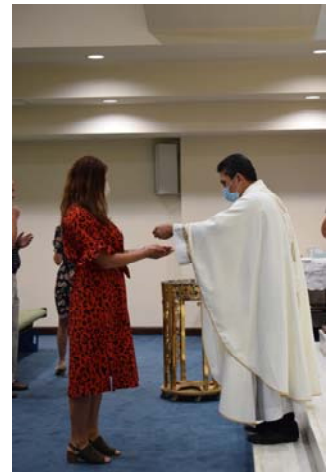

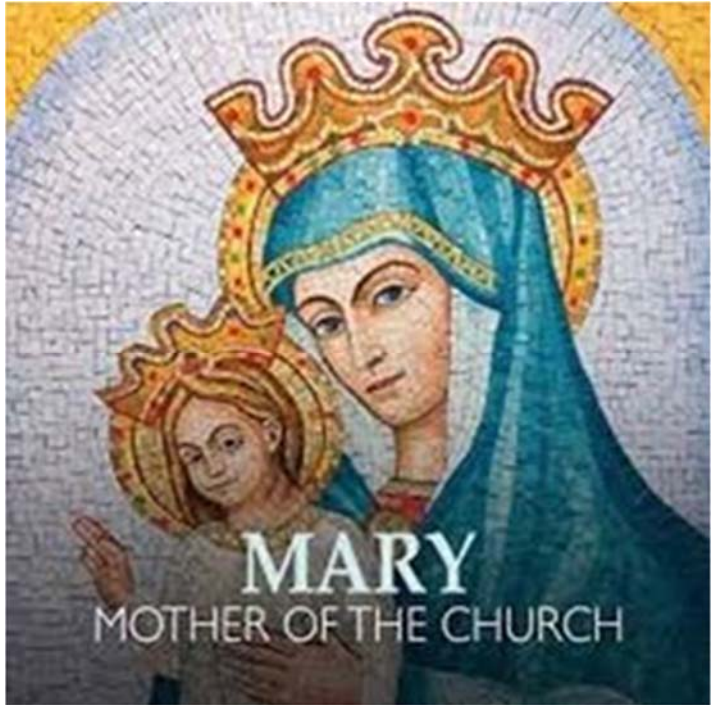

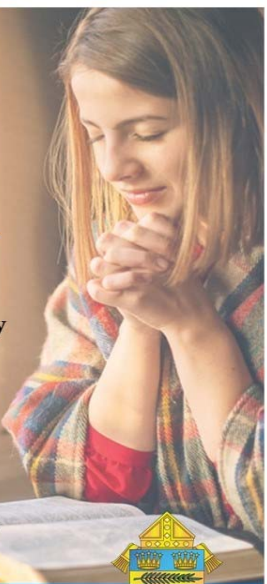


Diocese of Palm Beach Phased Reopening of Churches

Diocese of Palm Beach Catholics are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. This is meant to ensure the well-being and safety of all, not only the elderly and those who are at risk for illness, but anyone of any age who is making a prudent decision about their own well-being as well as that of others. Faithful are invited to continue to enjoy the weekly Televised Catholic Mass or attend their parish during the hours they are open.

Diocese of Palm Beach Phased Reopening of Churches and Safety Protocols:

- Wear facemasks during the Sacrament of Reconciliation and in your parish (with the exception of reception of Holy Communion).
- Social distancing will be observed, with spacing of 6 feet and use of every other pew (except for families and couples).
- Hand sanitizers and safety wipes should be used.
- There will be no reception of the Precious Blood or sign of peace, greeting of peace or holding of hands during the Our Father.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Natural Family Planning Awareness week is the annual national educational campaign sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) to promote Natural Family Planning (NFP). This year, NFP Awareness week be celebrated from July 19 through July 25 under the theme: *Live the truth and beauty of God's plan for married love!* The campaign offers us a wonderful opportunity to share the good news about God's perfect design for marriage and responsible parenting.

In sacramental marriage we are called to live with Christ-like love; to freely give of ourselves as a gift to our beloved. Married love is fundamentally a call to fruitfulness and, in response to this call, the Church proposes Natural Family Planning. Today's NFP provides a modern, scientific method available to couples for planning their families by enabling them to participate in God's creative action without breaking the inseparable link between the unitive and procreative meanings of the conjugal (marital) act. As NFP becomes a way of life, husbands and wives cooperate with each other and with God in responsibly planning their family and avoid the devastating spiritual and physical harm caused by artificial contraceptive methods.

During Natural Family Planning Awareness week, we also celebrate the 52nd anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae*. Issued in 1968 by Pope Paul VI, this encyclical prophetically articulates the grave consequences of the use of artificial and illicit means of birth control, including a general lowering of morality, increased infidelity, and devaluing of women (*HV*, no. 17). Unfortunately, today's headlines confirm the devastating accuracy of his predictions and demonstrate the destructive consequences for our families. In contrast, couples who practice NFP enjoy greater marital stability and suffer divorce at only a fraction of the rate of divorce among first time marriages overall.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank those married couples who live out their marriage commitment to free, total, faithful and fruitful love. I encourage all married couples and those preparing for marriage to reflect on their current or future marriages and how they can authentically and responsibly fulfill their commitment to fruitful love.
