## Do Not Fear

Yahweh says He is not found in any force of nature—windstorm, earth-quake, fire. He is more powerful than any force of nature. To be separated from Him, as Paul wrote to the Romans, is to face utter devastation. Our Gospel affirms that we will sink once we doubt God's power over the waters.

Reflect: The world is busy updating its powers. Information technology, transport engines, war crafts, political machineries. Yet, the more powerful they become, the more insecure they are. There lies the difference. World powers are upgraded to win believers. Faith, on the other hand, is increased to win powers. In our Gospel, Peter thought the battle is between the force of water and the force of God. But it is actually the water versus his faith. God could have held Peter against the pull of water. But He trusts that Peter's faith can over-come nature's pull. Unfortunately, Peter does not.

Many times in the Gospel, Jesus taught in parables. I find the Gospel event narrated today a "Living Parable." The sea with its unpredictable changes of weather is life. The boat of Peter is the Church. Peter, with his aggressive ways and challenging words to Jesus, is a mirror of each one of us.

In the Gospel, I am made to reflect on one striking reality: the real enemy of fear is not unbelief... but fear. Unbelief and doubts, as was in the experience of the apostle Thomas, leads one to search... to question, and therefore to look for answers. But fear paralyzes. It makes one lose direction, focus, and even hope. It throws us to panic... and depression. Hence, the Gospel underlines: when the disciples were in fear and panic because of the strong waves, they began to see a ghost even in Jesus. Likewise, when Peter allowed himself to be frightened by the big waves, he began to sink.

Fear, excessive fear that leads to despair, is often Satan's favorite strategy to snatch a person from a life of faith. With fear, a person begins to doubt not just God, but everything around him. To this, Jesus gives a good answer "Take courage, IT IS I." Knowing that God is with us, should be our greatest anchor in every life situation.

### Saint Lawrence's Story

The esteem in which the Church holds Lawrence is seen in the fact that today's celebration ranks as a feast. We know very little about his life. He is one of those whose martyrdom made a deep and lasting impression on the early Church. Celebration of his feast day spread rapidly.

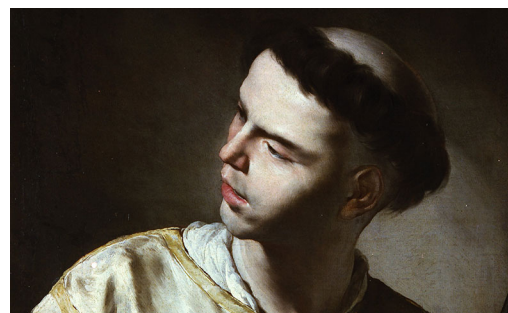
He was a Roman deacon under Pope Saint Sixtus II. Four days after this pope was put to death, Lawrence and four clerics suffered martyrdom, probably during the persecution of the Emperor Valerian.

Legendary details of Lawrence's death were known to Damasus, Prudentius, Ambrose, and Augustine. The church built over his tomb became one of the seven principal churches in Rome and a favorite place for Roman pilgrimages.

A well-known legend has persisted from earliest times. As deacon in Rome, Lawrence was charged with the responsibility for the material goods of the Church, and the distribution of alms to the poor. When Lawrence knew he would be arrested like the pope, he sought out the poor, widows, and orphans of Rome and gave them all the money he had on hand, selling even the sacred vessels of the altar to increase the sum. When the prefect of Rome heard of this, he imagined that the Christians must have considerable treasure. He sent for Lawrence and said, “You Christians say we are cruel to you, but that is not what I have in mind. I am told that your priests offer in gold, that the sacred blood is received in silver cups, that you have golden candlesticks at your evening services. Now, your doctrine says you must render to Caesar what is his. Bring these treasures—the emperor needs them to maintain his forces. God does not cause money to be counted: He brought none of it into the world with him—only words. Give me the money, therefore, and be rich in words.”

Lawrence replied that the Church was indeed rich. “I will show you a valuable part. But give me time to set everything in order and make an inventory.” After three days he gathered a great number of blind, lame, maimed, leprous, orphaned, and widowed persons and put them in rows. When the prefect arrived, Lawrence simply said, “These are the treasure of the Church.”

The prefect was so angry he told Lawrence that he would indeed have his wish to die—but it would be by inches. He had a great gridiron prepared with coals beneath it, and had Lawrence's body placed on it. After the martyr had suffered the pain for a long time, the legend concludes, he made his famous cheerful remark, “It is well done. Turn me over!”

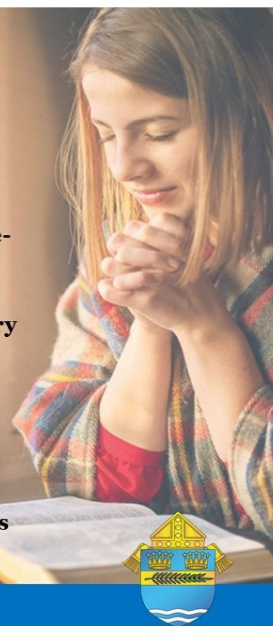


### Diocese of Palm Beach Phased Reopening of Churches

Diocese of Palm Beach Catholics are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. This is meant to ensure the well-being and safety of all, not only the elderly and those who are at risk for illness, but anyone of any age who is making a prudent decision about their own well-being as well as that of others. Faithful are invited to continue to enjoy the weekly Televised Catholic Mass or attend their parish during the hours they are open.

### Diocese of Palm Beach Phased Reopening of Churches and Safety Protocols:

- Wear facemasks during the Sacrament of Reconciliation and in your parish (with the exception of reception of Holy Communion).
- Social distancing will be observed, with spacing of 6 feet and use of every other pew (except for families and couples).
- Hand sanitizers and safety wipes should be used.
- There will be no reception of the Precious Blood or sign of peace, greeting of peace or holding of hands during the Our Father.
