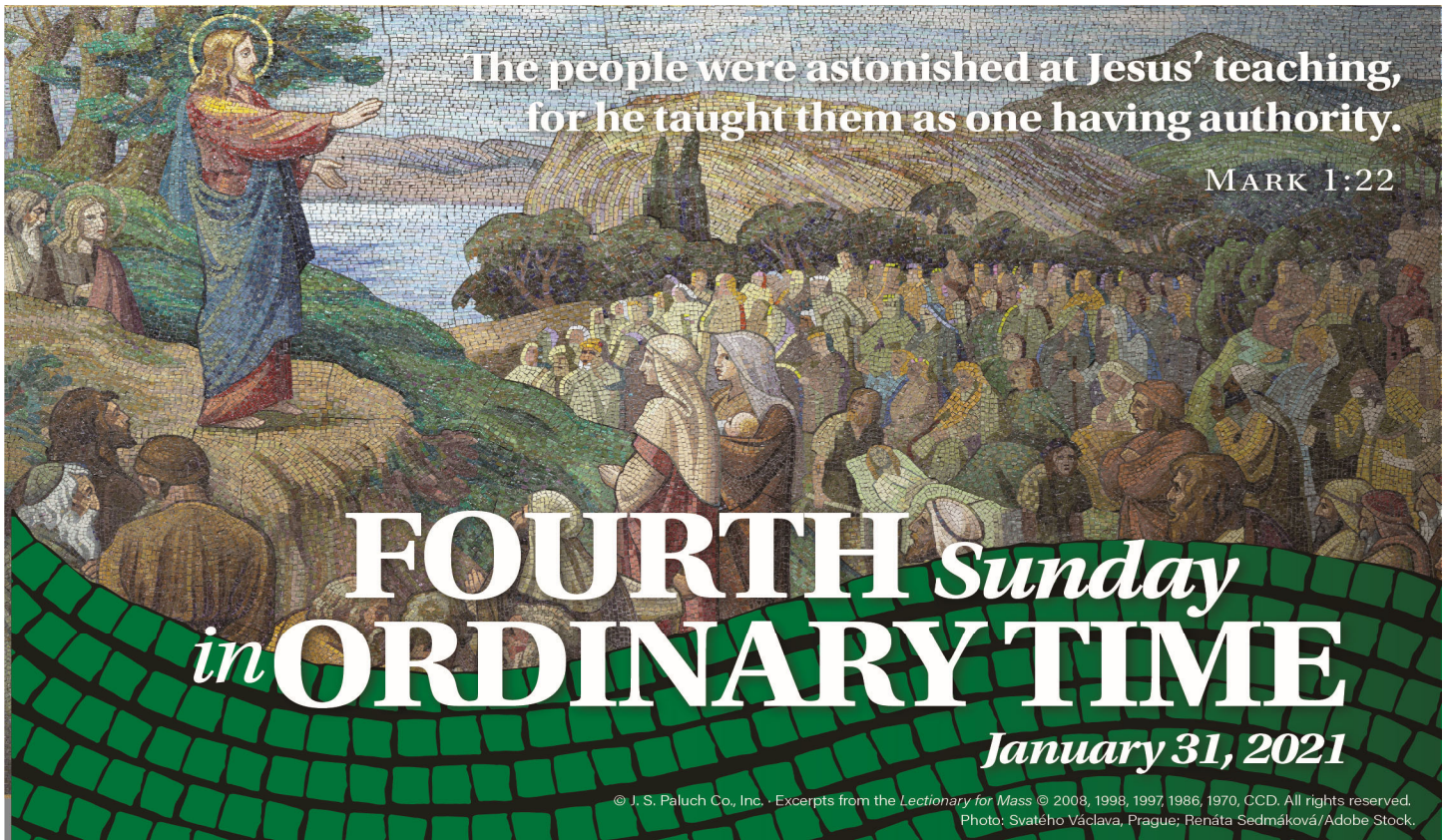

**Fourth Sunday In Ordinary Time (B)**  
**January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021**  
**Dt 18: 15-20 / Ps 95: 1-2,6-9 / 1 Cor 7: 32-35**

As we know, those in the highest position in the Jewish Church were the priests: then came the scribes. All these men were well educated knowing the Bible and Jewish laws well. Now, when they taught the people, they would give weight to what they said by quoting some respected person. For example, they might say, "Moses said we should only worship one God. Therefore, do not worship idols." Jesus also frequently quoted from scripture as they did, but he did not rely on authorities of the past. In fact, being the Son of God and an authority in himself, he often went far beyond what they said. He would say, for example. "You have heard it said, 'Love your neighbor, hate your enemy.' But what I say is this: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. In this way you will be sons of your heavenly Father" (Mt 5:43-44).

When the people heard this, they were amazed. No one had ever spoken like this before. We can imagine they were even more deeply impressed when, immediately after teaching in the synagogue, Jesus cured a man with an unclean spirit. "They began to ask one another: 'what does this mean? Here is a completely new teaching! He gives orders to unclean spirits and they obey him!"

Where did Jesus get this power? What was its source? The answer, of course, is obvious. He got his power through his faith. His faith in God the Father was so strong, he never doubted that he could perform any kind of miracle he chose to. Today's Gospel story is but one example. It is significant, I think, that the man who is possessed by an unclean spirit is in a Jewish synagogue. How long had he been going there? We don't know. But perhaps he went there precisely because, being a holy place, he hoped to find a cure there. But the Jewish priests were not able to cure him. Mark tells us that the man in the synagogue, seeing Jesus, shrieked: "What do you want of us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Seeing this, Jesus rebuked him sharply: "Be quiet! Come out of the man!" At that the unclean spirit convulsed the man violently and with a loud shriek came out of him.

What can we learn from all this? When we believe in God, we become strong. Why? Because the power of God enters our heart and gives us strength. It is because of this strength that we are able to overcome all difficulties. Because we are aware that God lives in our heart, we are able, even in the midst of great problems, to remain calm, even joyful. This gives us an incentive to pray often, indeed, to pray all the time. We pray after we rise in the morning. We pray during the day. We pray when we are working, and before we retire in the evening. Our whole life becomes a continuous turning to God, whether it be to praise Him for His goodness to us, to thank Him for His blessings, or to ask for His help. May we always keep the words of the psalmist in mind: "The Lord is the strength of my life" (Ps. 27:1). And may our prayers give us confidence to do great things for God.

### Saint Blaise Saint of the Day for February 3

We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise by Christians around the world than we know about the saint himself. His feast is observed as a holy day in some Eastern Churches. In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise's feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing for their throats.

We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary *Acts of St. Blaise* were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were first surprised and then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears.

The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.

Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. The first time Blaise refused, he was beaten. The next time he was suspended from a tree and his flesh torn with iron combs or rakes. Finally, he was beheaded.

#### Reflection

Four centuries give ample opportunity for fiction to creep in with fact. Who can be sure how accurate Blaise's biographer was? But biographical details are not essential. Blaise is seen as one more example of the power those have who give themselves entirely to Jesus. As Jesus told his apostles at the Last Supper, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you" (John 15:7). With faith we can follow the lead of the Church in asking for Blaise's protection.

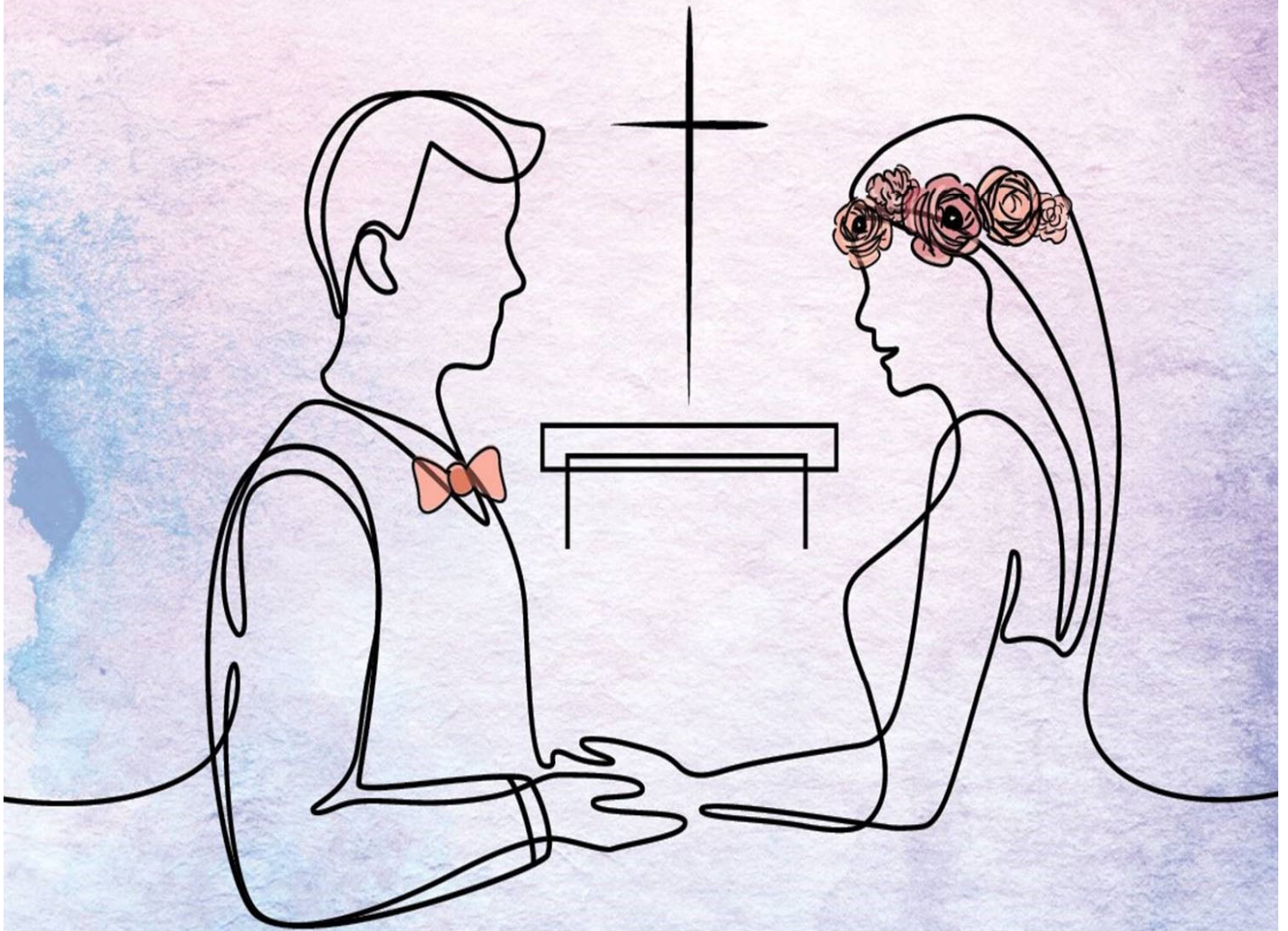
