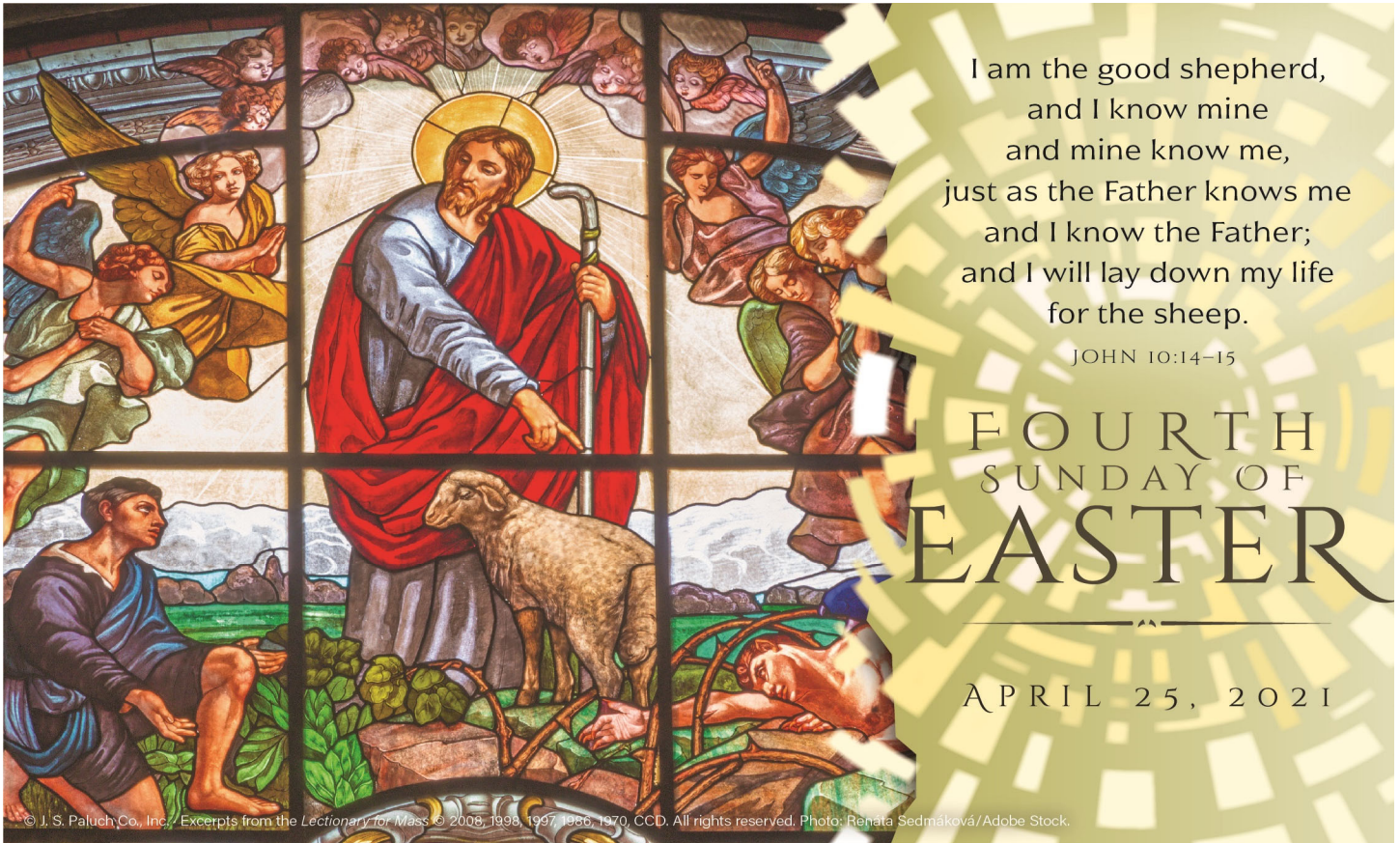

Fourth Sunday of Easter

April 25th, 2021

Acts 4: 8-12 / Ps 118: 1,8-9,21-23,26,28,29 / 1 Jn 3: 1-2 / Jn 10: 11-18

A couple celebrated their silver wedding anniversary. After the ceremony, the man was seen crying. The priest approached him and said, "You should not be crying. You should be happy because you have reached twenty-five years of marriage." "That is really what I'm crying about," the man explained. "You see, the lawyer-father of my wife threatened me that he would lock me up in jail for twenty-five years if I would not marry his daughter." "Why are you crying? Put it behind. Forget the past, face tomorrow," advised the priest. But the man responded, "That is the reason why I'm sad. If I had decided to be behind bars, for twenty-five years, I would have been free tomorrow."

By declaring himself as the Good Shepherd, and us, his sheep, Jesus enunciated his love for us. To proclaim one's love is a difficult thing. We know that lovers have to suffer in loving.

I am the Good Shepherd. I am willing to lay down my life for you, he declared to us. And he tells us also: "Love one another as I have loved you ... As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you."

Christ invites us this Sunday to be loving shepherds to one another, willing to pay the price of love. Husbands and wives, parents and children, all of us in our community: we are called upon to imitate the love of God, the courage to stand up for that love, the willingness to serve, and to work for unity. We must not act as wolves that snatch and scatter the sheep entrusted to us. We are challenged to be shepherds by leading one another to the fold of Christ, the good shepherd.

Too often, when we face difficulties and hardships and approach Jesus for help, we think of him as someone who is able, because of his power, to somehow "swoop down" and change the situation for us, to solve the problem or to just make it go away. He is of course, more than able to do that. But how often do we think of Jesus as someone who is "present" with us, walking with us, accompanying us, comforting and consoling us, when the storms of life come our way? The readings for Mass today remind us that Jesus, the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep, is also the ever-present friend who never leaves us to face our perils alone, but is always there to assure us that no matter what, our life is in God's hands, and nothing can ever truly harm us.

May we be one family who hear and follow Christ. May we understand and love him more so that we may carry on his love, the selflessness of his love, to be truly good shepherds like him.

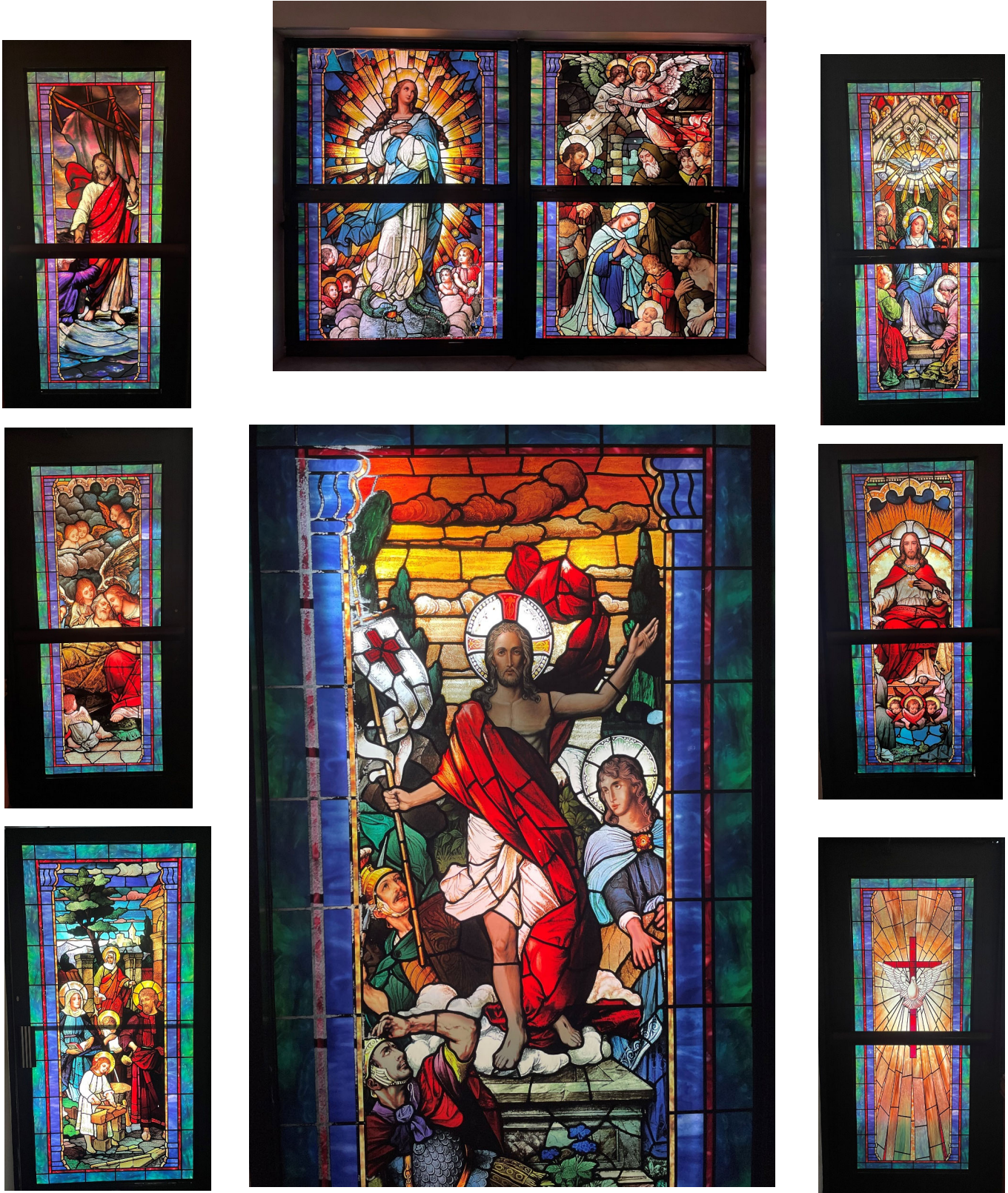

Saint Mark's Story

Most of what we know about Mark comes directly from the New Testament. He is usually identified with the Mark of Acts 12:12. When Saint Peter escaped from prison, he went to the home of Mark's mother.

Paul and Barnabas took him along on the first missionary journey, but for some reason Mark returned alone to Jerusalem. It is evident, from Paul's refusal to let Mark accompany him on the second journey despite Barnabas's insistence, that Mark had displeased Paul. Because Paul later asks Mark to visit him in prison, we may assume the trouble did not last long.

The oldest and the shortest of the four Gospels, the Gospel of Mark emphasizes Jesus's rejection by humanity while being God's triumphant envoy. Probably written for gentile converts in Rome—after the death of Peter and Paul sometime between A.D. 60 and 70—Mark's Gospel is the gradual manifestation of a "scandal": a crucified Messiah.

Evidently a friend of Mark—calling him "my son"—Peter is only one of this Gospel's sources, others being the Church in Jerusalem (Jewish roots), and the Church at Antioch (largely gentile).

Like another Gospel writer Luke, Mark was not one of the 12 apostles. We cannot be certain whether he knew Jesus personally. Some scholars feel that the evangelist is speaking of himself when describing the arrest of Jesus in Gethsemane: "Now a young man followed him wearing nothing but a linen cloth about his body. They seized him, but he left the cloth behind and ran off naked" (Mark 14:51-52).

Others hold Mark to be the first bishop of Alexandria, Egypt. Venice, famous for the Piazza San Marco, claims Mark as its patron saint; the large basilica there is believed to contain his remains.

A winged lion is Mark's symbol. The lion derives from Mark's description of John the Baptist as a "voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3), which artists compared to a roaring lion. The wings come from the application of Ezekiel's vision of four winged creatures to the evangelists.

Reflection

Mark fulfilled in his life what every Christian is called to do: proclaim to all people the Good News that is the source of salvation. In particular, Mark's way was by writing. Others may proclaim the Good News by music, drama, poetry, or by teaching children around a family table.
