## The Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

June 20th, 2021

Jb 38: 1, 8-11 / PS 107: 23-26, 28-31 / 2 Cor 5: 14-17 / Mk 4: 35-41

In the Gospel today, we see Jesus again testing the faith of the disciples. However, the test now involves more than a verbal response; now the disciples face a physical danger. But let us first consider what happened just before this episode about the storm.

Before the storm occurred, Jesus had performed many cures. He had cured Peter's mother-in-law. Then he cured many people who were possessed by an evil spirit. After, that he cured a leper, then a paralytic, and then a man with a withered hand. This means that the disciples had witnessed Jesus' power many times. He was so powerful that he could cure any kind of sickness simply by saying a few words. Now we have the story of the storm.

Did Jesus know that there would be a storm before they boarded the boat? Yes, I think he did. Then why did he say to his disciples, "Let us cross over to the farther shore?" Jesus wanted to test their faith. As just mentioned, they had seen him performing awesome miracles, so they knew that he had special power. But, as we see so clearly here when the storm grows fierce, they panic. "Teacher," they cried, "doesn't it matter to you that we are going to drown?" Going to drown! Of course, Jesus would never let them drown. And so, he rebukes the wind and the sea, and calms the storm. Then he scolds his disciples. "Why are you so terrified? Why are you so lacking in faith?"

Why did the disciples lack faith? They lack faith because they forgot all the miracles that Jesus had previously performed. They lacked faith because their faith in Jesus had not yet gone deep into their hearts. But lest we put all the blame on the disciples, let us think of our own situation. Perhaps we too sometimes act just like them. In our past life, God has helped over and over. When we had a problem and called upon His name, He rescued us. But how easily we forget! And how worried we become whenever a new problem arises!

Let us put all our worries and anxieties in God's hand. And let us be aware of our need not to take our faith for granted, but to continue to deepen it. May we believe with all our heart that Jesus is always with us and eager to help us whenever we call upon his name.

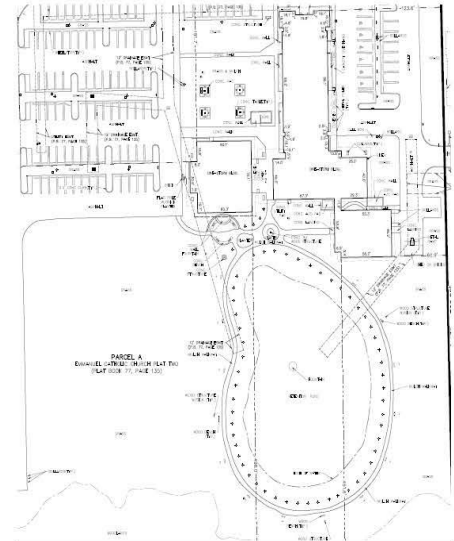

- **History 1989** Fr Hubert installed the Our outdoor Rosary path. It was intended to be a great way to grow your faith. Praying outdoors has the added benefit of providing a quiet, peaceful, healthy, environment to meet Jesus, learn his will for each and allow him to provide the path forward.
- **Today 2020-2021** The Rosary path has always experienced high foot traffic. However, during the past year, the number of people visiting, the frequency and length of visits has spiked.
- **What will it take to Restore Rosary path?**
  - *The mulch path was never intended to be permanent. Today nearly 32 years later there is a clear need to upgrade from Mulch to 5' Concrete sidewalk the entire 1,200'. \$47,852.00*
  - *Replace all dead landscaping sod, & vegetation \$3,684.00*
  - *The Crucifix -Wood beam is rotten, and need to remove Corpus replace the wood beams and reinstall \$2,311.00*

### St. Joseph is Patron Saint of Father's Day

*The Clergy of the Parish congratulate and wish all the Fathers, Grandfathers, Godfathers, and those who fulfill the role of a father on our Parish, a very happy, relaxing, and enjoyable Father's day.*

"If a person cannot find anyone to teach him how to pray, let him take this glorious saint for his guide, and he will not lose his way." – St. Teresa of Avila referring to St. Joseph

St. Joseph, husband of Mary and earthly father of Jesus, is the model of fatherhood. His faith and obedience to God inspired his devotion for his family. As we prepare to celebrate Father's Day on Sunday, June 20, it might be helpful to study his example. In "Five Lessons from St. Joseph," author Randy Hain points out attributes that serve as a helpful guide:

- ✦ St. Joseph was obedient.
- ✦ St. Joseph was selfless.
- ✦ St. Joseph led by example.
- ✦ St. Joseph was a worker.
- ✦ St. Joseph was a leader.

"Let's look to the inspiring example of St. Joseph, patron saint of fathers, workers and the Universal Church for his obedience, humility, selflessness, courage and the love he showed to Mary and Jesus. If we can emulate St. Joseph even a little each day, we will be that much closer to becoming the men we are called to be," Hain wrote.

St. Pope John Paul II highlighted St. Joseph to explain the Catholic understanding of fatherhood in his 1989 apostolic exhortation, *Redemptoris Custos* (Guardian of the Redeemer: On the Person and Mission of St. Joseph in the Life of Christ and the Church).

"Commending ourselves, then, to the protection of (St. Joseph) to whose custody God 'entrusted his greatest and most precious treasures,' let us at the same time learn from him how to be servants of the 'economy of salvation.' May St. Joseph become for all of us an exceptional teacher in the service of Christ's saving mission, a mission which is the responsibility of each and every member of the Church: husbands and wives, parents, those who live by the work of their hands or by any other kind of work, those called to the contemplative life and those called to the apostolate." (*Redemptoris Custos*, no. 32)

The significance of St. Joseph's presence in Jesus' life reminds us how important fathers are in our lives.

As Bishop Gerald M. Barbarito was very pleased to announce that the time had arrived for us in the Diocese of Palm Beach to return to a normal attendance in church by relaxing the pandemic safety restrictions which have limited us for over a year.
