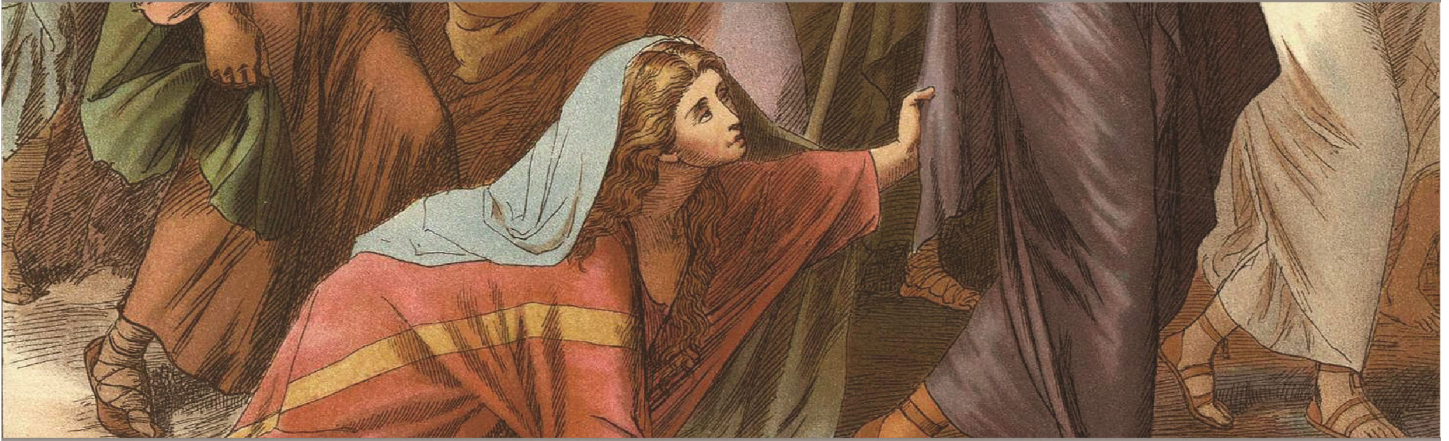

## Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

June 27th, 2021

Wis 1: 13-15 ; 2:23-24 / Ps 30: 2, 4-6, 11-13 / 2 Cor 8: 7, 9, 13-15 / Mk 5:21-43 or 5: 21-24, 35b-43

Two miracles are joined together so they can interpret each other. Both stories include the subject of faith, the issue of ritual purity, the question of life and death, the span of 12 years, and the power of God in Jesus.

The distraught father, a very prominent man, is an official of the synagogue, and his proper name is given. He comes to Jesus openly, throws himself at his feet, and pleads with him.

The unidentified afflicted woman, on the other hand, has been the victim of both her ailment and those who have attempted to heal her. Her funds have been depleted, and because of her hemorrhage she is ritually unclean. She does not presume to approach Jesus directly nor does she plead. Instead, she boldly violates both social and religious prohibitions. These she does by deliberately touching Jesus. This is the only miracle story where Jesus does not initiate the cure.

Although the contrasts between the woman and the man are striking, in the most important issues they remain the same. Both the woman and the man act out of faith. They believe that Jesus has the power over sickness and death.

With these two miracles, the Gospel gives us a further glimpse on who Jesus really is. In the Gospel last Sunday, Jesus wields the power of the Creator. This Sunday he is shown to have the power over the forces of death. He stands not only as one who inspires awe but also as model of generosity after whom we can pattern our lives.

Jesus is interested in the well-being of everyone, even those not highly valued by society. He opposes death because he is committed to life. He willingly enters into battle with it, emerging victorious and celebrating his victory with others.

There is a quote from John's gospel which I love, where Jesus says this explicitly: "I came that they may have life and may have it abundantly (i.e. to an extent that is overflowing)." (Jn 10:10) We don't know what that might be like, but we have a sense of it in Jesus' resurrection. Heaven will be a sharing in his risen life, which is of course a sharing in God's own life. Pain and suffering will no longer exist, which today's gospel also tells us. That life will be characterized by peace, love, and joy.

Mark is showing us in today's gospel that the way to this life is through faith, not a dead faith which only says "I believe" but a living faith that we put into action. Notice, Jesus said to the woman he healed "daughter, your faith has saved you." And he said to the synagogue official Jairus: "Do not be afraid, just have faith." Notice, the people who laughed at Jesus, i.e. those without faith, were put out of the house.

Our faith leads to hope without which we are hopeless. And there is no joy without hope. Joy is built on hope. And our faith also leads to love which St. Paul is talking about today, a love that reaches out to those who are not as richly blessed as we are. Amen.

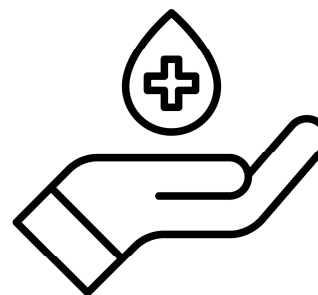

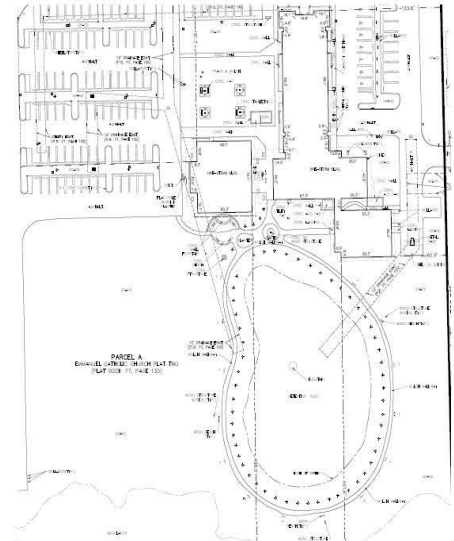

- **History 1989** Fr Hubert installed the Our outdoor Rosary path. It was intended to be a great way to grow your faith. Praying outdoors has the added benefit of providing a quiet, peaceful, healthy, environment to meet Jesus, learn his will for each and allow him to provide the path forward.
- **Today 2020-2021** The Rosary path has always experienced high foot traffic. However, during the past year, the number of people visiting, the frequency and length of visits has spiked.
- **What will it take to Restore Rosary path?**
  - *The mulch path was never intended to be permanent. Today nearly 32 years later there is a clear need to upgrade from Mulch to 5' Concrete sidewalk the entire 1,200'. \$47,852.00*
  - *Replace all dead landscaping sod, & vegetation \$3,684.00*
  - *The Crucifix -Wood beam is rotten, and need to remove Corpus replace the wood beams and reinstall \$2,311.00*

## Saint Thomas' Story

Poor Thomas! He made one remark and has been branded as “Doubting Thomas” ever since. But if he doubted, he also believed. He made what is certainly the most explicit statement of faith in the New Testament: “My Lord and My God!” and, in so expressing his faith, gave Christians a prayer that will be said till the end of time. He also occasioned a compliment from Jesus to all later Christians: “Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed” (John 20:29).

Thomas should be equally well-known for his courage. Perhaps what he said was impetuous—since he ran, like the rest, at the showdown—but he can scarcely have been insincere when he expressed his willingness to die with Jesus. The occasion was when Jesus proposed to go to Bethany after Lazarus had died. Since Bethany was near Jerusalem, this meant walking into the very midst of his enemies and to almost certain death. Realizing this, Thomas said to the other apostles, “Let us also go to die with him” (John 11:16b).

### Reflection

Thomas shares the lot of Peter the impetuous, James and John, the “sons of thunder,” Philip and his foolish request to see the Father—indeed all the apostles in their weakness and lack of understanding. We must not exaggerate these facts, however, for Christ did not pick worthless men. But their human weakness again points up the fact that holiness is a gift of God, not a human creation; it is given to ordinary men and women with weaknesses; it is God who gradually transforms the weaknesses into the image of Christ, the courageous, trusting, and loving one.
