Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)
July 18th, 2021
Jer 23:1-6 / Ps 23:1-6 / Eph 2:13-18 / Mk 6:30-34

Last Sunday's gospel ended with Jesus sending his apostles out to neighboring towns to preach repentance and heal the sick and drive out demons. Today's gospel begins with their return. They had much to tell Jesus. They must have been excited to have been able to do some of the same wonderful works they had seen Jesus do. But they were also worn out. Jesus said, "you need to rest," but they were not getting any rest where there were as so many people sought their ministry. Their escape from the crowd proved to be unsuccessful.

Two thoughts struck me that deserve further reflection. (1) Jesus told his apostles, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." The need for rest is something most of us can relate to. There is so little time and so much to do for most of us. Yet we need time to rest! There is even a law telling us to do so. The law says: "Keep holy the Lord's Day." We usually think that means go to church on Sunday (or Saturday night) and it does. But originally it also allowed people to take a day off. That commandment began as a gift to the Israelites who had just escaped from slavery. It told them they did not need to work seven days a week as they had to do as slaves. They were no one's property. They were free to take a day off and no one would punish them. They would give some of that day to God who created them and had done so much for them and the rest they could spend with their families. In today's gospel when Jesus said to the apostles: "Come away..." He was inviting them to take some time to relax *with him*. We do that when we come to Mass. We stop our busy-ness for about an hour, and we spend it with him. (2) Notice our Lord did not ask his apostles to teach the crowd. Jesus alone was the teacher. They did not know enough yet to teach. They were being trained to heal people and cast out demons and they could preach that people must repent of their sins. They would not be ready to teach until the Holy Spirit came upon them. We need to reflect that Jesus helped people not only by healing them but by teaching them. The Catholic Church continues Jesus' ministry of teaching in a variety of ways, not least of which is the Catholic School system. But learning about our God and about Jesus Christ does not end the day we leave the Catholic School. What we learned about our faith in school was just a little bit because it was all we could absorb at the time. We can recall what the Poet Alexander Pope said: "A little learning is a dangerous thing." The danger is that we assume we know enough about our faith. St. John of the Cross tells us no matter how many mysteries and wonders we come to understand about God, "... the greater still remains to be ... understood..." God is infinite and God's love is infinite. This is another good reason to come to Mass every Sunday and a good reason to spend time reading Scriptures. It is normal for people who follow Christ to consider themselves disciples of Christ. If you look up the word "disciple" in the dictionary, you will find it comes from the Latin word *dicere* which means "to learn." If we think we no longer need to learn any more about God and about Jesus Christ, then we should no longer call ourselves disciples. For with Christ, we are always in the process of learning.

Saint Mary Magdalene's Story

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. Yet she could well be the patron of the slandered, since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36-50.


Most Scripture scholars today point out that there is no scriptural basis for confusing the two women. Mary Magdalene, that is, “of Magdala,” was the one from whom Christ cast out “seven demons” (Luke 8:2)—an indication at the worst, of extreme demonic possession or possibly, severe illness.

Writing in the *New Catholic Commentary*, Father Wilfrid J. Harrington, O.P., says that “seven demons” “does not mean that Mary had lived an immoral life—a conclusion reached only by means of a mistaken identification with the anonymous woman of Luke 7:36.” In the *Jerome Biblical Commentary*, Father Edward Mally, S.J., agrees that she “is not...the same as the sinner of Luke 7:37, despite the later Western romantic tradition about her.”

Mary Magdalene was one of the many “who were assisting them [Jesus and the Twelve] out of their means.” She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the “official” witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

Reflection

Mary Magdalene has been a victim of mistaken identity for almost 20 centuries. Yet she would no doubt insist that it makes no difference. We are all sinners in need of the saving power of God, whether our sins have been lurid or not. More importantly, we are all “unofficial” witnesses of the Resurrection.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In sacramental marriage we are called to live with Christ-like love; an authentic love that is free, total, faithful and fruitful. In support of this call to married fruitfulness, the Church proposes Natural Family Planning (NFP) as a modern, scientific method available to couples for planning their families by enabling them to participate in God's creative action without breaking the inseparable link between the unitive and procreative meanings of the conjugal (marital) act. As NFP becomes a way of life, the couple cooperates with each other and God in responsibly planning their family without the devastating spiritual and physical harm caused by artificial contraceptive methods.

Natural Family Planning Awareness week, the annual national educational campaign sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is a wonderful opportunity for us to share the good news about God's perfect design for marriage and responsible parenting. This year, Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness week will be celebrated from July 25 through July 31 with the theme: *To Have, To Hold, To Honor* in support of *God's gifts of love and life in marriage*.

This week also celebrates the 53rd anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* in which Saint Pope Paul VI prophetically articulates the grave consequences of the use of artificial and illicit means of birth control. These consequences include a general lowering of morality, increased infidelity, and devaluing of women (*HV*, no. 17). One only needs to scan today's headlines to confirm the devastating accuracy of his predictions and discern the destructive consequences for families. In contrast, couples who practice NFP enjoy greater marital stability and experience divorce at only one-tenth the rate of divorce among first time marriages.

During NFP Awareness Week, I would like to thank those married couples who live out their marriage commitment to free, total, faithful and fruitful love. I encourage all married couples and those preparing for marriage to reflect on their current or future marriages and how they can authentically and responsibly fulfill their commitment to fruitful love.
