## Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

August 1st, 2021

Ex 16: 2-4, 12-15 / Ps 78: 3-4, 23-25, 54 / Eph 4: 17, 20-24 / Jn 6: 24-35

Last Sunday we read about the way Jesus fed a very large gathering of people with five loaves of bread and two fish. After that, he and the disciples crossed Lake Galilee. Today's Gospel tells us what happened after that. The people followed Jesus across the lake. When they met him, however, Jesus tells them frankly that they did not follow him because, believing he was the Messiah, they intended to grow spiritually. Rather, they merely wanted more food to eat.

The next part of the Gospel confirms this. Once again, they ask Jesus to act as Moses did and give them more bread. If he does this, they will believe in him. But then Jesus shocks them by saying: "I am the bread of life. No one who comes to me shall never be hungry, no one who believes in me shall thirst again." The words, "I am," are very significant. Let us examine this for a while.

When God appeared to Moses on top of Mount Horeb, Moses asked Him what His name was. Then God revealed to him that His name was "I am." Here too Jesus tells the people that, in fact, he is God. Like Moses, he can satisfy all their physical hunger. But because he is God, he wants to do much more. He wants to satisfy all their deeper longings and fill their hearts with his peace and joy.

Among other things, today's story tells us about the importance of signs. When Jesus fed the people with only a few loaves of bread, they accepted him as a kind of king. But then their enthusiasm soon wore off. When they met him the second time, they no longer thought of him as anyone special but merely as a kind of magician who could work magic and give them food. In other words, because their faith was weak, they were unable to see beyond and recognize Jesus as the Son of God.

God is always giving us signs. Every day He tries to show us that He is our Father and that He loves us. He does this through other people. And He does this through what we experience. However, we need faith and wisdom. We need faith in order to recognize the many signs of love God gives us each day. This is why we must be very alert, looking beyond our immediate experiences to see God's love for us in the signs He gives us. In the same way, we too must be signs for others. Like Jesus, we become bread for others, nourishing them by showing them signs of love.

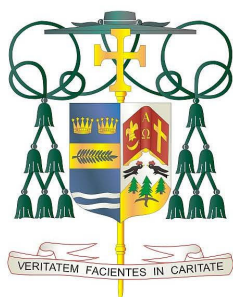
### Safe Environment

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

On August 7 and 8, our Diocese will have a second collection to benefit two areas of need: the Church in Latin America and the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa. The funds collected next weekend will be split between these two important areas and allow us to join in unity to support these communities outside of the United States.

For more than 50 years, the collection for the Church in Latin America has been an expression of unity and solidarity between Catholics in the United States and those in Latin America and the Caribbean. Catholics like you, from across the United States, have supported the formation of priests and religious, the training of catechists and other pastoral ministers, the education of children and young people, and relief efforts in the wake of natural disasters in this area. Next weekend's collection supports many pastoral projects that benefit the faithful in Latin America and the Caribbean, plus it allows you to stand in closer unity with refugees and those serving them.

The Solidarity Fund is an opportunity for our diocese to stand with the people of Africa.

Because of your generosity, our brothers and sisters in Latin America, the Caribbean and Africa will have the opportunity to grow in faith and answer the call of God. Through your financial gifts, as well as your prayerful remembrance, we join as one family of faith in making the Gospel of Jesus Christ known around the world.

### Saint John Vianney's Story

A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible. John Vianney was a man with vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

Situations calling for "impossible" deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney's most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God's people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil.

Who, but a man with vision, could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.

#### Reflection

Indifference toward religion, coupled with a love for material comfort, seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us to be pilgrim people, on our way to somewhere else. John Vianney on the other hand, was a man on a journey, with his goal before him at all times.
