

**Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)**  
**October 24th, 2021**  
**Jer 31: 7-9 / Ps 126: 1-6 / Heb 5: 1-6 / Mk 10: 46-52**

Jericho is a pretty city near where the Jordan river meets the Dead Sea. It is perhaps the oldest city in the entire world and the lowest. It is almost 1300 feet below sea level, whereas Death Valley, the lowest point in the western hemisphere is a mere 282 feet below sea level. On a map Jerusalem and Jericho are only 15 miles apart, but the trip from Jericho to Jerusalem would be all up hill, for you see, Jerusalem is over 2300 feet above sea level. At any rate, our gospel tells us Jesus was leaving Jericho. It doesn't tell us where he was going. But the very next paragraph in our bible tells us his next stop was Jerusalem where he would enter the Temple in grand triumph on the following Sunday, Palm Sunday. Six days later he would die on a cross. Prophetically, Bartimaeus anticipated the praise Jesus would receive in Jerusalem when he addresses Jesus as "Son of David", a royal title.

In the Gospel today, mark tells us something very important about faith.

First of all faith does not depend on a great amount of knowledge. The blind man, Bartimaeus, probably did not know Jesus very well. He only heard that he was the Son of David and that he cured some people somewhere. But this knowledge gave him great hope. He felt that Jesus could cure him too. And so when he heard that Jesus was passing by, he called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!"

Surely Mark also wants to tell us that our faith should be bold and courageous, like the faith of Bartimaeus.

When we pray, we should approach God with the same kind of confidence and trust.

There is another important point: the story also tells us that we must persevere when we pray, and never give up. This is what Bartimaeus did. He continued to call out to Jesus, and so Jesus called him to himself and cured him.

Finally, we learn that when we pray, we must ask God for specific things. Again, this is what Bartimaeus did.

When Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He answered, Rabboni, I want to see." Hearing this, Jesus gave him just what he asked for, his sight.

There is still one more important point. When Bartimaeus cried out to Jesus, the people scolded him and told him to be quiet. Isn't this ironical! Those who had eyes did not see. They did not realize that Jesus really wanted to heal people like this. And the one who was not able to see was the one who was much more aware of who Jesus was. And to understand his power to heal.

It goes without saying, then, that Mark is also trying to tell us about the importance of awareness and the need to know who we are.

Here we might ponder a few sample questions for a while. How aware are we of our own self? How aware are we of the way we react to people? How aware are we of the presence of God in our heart and in the hearts of the people around us?

Let us pray for wisdom and self-awareness. May we be like Bartimaeus, who knew who he was, a pitiful man before Jesus, the Son of David. And may we also know the powerful saving love of Jesus, who heals us of all our ills.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

As you may know, Pope Francis officially opened the *Synod on Synodality, Commission, Participation, Mission*, at the Vatican with the celebration of Mass this past Sunday, October 10. The Synod is taking place in three phases: the Diocesan phase, from October 2021 through April 2022, the Continental phase from September 2022 through March 2023, and the Ordinary Synod of Bishops, based on the consultation from the local and continental phases, at the Vatican in October 2023.

Mrs. Cathy Loh, the Director of our Marriage, Family Life, Faith Formation and Youth Ministry Office, is the Director of the Synod for our Diocese. You will be hearing more from her in regard to the specifics for the consultation to take place, the questions involved, and the process to be followed. Our Diocesan website will be a main source of communication for the Synod.

We pray for guidance and wisdom of the Holy Spirit in this process and look forward to speaking and listening as widely as possible as Pope Francis has asked us as a basis for the Synod and the life of the Church.





## Saint of the Week

### Saints Simon and Jude's Story

Jude is so named by Luke and Acts. Matthew and Mark call him Thaddeus. He is not mentioned elsewhere in the Gospels, except of course where all the apostles are mentioned. Scholars hold that he is not the author of the *Letter of Jude*. Actually, Jude had the same name as Judas Iscariot. Evidently because of the disgrace of that name, it was shortened to "Jude" in English.

Simon is mentioned on all four lists of the apostles. On two of them he is called "the Zealot." The Zealots were a Jewish sect that represented an extreme of Jewish nationalism. For them, the messianic promise of the Old Testament meant that the Jews were to be a free and independent nation. God alone was their king, and any payment of taxes to the Romans—the very domination of the Romans—was a blasphemy against God. No doubt some of the Zealots were the spiritual heirs of the Maccabees, carrying on their ideals of religion and independence. But many were the counterparts of modern terrorists. They raided and killed, attacking both foreigners and "collaborating" Jews. They were chiefly responsible for the rebellion against Rome which ended in the destruction of Jerusalem in A.D. 70.

#### Reflection

As in the case of all the apostles except for Peter, James and John, we are faced with men who are really unknown, and we are struck by the fact that their holiness is simply taken to be a gift of Christ. He chose some unlikely people: a former Zealot, a former (crooked) tax collector, an impetuous fisherman, two "sons of thunder," and a man named Judas Iscariot.

It is a reminder that we cannot receive too often. Holiness does not depend on human merit, culture, personality, effort, or achievement. It is entirely God's creation and gift. God needs no Zealots to bring about the kingdom by force. Jude, like all the saints, is the saint of the impossible: Only God can create his divine life in human beings. And God wills to do so, for all of us.
