

Second Sunday of Advent (C)
December 5th, 2021
Bar 5: 1-9 / Ps 126: 1-6 / Phil 1:4-6, 8-11 / Lk 3:1-6

A young wife became pregnant. During her pregnancy, she was afflicted with a serious disease, cancer. She was operated on many times, but to no avail. Her condition changed from bad to worse. The doctors said: "There is no chance. It is hopeless. You are going to die."

It was then that she and her husband decided to live in a far-off place. They wanted to escape from a "world" in which she was judged as hopeless and dying. The couple believed that in every man, there lies the power to heal and the power to live. They would attempt to tap that power.

In their isolated farm, they spoke to each other only about God, only about love, about forgiveness about health. They prayed and influenced each other only in a positive way, talking day and night about the goodness of God. It was at the end of the fourth week that she suddenly felt something strange happening within her body. Incredible as it may seem, she was healed: healed in a different consciousness and in a world that they had created for themselves. It was a world where she was not condemned to death.

My dear friends, we all know how sick humanity has become. There is a silent desperation about how things are, about the zigzagging structures and subtle impositions of earthly standards that many of us may feel sullenly resigned to, as the facts of modern lifestyle. In a diabolical way, we tend to think that everything good seems to be turned into something very wicked.

John the Baptist who lived in a desert did so as a sign of protest and of hope as well. He was a symbol of our longing for something better and different. The prophet shouted at the top of his voice: "Make ready the way of the Lord... Repent for the kingdom of God is at hand."

There must be a better way to celebrate Christmas than just submitting to the status quo of the world, than to equate our superficial trimmings to this event of our salvation. The greatest gifts that we can offer to the Child Jesus is the gift of ourselves. This is only possible if we can open ourselves to the possibility of conversion, of a real change of our life.

Let us remove all fear and self-righteousness. We cannot imitate the complacency of the Pharisees and scribes who thought they could be spared from destruction because they were sons of Abraham. We, too, should not pride ourselves with our church membership and think that we can be exonerated even with our empty professions of faith. If we have something to be proud of, it is what we have a merciful God ready to forgive those who humble themselves by repenting for their sins.

There are times that we can readily complain about everything and everyone else, except ourselves. The season of Advent invites us to look deeper into ourselves and humbly admit that we have failed God's expectation of us. A man said: "When I was young, I prayed: 'Lord, give me the energy to change the world.' As I approached middle age and realized that half of my life was gone without having changed a single soul, I changed my prayer to: 'Lord, give me grace to convert all those who come into contact with me. Just my family and friends, and I shall be satisfied.'

"Now, that I am an old man, and my days are numbered, I have begun to see how foolish I have been. My prayer now is: 'Lord give me the grace to change myself.' If I had prayed for this from the start, I would not have wasted my life."

Think about it my friends. John is pointing out to us the possibility in us to change and thus changed the world with ourselves. The coming of Christ on Christmas day makes these things a reality. Why can't we make it happen.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious is next weekend, December 11 and 12. In 1988, the United States Catholic bishops initiated the Retirement Fund for Religious to address the deficit in retirement savings among religious communities. Proceeds from the collection help communities across the country to provide for the needs of aging members.

Thanks to your past support, 321 religious communities received funding in 2021, with 26,330 religious past the age of 70 benefiting from this fund. Specifically, the National Religious Retirement Office coordinates the distribution of the proceeds to eligible communities, which provide financial assistance, consultation and education that help religious communities meet the immediate and ongoing needs of aging members. Roughly 95 percent of their budget aids senior religious.

Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare. The Diocese of Palm Beach is grateful for your spiritual and financial assistance toward these dedicated women and men of God as they live out the final chapter in their story of faith and service.

Thank you for all that you do for our retired religious women and men, for your prayers, your friendship, your love and your generosity.



Saint of the Week

Story of St. Damasus I

To his secretary Saint Jerome, Damasus was “an incomparable person, learned in the Scriptures, a virgin doctor of the virgin Church, who loved chastity and heard its praises with pleasure.” Damasus seldom heard such unrestrained praise. Internal political struggles, doctrinal heresies, uneasy relations with his fellow bishops and those of the Eastern Church marred the peace of his pontificate.

The son of a Roman priest, possibly of Spanish extraction, Damasus started as a deacon in his father’s church, and served as a priest in what later became the basilica of San Lorenzo in Rome. He served Pope Liberius (352-366) and followed him into exile.

When Liberius died, Damasus was elected bishop of Rome; but a minority elected and consecrated another deacon, Ursinus, as pope. The controversy between Damasus and the antipope resulted in violent battles in two basilicas, scandalizing the bishops of Italy. At the synod that Damasus called on the occasion of his birthday, he asked them to approve his actions. The bishops’ reply was curt: “We assembled for a birthday, not to condemn a man unheard.” Supporters of the antipope even managed to get Damasus accused of a grave crime—probably sexual—as late as A.D. 378. He had to clear himself before both a civil court and a Church synod.

As pope, his lifestyle was simple in contrast to other ecclesiastics of Rome, and he was fierce in his denunciation of Arianism and other heresies. A misunderstanding of the Trinitarian terminology used by Rome threatened amicable relations with the Eastern Church, and Damasus was only moderately successful in dealing with that challenge.

During his pontificate, Christianity was declared the official religion of the Roman state, and Latin became the principal liturgical language as part of the pope’s reforms. His encouragement of Saint Jerome’s biblical studies led to the Vulgate, the Latin translation of Scripture which 12 centuries later the Council of Trent declared to be “authentic in public readings, disputation, preaching.”

Reflection

The history of the papacy and the Church is inextricably mixed with the personal biography of Damasus. In a troubled and pivotal period of Church history, he stands forth as a zealous defender of the faith who knew when to be progressive and when to entrench.

Damasus makes us aware of two qualities of good leadership: alertness to the promptings of the Spirit, and service. His struggles are a reminder that Jesus never promised his Rock protection from hurricane winds nor his followers immunity from difficulties. His only guarantee is final victory.


